





- 312. **Ticket. Figure Skating Free Skating Men, February 1, 1956,** 14:30 h, Stadio Olimpico Del Ghiaccio. Pink and yellow, 13x8.5cm (5.1"x3.3"). *H.A. Jenkins, USA, won gold.* EF, sm. corner crease. (\$125)
- 313. **Ticket. Figure Skating Pairs, February 3, 1956,** 14:30 h, Stadio Olimpico del Ghiaccio. Pink and green, 13.6x8.5cm (5.4"x3.3"). *E. Schwartz and K. Oppelt, Austria, won gold.* Abt. EF, sm. tear. **(\$100)**

## STOCKHOLM, 16<sup>th</sup> EQUESTRIAN OLYMPIC GAMES, 1956

- c314. **Participation Medal.** Bronze, uniface, 42x50mm, by J. Sjösvärd. Ancient Greek horseman l. over Olympic rings, the official emblem of the equestrian Olympic Games. Name "C.A. Carlstedter 1956" engraved on reverse. EF. (\$3,500)
- 315. Commemorative Equestrian Pin. Silvered, black enamel, 11x11mm, by Lagerstroem. Horse r. over rings. Lagerstroem was the official manufacturer of the 1956 Stockholm badges and medals. Unc. (\$100)
- 316. Official Torch. Aluminum alloy, 47cm (18.5") tall. Cut-out Olympic rings dividing legend "Melbourne XVI OLYMPIAD 1956". 110 torch runners carried the flame from Darwin to Melbourne after Quanta's Airline brought the flame from Athens. VF-EF, lt. scs. Rare torch. (\$7.500)
- 317. Olympic Flame 1956 Torch Relay Fuel Pack for Foot Runner. Round cardboard canister, 14cm (5.5"), diameter 8.5cm (3.3"), made in England by Waeco Ltd. Contents crumbled. Soiled, VF. Very rare. (\$350)
- 318. **Participation Medal.** Bronze, 63mm, by A. Meszaros. Olympic rings over Melbourne coat of arms within legend. Rev. Olympic motto within circle of athletes marching in pairs. EF, in original plastic case, hairlined (\$325)
- 319. **Participation Medal.** As preceding medal, EF, no box. (\$300)
- c320. **Gymnastic Participant's Badge.** Silvered, multicolor enamel, 30x51mm. Blue outer band enamel, numbered on back. With red ribbon inscribed "Gymnastic" (faded). Toned EF. (\$325)
- c321. (Brochure) City of Los Angeles Salutes the United States 1956 Olympic Team. 4pp., 25.4x33.2cm (10"x13.1"). Reception and dinner on November 2, 1956; list of team members, menu and program of reception. Parchment-style color covers. VF-EF. (\$75)
- 322. **Reuters Media Pin.** Goldplated, blue enamel, 38x20mm. "Reuters" on boomerang-shaped pin. Plus official visitor's pin, 26x18mm. Both EF. Scarce. (2 pcs.) (\$150)
- 323. **Japanese Team Pin.** Silvered, red and white enamel, 23x20mm. EF. (\$125)





- c325. Commemorative USA Olympic Rings Pin. Multicolor, 44x27mm (1.7"x1.1"). Probably the first "USA Rings" pin. EF. (\$125)
- c326. Colorful Olympic Flame Czech Glass Pin. White, 31x41mm. Color rings over column with flame, in gilt oval. EF. (\$125)
- c327. **Commemorative Logo Button.** Multicolor, 32mm. Flaming torch over Australian continent, rings above. EF. (\$100)
- c328. Commemorative Logo Button. Multicolor, 32mm. EF. (\$100)
- 329. **Commemorative Car Plaque.** Nickel-plated, 9.8x10.1cm (3.9"x4"). Olympic rings in color between "Melbourne-1956". EF (\$175)



- c354. **Austrian Team Pin.** Gilt, red, white and black enamel, 25x32mm. EF. (\$275)

#### TOKYO, 18<sup>th</sup> OLYMPIC GAMES, 1964

- c375. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded in Gymnastics. Silver, 63mm, by Toshikaka Koshiba. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant athletes. With ribbon and rosette in Olympic colors (a few stains), housed in black lacquer and gold presentation case, lined in blue velvet and white silk, stains on silk and traces of pin mounting, lt. wear. Medal VF-EF. Rare. (\$5,500)
- c376. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal Awarded in Gymnastics. Bronze, 63mm, by Toshikaka Koshiba. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant athletes. With ribbon in Olympic color, brown stain near top. In black lacquer and gold presentation box, lt. wear, lined in blue velvet and silk, silk stained, trace of pin mounting. Medal abt. EF, lt. wear on high points. Rare. (\$4,500)
- 377. Silver Small-Size Participation Medal Presented to Tokyo Olympic Flag Raisers. Silvered copper, 40mm, by Taro Okumoto and Kazumitsu Tanaka; "NAIGA" and hallmarks on edge. Three runners. Rev. Olympic rings dividing legend. In wooden box lined with blue velvet. Japanese legend inside top: "Tokyo Olympics Flag Raisers Participation Keepsake" (transl.) and name of flag raiser. Toned EF, boxed. Very rare. (\$1000)

- 378. **Participation Medal.** Copper, 61mm, by T. Okamoto/K. Tanaka. Stylized figures of three runners and swimmer. Rev. Olympic rings dividing English and Japanese legend in 6 lines. EF. (\$450)
- c379. **Press Badge.** Goldplated, partially enameled, 37x60mm. With white ribbon, gold stripe in center. EF. (\$425)
- c380. **Team Official's Badge.** Goldplated, lt. blue enameled bar, 37x60mm. With white ribbon, gold stripe in center. EF. (\$550)
- 381. **Dutch Team Pin for 1964 Tokyo and Innsbruck Games.** Redwhite-blue enameled AE, 30x24mm. EF. (\$80)
- c382. Commemorative Torchbearer Medal, 1964. Goldplated copper, 60mm, issued by Japan Athletic Promotion Foundation, made by Mitsui Mining & Smelting Co. Two torchbearers, from an ancient Greek jar. Rev. The Sendagaya Gate of the Olympic National Stadium. EF, with brochure, in original box with color logo on top. (\$125)

  45mm. Airplane of official Olympic carrier. Rev. Logo between laurel branches. EF. (\$125)
- c388. (Autographs) Official Logo Silk Banner with Autographs of Japanese Water Polo Team. Multicolor, 45x83cm (17.7"x32.7"). Autographs in black. EF. (\$450)
