After the Games, the Organising Committee publishes a final report comprising preparations, the Games and results. They are an important source of information about the Olympic Games.

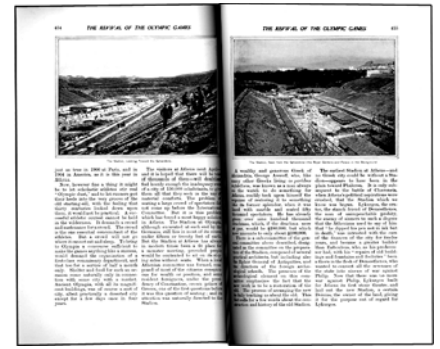

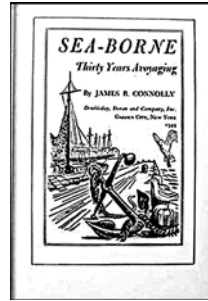

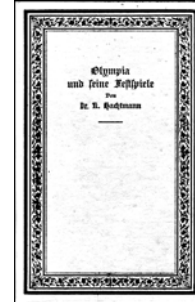

RESTORATION OF THE OLYMPIC GAMES, 1894

- c38. **The Olympic Medal. Restoration of the Olympic Games at the International Paris Congress on June 23, 1894.** Silver, hallmarked, 50mm. Oak and laurel branches united by ribbon with date. Rev. 7-line French legend over laurel and oak branches. EF, with cardboard box. Very rare. **(\$2,500)**
39. **Seal of the International Olympic Committee, 1894.** Blue and white, 37mm. During the 1894 Congress at the Sorbonne in Paris, called by Pierre de Coubertin, the decision was made to restore the Olympic Games and the International Olympic committee was formed. Creased EF, mounted in wooden shadow box, 22.3x22.3cm (8.8"x8.8") with gilt plaque, under glass. **(\$200)**

ATHENS, 1st OLYMPIC GAMES, 1896

- c40. **Silver First Place Winner's Medal Won by John Pius Boland, Great Britain/Ireland, in Tennis Doubles.** Silver, 50mm, by J. Chaplain. Laureated head of Zeus facing holding winged statue of Victory with laurel branch on globe. Rev. View of Acropolis and Parthenon between Olympic legend. First place winners of the 43 events received a silver medal, second place winners a bronze medal. No gold medals were awarded in the first Olympic Games. Boland won the medal together with Friedrich Traun, Germany. Abt. EF/EF. Very rare. **Minimum Bid (\$20,000)**
- c41. **(Sheet Music) Olympic Hymn 1896. Original First Version Presented to the Jury of the Hymn Competition.** 8pp., 24.8x32.9cm (9.8"x13"), in Greek language. Music by Spiros Samaras, text by Kosti Palamas, edited by Deanworth & Cavadis, Athens, in Greek language. In 1895 the best of the Greek artists were asked to contribute to the success of the Olympic Games. This copy is marked "Jury" in ink on the back. The cover is in black and gray while the 1896 final hymn is in gold and green as shown in our Auction 19 on the back cover. This cover is also missing the scrolls and lines of the final cover design, and the heading on page one is in a different style. Browning, creases, marginal tears, a few spots, VF. Extremely rare original version of the 1896 Olympic Hymn which was restored as the official hymn of the Olympic Games in 1958. **(\$5,000)**
42. **Marathon Program, March 29, 1896 (April 10, 1896).** 4 pages inside a cover, 16.5x23cm (6.6"x9.2"), in Greek and French language. Daily program with every participant in each event; 100 Meters (won by Thomas Burke, USA); High Jump (won by Ellery Clark, USA); 110 Meters Hurdles (won by Thomas Curtis, USA); Pole Vault (won by W. Hoyt, USA), Wrestling, and **Marathon (won by Spiridon Louis, Greece).** Staple missing, browning, a few marginal tears, lt. soiling, abt. VF. Extremely rare program. **(\$2,000)**

43. **Original Photo of the Distribution of Prizes in the Olympic Stadium on April 3rd, 1896 (April 15, 1896).** Sepia, 25.6x20.4cm (10.1"x8"), by N. Pantzopoulos, official photographer of the King (stamp on back). Presentation of Medals, Diplomas and Prizes by the King, dignitaries with top hats watching, the band waiting to play the Triumphal March for the Walk of the Winners around the stadium. EF. Rare. **(\$1,000)**
44. **(Magazine) Scribner's Magazine, No. 4, April 1896.** 130pp. illus. and 88pp. of advertisement, 17.5x24.3cm (6.9"x9.6"). Includes an 8-page illustrated article by R.R. Richardson on the Revival of the Olympic Games and the construction of the Olympic stadium, an 18-page illus. article by D. Osborne, "A Day at Olympia". Angel scattering laurel branches over Paris Exposition grounds. Rev. Victorious athlete with laurel branch on podium inscribed "CONCOURS DE SAPEURS-POMPIERS". Ltly. polished, abt. EF/VF-EF. Very rare. **(\$2,500)**

49. **Shooting Winner's Plaque.** Silvered bronze, 41x59mm, by F. Vernon. Winged goddess scattering laurel branches over Paris exposition grounds. Rev. Victorious athlete standing on podium inscribed "CONCOURS DE TIR/VII CONCOURS/ NATIONAL". Polished on obverse, EF. (\$750)
50. **Official Olympic Shooting Event Medal.** Bronze, 44mm, by Charles Marey. Winged female holding fallen soldier. Rev. French rooster on panel, 8-line French legend above. VF-EF. Rare. (\$400)
51. **World's Fair Award Medal.** Bronze, 61mm, by Chaplain. Head of French Republic r. Rev. Male with torch carried by female. *Since no participation medals were issued in 1900, collectors often add this medal to their collection.* EF. (\$250)
- c52. **Ballooning Olympic Games Event at the Paris 1900 World's Fair. Multicolor Porcelain Plate.** 26cm (10.2"). View of Eiffel Tower surrounded by exposition buildings, 2 balloons floating above. EF. Rare. (\$350)
53. **Ticket. Ascension with the Grand Captive Balloon in Connection with the World's Fair, Vincennes 1900.** Pink, 9.6x10.6cm (3.8"x4.3"). Crease, VF+. Rare. (\$175)
- c54. **Original Photo of the Gold Medal Winning French Rugby Team on October 28, 1900.** Photo 23x16.9cm (9.1"x6.7"), pasted on board, 30x24cm (11.8"x9.4"), Photographer Zulimo Chiesi, Paris. French text handwritten in ink at top: "Match de l'Exposition de 1900/Equipe nationale contre les Moseley Wanderers le 28 octobre 1900 à Vincennes". Below the photo are the names of the players with their club affiliations, and the name of the judge. *The French national team defeated the British Moseley Wanderers 27-8 on October 28.* Photo EF, sm. stain, board sm. stain, lower l. corner sm. chip. 57. **(Brochure) Christomanos, Anastasios K. Georgios Averoff. Speech in Honor of the Late G. Averoff on May 26, 1902, in Metropolis Church.** Published with funds of the Athens Polytechnical School. Athens, 1902. 21pp., 15x21.1cm (5.9"x8.3"), in Greek. *Averoff enabled Athens to hold the first modern Olympic Games by donating the money for the restoration of the Panathenian Olympic Stadium, which is mentioned in the speech.* Covers partially discolored, browned, contents EF. 58. **ST. LOUIS, 3rd OLYMPIC GAMES, 1904**
Judge's Badge with Blue Legend. Goldplated, legend enameled in blue, 33x33mm, by Mermod & Jaccard Jewelry Co. "Juror" in center of maltese cross, fleur de lis between arms. "Universal Exposition St. Louis 1904" on extensions. Toned abt. EF. Rare. (\$750)
59. **Grand Prize Award Medal of the Louisiana Purchase Exposition 1904.** Shield-shaped bronze, 63x74mm, by Weinberg. Louisiana cloaking Indian maiden. Rev. Eagle with outspread wings on panel with award legend. EF/abt. EF. (\$275)
60. **Cased Gold Award Medal of the Louisiana Purchase Exposition 1904.** Triangular bronze, 70x71mm, by Weinberg. Louisiana cloaking Indian maiden. Rev. Eagle with outspread wings on panel with award legend. EF, in presentation case (scuffed). (\$275)

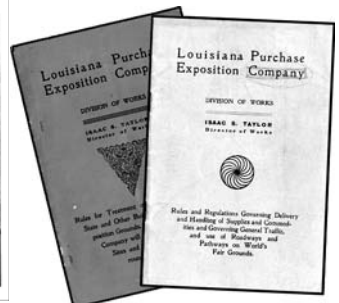

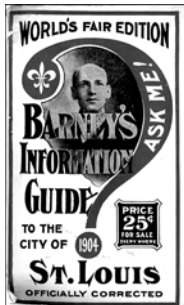

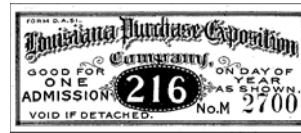
