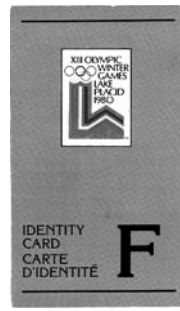

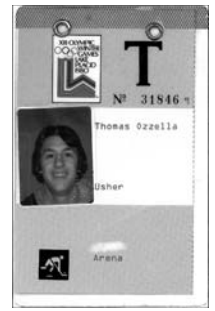

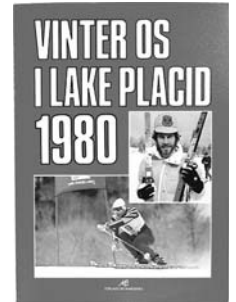

- c563. **Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Four-Man Bobsled.** Silver, 80mm, made by Tiffany & Co. Hand holding flaming torch. Logo over legend, "FOUR MAN/BOBSLED" engraved below, large conifer branch at r. EF, with light blue ribbon, white stripes on side. **Minimum Bid (\$8,500)**
- 564. **Participation Medal.** Nickel-silver, 76mm, by M. Jovine. Modern relief views of the nine winter sports. Rev. Lake Placid Olympic emblem surrounded by the words of the Olympic oath in four concentric circles. EF, in original case. **(\$375)**
- c565. **Mascot Roni the Raccoon.** Multicolor cloth, 36.5cm (14.4") tall. Gray head. Faint stains, VF-EF. **(\$125)**

- c573. **Prototype Torch for the Moscow 1980 Olympic Torch Relay.** Gray and gold aluminum, 57cm (22.4"). Smiling Mascot Misha, "Moscow Olympiada-1980" at left, Moscow Olympic logo below. A few sm. bumps, VF-EF. Rare. **(\$2,000)**

- 575. **Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Boxing.** Silver, 60mm, by Ilya Postol. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Olympic flame over stadium. Event inscribed on edge. With loop and ring. Mottled toning, VF-EF. **(\$2,750)**
- 576. **Opening Ceremony Bugle.** Brass, 20.5x31.6cm (8.1"x12.4"). Moscow logo and "Moscow 80" in Cyrillic on side, makers mark and number. VF-EF. **(\$750)**
- 577. **Participation Medal.** Tombac, 60mm, by A. Leonova. Moscow Olympic emblem over Olympic stadium. Rev. View of Red Square in Moscow. EF. In presentation box. **(\$175)**

578. **East German Olympic Committee Award Medal for Olympic Medal Winners.** White Meissen porcelain, partially goldplated, 94mm (3.7"). Large gold Olympic rings between laurel sprig and Olympic motto "Altius Citius Fortius". Rev. Olympic fire behind 3-line legend. EF, in presentation case. Scarce. **(\$200)**
579. **Television Press Button.** Multicolor, 54mm. Moscow logo and rings over "Televa Oy". EF. **(\$65)**
- c580. **U.S.A. 1980 Team Patch from the Boycotted Moscow Olympic Games.** 21.6x21.6cm (8.5"x8.5"). Raised gold and silver thread embroidered shield on blue velvet background, in silver-colored frame. EF. **(\$150)**
- c581. **Beautiful Large Painted Porcelain Bowl.** Multicolor and gold, 31cm (12.2"). Moscow logo in center surrounded by flower design. EF. **(\$175)**
- c582. **Commemorative Moscow 1980 Handpainted Porcelain Vase in Form of a Boot.** Multicolor, 12.8cm (5") tall, made by Dulyevo Porcelain manufactory. Color Olympic rings, "Moscow 1980" and flower decorations on all sides. Top goldplated. *Very unusual vase.* EF. **(\$125)**

593. **Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Men's Cross Country Skiing 4x10KM Relay.** Silver, 65x68mm, 159 grams. Stylized athlete's head r. with laurel wreath, 2-line award legend below. Rev. Sarajevo emblem within Croatia legend. With long orange ribbon. Rare. EF. **Minimum Bid (\$5,500)**
594. **Official Torch.** Stainless steel cylinder, bowl gold colored with "Sarajevo '84" legend. Length 57.5cm (22.6"), weight 680 grams. Manufactured by Nippon K. under the supervision of Mizuno Corp. EF, with official display stand. **(\$3,500)**
595. **Participation Medal.** Bronze, 60x66mm uniface, by N. Mitric. Stylized "Sarajevo 84", within circle, above Sarajevo Olympic emblem. EF, in presentation box. **(\$600)**

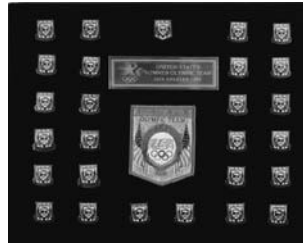

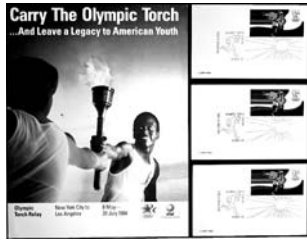

596. **Participant's Badge.** Silvered, 30x30mm. With long orange ribbon. *This is the last Olympic badge.* EF. (\$200)
597. **87th IOC Session in Sarajevo 1984. IOC Badge.** Silvered, 30x40mm. With white ribbon. EF. (\$200)
598. **87th IOC Session in Sarajevo, 1984.** As preceding badge but with green ribbon. EF. (\$200)

LOS ANGELES, 23rd OLYMPIC GAMES, 1984

599. **Official Torch.** Brass-finished aluminum with tan leather handle. Bowl portrays Olympic rings, motto and L.A. Memorial Coliseum Stadium. *Flame lit in Olympia, Greece on May 7, 1984, and it arrived in New York the following day. It took 82 days to carry the flame through 33 states, 9,375 miles, to Los Angeles.* EF, in original black leather pouch. (\$2,750)
600. **Participation Medal.** Bronze, 60mm, by D. Sterner. Olympic torch head within legend. Rev. Los Angeles Olympic emblem over Olympic rings and laurel branches. EF, in original case. (\$325)
601. **Official Torch Bearer Medal.** Bronze, 76mm. Flaming Los Angeles torch in high relief. Rev. Torch runner to right. EF. (\$200)
602. **U.S. Olympic Team Pins.** Multicolor enamel, housed together with the U.S. Team Patch in a clear acrylic case. *First team pin set of the United States.* EF. (\$400)
603. **(Autographs) Pair of Small Size White Leather Gymnastic Beam Shoes Signed in Black by Gymnastic Gold Medal Winner Mary Lou Retton and her Coach, Bela Karolyi in 1984.** Later they were also signed by Nadia Comaneci (gold medal in Montreal 1976); Shannon Miller, Dominique Moceanu and Kerri Strug (all 3 gymnasts gold in Atlanta 1996) and Martha Karolyi. EF. (\$750)

- c604. **Track and Field Starting Number.** Multicolor, 25.4x20.5cm (10"x8.1"). EF. (\$75)
- c605. **Group of 3 Field Hockey Tickets.** Los Angeles, 1984, August 8. Crease, VF+. Atlanta 1996, July 31, and Sydney 2000, September 20, both EF. (3 pcs.) (\$80)
606. **Complete Set of 41 Official Torch Relay Postcards with Cancellations from New York, May 8, 1984, to Los Angeles, July 28, 1984.** In ring binder, with small-size AT&T "Carry the Olympic Torch" Poster. EF. (\$150)
- c607. **The Olympic Order in Silver.** 78cm (30.7") long, made by Bertoni. Bestowed by the IOC in 1986. EF. In large red leatherette presentation case, lined in red velvet and silk, Olympic rings affixed on top. (\$4,000)
608. **Diploma for the Olympic Order Bestowed by the IOC in 1986.** Stiff embossed paper, 28x37cm (11"x14.6"). Laurel wreath with gold embossed Olympic rings over award legend, signed in black by IOC President Samaranch. *The Olympic Order is the highest decoration presented by the IOC.* EF, in goldplated frame, under glass. (\$650)
609. **10th Asian Games in Seoul 1986 Participation Medal.** Bronze, 60mm. Logo over legend. Rev. Flame, Olympic stadium in background. EF, cased. (\$100)

CALGARY, 15th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1988

610. **Swiss Olympic Team Medal.** Silvered, partially enameled, 59mm. Calgary logo between Canadian and Swiss color flags. Rev. 4-line legend in English. EF, in presentation case. (\$200)

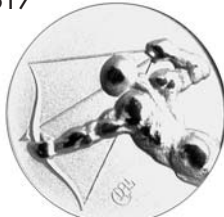

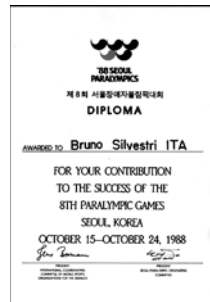

- c611. **Commemorative Set of 16 Collector Spoons.** Silvered, multicolor enamel. USOC, Calgary and Seoul official logos, mascots, events. In frame, 38.7x31.7cm (15.2"x12.5"). EF. (\$125)
- 612. **Participation Diploma of an East German Official.** Multicolor, 25.4x25.4cm (10"x10"). EF. In envelope with color logo. *The official was a gold medal winner in two-man Luge in 1976 and 1980.* (\$250)

SEOUL, 24th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1988

- c613. **Official Torch.** Brass, 50cm (20"), with tan leather handle, designed by Lee Woo-Sing. Bowl depicts dragons, Seoul Olympic logo enameled in color below. EF. (\$3,250)
- c614. **Official Ancient Greek Olympic Bronze Helmet Made from the Mold of the Original Helmet Presented as a Prize in Berlin 1936 to the Korean Marathon Winner Sohn Kee-chung.** Cast bronze, 18.7x22cm (7.4"x8.7"), 27cm (10.6") tall. *The Olympic Helmet was found in 1875 by a German archeological team in Olympia, Greece. The team took the helmet to Berlin. One theory says the purpose of the helmet was to dedicate the Olympic Games to Zeus along with giving thanks for victory. Another theory states that the helmet was worn by Olympic competitors who fought against each other on horses. In July 1936, Vradnyi newspaper in Athens announced that the Olympic Helmet would be presented to the winner of the marathon in Berlin. Sohn, the Korean winner, won it, but it was not given to him. In the 1980's a West German engineering team created a mold by computer graphics and laser technology. The Korean government insisted on the return of the Olympic helmet and of the mold. Reproductions were originally made only for museums, then a small number was also made for sale to the public to promote the spirit of the Olympic Games of Seoul 1988.* EF. Rare. (\$2,000)

- 615. **Participation Medal.** Bronze, 60mm, by K. Kwanghyun. South Gate below mountain, cloud, crane, and sun. Rev. Seoul Olympic emblem over English legend in two lines. EF, in presentation case. (\$350)
- 616. **Press Participation Medal.** Bronze, 65x65mm, octagonal. Ancient archer on horseback. Rev. Logo and legend over stadium. EF, cased. (\$100)
- 617. **Set of Five Silver 1988 U.S. Team Medals by Salvador Dali.** Silver, 30mm. Skiing medals illustrate Calgary; pole vault, equestrian, diving and archery illustrate Seoul Olympic Games. Rev. USOC logo. EF, in plastic holders, in blue velvet case. (\$275)
- c618. **Beautiful Seoul Presentation Sword.** Wood with inlaid mother-of-pearl, and decorative bronze parts, 74.8cm (29.4") long. Mother-of-pearl landscapes, cranes, ducks, flowers on both sides of sword, color inlaid Seoul logo (one logo missing). With red tassels and gold thread. EF. Very decorative. (\$2,000)
- 619. **Commemorative Mascot Hodori Bolo Tie.** Goldplated, 45mm. With dark red cord, tassels, and Seoul Olympic logo. EF, cased. (\$75)
- 620. **Paralympic Games Participation Diploma.** Cream colored, logo in color, 19.9x28.7cm (7.8"x11.3"). Trace of mounting on back, o.w. EF. (\$125)
- 621. **Soccer Events Car Access Pass.** Multicolor, 36x14cm (14.2"x5.5"). Laminated, as made. EF. (\$75)
- 622. **Pair of Seoul 1988 Football Tournament Brochures.** Multicolor illustrated, 21.5x29.4cm (8.5"x11.6") each. Soccer event report, 80pp., by the Organizing Committee on all soccer events and results. Plus Special Olympic Magazine for Olympic Soccer Events, 79pp. Contains report on Seoul 1988 plus each Olympiad 1904-1984. EF. (2 pcs.) (\$150)
- 623. **International Sport Symposium in Quebec Medal, 1990.** Bronze, 65mm. Two runners. Rev. Logo between Olympic rings and Coubertin signature. EF, toned obv. Cased. (\$75)

ALBERTVILLE, 16th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1992

- c624. **Official Torch.** Stainless steel, 42cm (16.5"), designed by Philippe Starck, made by Ugine. *The Olympic fire was lit in Olympia on December 13, 1991, and taken in a miner's lamp to Athens. The "Concorde" brought the flame to Paris, and the torch relay through France to Albertville covered 5,500 km. It was organized by "La Poste". The last runner was Michel Platini, accompanied by Fr. C. Grange, a nine-year old boy. Very rare torch, in its original box. EF. Minimum Bid (\$20,000)*
