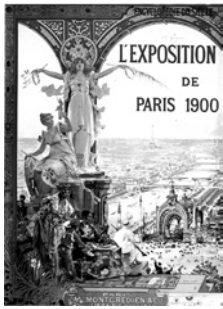
**ATHENS, 1st OLYMPIC GAMES, 1896**

- c119. Cased Bronze Second Place Winner's Medal. Bronze, 50mm, by J. Chaplain. Laureated head of Zeus facing holding winged statue of Victory with laurel branch on globe. Rev. View of Acropolis and Parthenon between Olympic legend. *First place winners of the 43 events received a silver medal, second place winners a bronze medal. No gold medals were awarded in the first Olympic Games.* Toned EF, in original red velvet-lined presentation case. Very rare. (\$32,500)
- 120. Participation Medal. Bronze, 50mm, by N. Lytras. Seated Nike holding laurel wreath, phoenix rising out of flames, Acropolis in background. Rev. 5-line Green legend in laurel wreath. Unc., in original round case. (\$2,250)
- 121. Autograph of James B. Connolly, First Winner in the Athens Olympic Games. 4 lines 1924 text in black ink, card 9.2x6.4cm (3.6"x2.5"). Connolly won Triple Jump on April 6, 1896. EF. (\$350)

**PARIS, 2nd OLYMPIC GAMES, 1900**

*The 1900 Paris Olympic Games were held in conjunction with the World's Exposition. They played only a minor role. There were athletes who didn't know that the events they participated in were Olympic Games events. Few items relate directly to the Games. For this reason we are also offering items commemorating the World's Exposition.*

- c122. Rare Olympic Games Silver Plaque. Hallmarked silver, 41x59mm, by F. Vernon. Winged goddess scattering laurel branches over Paris exposition grounds. Rev. Victorious athlete standing on podium inscribed "Exercices Physiques et Sports", official name of the Paris 1900 Olympic Games. EF. (\$2,500)
- 123. Shooting Winner's Plaque. Silvered bronze, 41x59mm, by F. Vernon. Winged goddess scattering laurel branches over Paris exposition grounds. Rev. Victorious athlete standing on podium inscribed "CONCOURS DE TIR/VII CONCOURS/NATIONAL". Polished on obverse, EF. (\$1,800)
- 123a. Official Olympic Shooting Event Participation Medal. Bronze, 44mm, by Charles Marey. Winged female holding fallen soldier. Rev. French rooster on panel, 8-line French legend above. *This medal belonged to Monsieur Moitin-Langlois of Neufchatel whose accompanying diploma we offer in lot 126.* EF. (\$500)
- 124. World's Fair Bronze Award Medal. Bronze, 61mm, by Chaplain. Head of French Republic r. Rev. Male with torch carried by female. *Since no participation medals were made, collectors like to add this medal to their collections.* EF. (\$350)
- 124a. Official Commemorative Paris 1900 Exposition Medal. Bronze, 53mm, by G. Lemaire. Seated female personifying Paris. Rev. Panel over airship, camera, anvil, etc. *The medal was given to buyers of "L'Exposition de Paris 1900", see lot 127, Vol. 1, p. 38.* EF. (\$150)
- 125. Commemorative Entry to the Paris 1900 World's Fair Pin. Silvered bronze, 25mm. View of Entry to the World's Fair, legend below. EF. Rare. (\$300)
- c126. Diploma for Excellence and Participation in 13 Events at the International (Olympic) Shooting Competition, 1900. 32.5x50cm (12.8"x19.7"). Legend and 5 signatures of the Shooting Committee, winged angel carrying fallen soldier at l. *The participant competed in 13 different shooting events ranging from 10th to 144th place which earned him the overall 17th Place for Excellence. The shooting participation medal in lot 123a belongs to this diploma.* Center fold, tear at top and bottom, marginal creases, lt. browning, VF. Rare diploma. (\$4,000)

Front color covers in Vol. 1 and 3 (see back cover of this catalog). Paris, Montgredien et C., Editors. In French language, 28.2x37.5cm (11.1"x14.8"). Detailed report on all aspects of the Paris 1900 World's Exposition. Also includes articles on Olympic Games events as gymnastics, yachting, automobiles, balloons, stamps and postcards, judges badges, commemorative medal, etc. A wealth of information, bound in green half leather and linen, spine with raised bands, scuffed, contents EF. ### ST. LOUIS, 3rd OLYMPIC GAMES, 1904

The 1904 Olympic Games in St. Louis were also held in conjunction with a World's Fair. This, again, detracted a lot from the importance of the Games. Few items are available that relate directly to the Olympiad, and they usually command very high prices. For this reason we are also offering some memorabilia from the World's Fair which celebrated the Centennial of the Louisiana Purchase from Napoleon in 1803.

- c129. **Cased Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded for 100 Yards to N. Cartmell, Louisville, in the YMCA Track and Field Championship, August 20, 1904.** Silver, 35mm, scalloped edge, made by Robert Stoll, New York. Logo in open laurel and oak wreath. Rev. "100 Yards/N. Cartmell (sic.)/1904". Mallon p. 103. With red-white ribbon suspended from bar "1904 Universal Exposition. Olympic Games. St. Louis". According to IOC rules, all athletic events held during the course of the World's Fair were to be called "Olympic Games". In original silk-lined leather case by R. Stoll. Toned EF. (\$7,000)
- c130. **Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Pole Vault to Charles S. Jacobs, to Chicago Central, in the YMCA Track and Field Championship on August 20, 1904.** Sterling silver, 35mm, scalloped edge, by R. Stoll, New York. Logo in open laurel and oak wreath. Rev. "High Jump/C.S. Jacobs/1904" engraved in 3 lines. Mallon p. 105. With orange-black-orange ribbon (frayed), suspended from bar "1904 Universal Exposition, Olympic Games St. Louis". According to IOC rules, all athletic events held during the course of the World's Fair were to be called "Olympic Games". Toned EF. (\$6,500)

Monroe, New Orleans, in the YMCA Track & Field Championship, August 20, 1904.** Bronze, 35mm, scalloped edge, by Robert Stoll, New York. Logo in open laurel and oak wreath. Rev. "One Mile/H.Monroe/1904" engraved in 3 lines. Mallon p. 104. With red-white ribbon suspended from bar 1904" According to IOC rules, all athletic events held during the course of the World's Fair were to be called "Olympic Games". Toned EF. (\$6,000)
132. **Gold Award Medal of the Louisiana Purchase Exposition 1904.** Triangular bronze, 70x71mm, by Weinberg. Louisiana cloaking Indian maiden. Rev. Eagle with outspread wings on panel with award legend. EF. (\$550)
133. **Silver Award Medal of the 1904 St. Louis Fair.** Bronze, 66x66mm, by Weinmann. America cloaking Louisiana. Rev. Eagle with spread wings on panel with award legend. EF. (\$500)
134. **Bronze Award Medal of the Louisiana Purchase Exposition 1904.** Bronze, 64mm, by Weinberg. Louisiana cloaking Indian maiden. Rev. Eagle with outspread wings on panel with award legend. EF. (\$450)

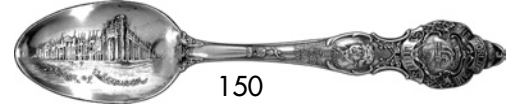

View of Acropolis and Parthenon between Olympic legend. *Similar to 1896 winner's medal - only the date on the reverse was changed to 1906.* Toned EF. **(\$7,500)**
- c164. **Gold Participation Medal.** Goldplated bronze, 50mm, by N. Lytras. Seated Nike holding laurel wreath over phoenix emerging from flames, Acropolis in background. Rev. Greek legend in wreath. Goldplating worn obv. on high points, scr. on back, rns. EF. **(\$1,250)**
165. **Commemorative Winner's Plaque.** Bronze, 49x70mm, by Vannier. Olympic winner over crowded Athens Olympic stadium, Acropolis at l. Rev. Fame flying over laurel tree, Greek temple at r. EF. **(\$400)**
166. **Javelot Throw Winner's Medal, 1906.** Silver, 24mm. Winged victory. Rev. Javelot thrower. *One of a series of 1906 Olympic winners medals.* Fine, looped. **(\$100)**

- LONDON, 4th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1908**
- c167. **Gold First Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Association Football (Soccer).** Gold, hallmarked "15 (Karat) 625", Birmingham, 34mm, 28 grams, by Bertram McKennal, struck by Vaughton & Sons, Birmingham. Two females crowning victorious athlete. Rev. St. George slaying dragon. "WINNER ASSOCIATION FOOTBALL" engraved on edge. *The British team won first place in the finals against Denmark (2:0) on October 24, 1908. The medals were presented on the same day in the stadium by J. Bell, Lord Mayor of London.* Medal EF, sm. rns., housed in red leather case with goldstamped legend, lt. scuffing, a few sm. stains, inside lined with red velvet and silk. Very rare. **(\$17,500)**
- c168. **Second Place Team Winner's Medal Awarded for 15 Meter Yacht Race.** Bronze, 33mm, by B. McKennal. Victorious athlete being crowned by 2 seated females. Rev. St. George slaying the dragon. "Second Prize 15 Meter Yacht Race" engraved on edge. *Second place team medals were made of bronze. Award medals were engraved before the events- there were no entries for the 15 Meter Yacht Race. This event was only offered in London 1908.* VF-EF. **(\$5,000)**
- c169. **First International Olympic Committee Badge Presented by the IOC, 1908.** Goldplated silver, 1908 hallmark, 52mm, struck by Vaughton & Sons, Birmingham. Olympic motto "Citius Altius Fortius" within open laurel wreath surrounded by "COMITÉ INTERNATIONAL OLYMPIQUE". *There were only 33 IOC members in 1908.* Beautiful badge. EF. Extremely rare. **(\$7,500)**
170. **Participation Medal.** White metal, 50mm, by B. MacKennal. Winged Fame standing on globe holding palm branch and horn. Rev. Winner in quadriga dashing left. EF. **(\$1,500)**
