BERLIN, 11th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1936

- c318. **The Golden Chain of Office for the Members of the International Olympic Committee.** Designed by sculptor Walter E. Lemcke after Greek original vases and coins in the Old Museum in Berlin. Cast bronze, approx. 80cm (31.5"). 6 small plaques are linked by rings. Left side: Horseman with relay torch, silver coin from Taranto, 300 BC; Javelin thrower from bowl, 430 B.C. Discus thrower, silver coin from Cos, 500 B.C. Right side: Wrestlers, silver coin from Aspendos, 400 B.C.; Runner bearing arms, from bowl, 500 B.C.; and Youth with jumping weights, from bowl, 490 B.C. The 2 lower plaques are linked by enameled Olympic rings from which is suspended a plaque with the famous Zeus Olympian head, a stone sculpture. Reverse engraved "XI. OLYMPIADE BERLIN 1936" at top, leaving room for 10 more Olympiads. Official report p.126/127; Olympic Games News Service No. 33. There were 68 IOC members plus IOC President Baillet-Latour at the time of the Berlin games. The chain, intended to be worn at all future Olympic Games, was only worn at the Berlin Olympic Games. EF, sm. chip on black enameled ring, almost unnoticeable. Rare and beautiful chain. **Minimum Bid (\$15,000)**
- c319. **Proposed Winner's Medal for the Berlin 1936 Olympic Games.** Bronze, 77mm. Two eagles to the right in high relief, "OLYMPIA" in upper left. Rev. Four-line German legend "DEM SIEGER/IM WETTKAMPF/BERLIN/1936", circle below. ("To the Winner in the Berlin 1936 Championships", translated). *A competition for the design of a winner's medal for the Berlin 1936 Olympiad Games was held, and this medal was chosen. The 2 eagles symbolize the German Reich and Olympia. The IOC insisted on the previous winners medal design by Cassioli with seated Victory.* EF. Unique and historically important. (\$9,750)



320. **Brown-Green Patina Participation Medal.** Cast bronze, 70mm, by O. Placzek. Five athletes representing the five continents, pulling the ropes of the Olympic Bell. Rev. Olympic Bell embossed with German Eagle holding Olympic rings, within five concentric circles. EF. (\$400)
321. **Olive-Brown Patina Participation Medal.** Cast by H. Noack, Berlin. As preceding medal, lt. wear obv., sm. rn., VF-EF/EF. (\$350)
- c322. **Yachting Team Leader's Badge.** Bronze, 42x44mm, by Lauer. Numbered, with green ribbon (color faded) inscribed "Segeln/Mannschafts-führer" in 3 lines. EF. (\$1,250)

Three affixed silver airplanes flying towards color rings between Olympic legend. Mother of pearl seems like clouds. *Only 54 planes completed the flight to Berlin Olympiad.* EF. (\$500)
327. **New York Mayor's La Guardia Medal Presented to Victorious Olympians Returning from Berlin, 1936.** Bronze, 50mm. Hand holding laurel branch. Rev. "Presented by Fiorello A. La Guardia Mayor to 1936 Olympian". EF, in blue cardboard box. (\$425)
328. **Official Visitor's Medal.** Bronze, 36mm, by K. Roth, struck by Bavarian State Mint. Olympic bell. Rev. Female presenting laurel branch. EF. (\$150)

331. **Commemorative Olympic Bell.** Silvered brass, 31x39mm. German State Eagle holding Olympic rings, "I call the youth of the world below". Rev. "XI. Olympiade Berlin 1936" in 4 lines. Chain at top. EF. (\$125)
332. **Commemorative Olympic Bell.** Silvered, 20x22mm. Three-dimensional bell, flat back. Loop at top. Toned EF. (\$75)
333. **Official Color Olympic Rings Pin.** Silvered, multicolor enamel, 44x18mm. EF. (\$75)
334. **Official Commemorative Car Plaque.** Goldplated, cream enamel, 72x76mm. Brandenburg Gate over large Olympic rings. EF. (\$150)
335. **Kiel Yachting Car Plaque.** Silvered, 68x68mm. Kiel logo, rings above yachts, fish below. Black background. EF. (\$175)
- c336. **Commemorative Junghans Pocket Watch.** Chrome-plated housing, back and front center goldplated with Brandenburg Gate over Olympic rings and XIth Olympiad legend. Inside face goldplated. EF. Attractive. (\$1,000)
337. **Hermann Göring Personal Olympic Pass Wallet.** Black leather, 15.8x10.3cm (6.1"x4.1"). Blind-stamped Olympic rings on cover, inside top in gold lettering "Ministerpräsident Generaloberst Hermann Göring" (Prime Minister (of Prussia) General Colonel Hermann Göring (translated). *Göring was Chief of the German Air Force, founder of the Gestapo in 1933.* VF-EF. (\$300)
