- c407. **Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 50mm, by Cassioli. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant team mates. EF, slightly uneven toning. **(\$5,000)**
- 408. **First Class Olympic Merit Miniature Medal.** Goldplated, white enamel, 18x22mm. With lt. blue and white striped ribbon. EF. Scarce. **(\$250)**

# **CORTINA D'AMPEZZO, 7th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1956**

# **STOCKHOLM, 16th EQUESTRIAN OLYMPIC GAMES, 1956**

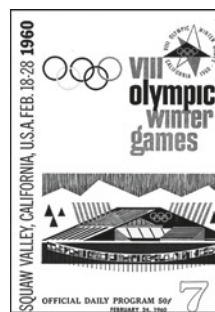
