13. **Melbourne 1956. Participation Medal.** Bronze, 63mm, by A. Meszaros. Olympic rings over Melbourne coat of arms within legend. Rev. Olympic motto within circle of athletes marching in pairs. EF. (\$400)
14. **Rome 1960. Participation Medal.** Cast bronze, 55mm, by E. Greco. Nude female torchbearer l. superimposed over Olympic rings. Rev. Flight of eagles soaring over stadium of Rome. EF, dark patina. (\$375)
15. **Tokyo 1964. Boxed Participation Medal.** Copper, 61mm, by T. Okamoto/K. Tanaka. Stylized figures of three runners and swimmer. Rev. Olympic rings dividing English and Japanese legend in 6 lines. EF, In original wooden box with gold legend. (\$425)
16. **Mexico 1968. Participation Medal.** Copper, 50x50mm, by L. Wyman. Olympic sports pictograms divided by Mexico Olympic emblem. Rev. Spanish legend between two parallel lines. EF. (\$300)
17. **Munich 1972. Cased Participation Medal.** Steel, 49mm, by F. König. Munich Olympic emblem, wreath of rays with superimposed spiral, over German legend in two lines. Rev. Olympic rings over two hands, one holding stylized olive branch. EF, in acrylic presentation case. (\$375)
18. **Montreal 1976. Cased Participation Medal.** Copper, 45mm, by G. Huel/P. Pelletier. Montreal Olympic stadium over French legend in two lines. Rev. Montreal Olympic emblem, a stylized "M" above Olympic rings. EF, mottled toning, in leather case (lt. hdlg.). (\$400)
19. **Moscow 1980. Cased Participation Medal.** Tombac, 60mm, by A. Leonova. Moscow Olympic emblem over Olympic stadium. Rev. View of Red Square in Moscow. EF, in red case. (\$250)

20. **Los Angeles 1984. Participation Medal.** Bronze, 60mm, by D. Sterner. Olympic torch head within legend. Rev. Los Angeles Olympic emblem over Olympic rings and laurel branches. EF. (\$350)
21. **Seoul 1988. Cased Participation Medal.** Bronze, 60mm, by K. Kwanghyun. South Gate below mountain, cloud, crane, and sun. Rev. Seoul Olympic emblem over English legend in two lines. EF, in presentation case. (\$400)
22. **Barcelona 1992. Participation Medal.** Burnished copper, 70mm, by X. Corbero. Spanish legend in four lines over Barcelona Olympic emblem, a stylized jumping athlete. Rev. Spiral and elongated bolt of lighting. EF, in original pouch. (\$200)
23. **Atlanta 1996. Boxed Participation Medal.** Bronze, 60mm. Official torch logo. Rev. Quilt of leaves. Unc, in pouch, boxed. (\$200)
24. **Sydney 2000. Cased Participation Medal.** Silvered AE, 50mm. Sydney Olympic logo. Rev. 3-line legend over Olympic rings. EF, in plastic case. (\$225)

25. **Athens 2004. Participation Medal.** Bronze, 50mm. Athens 2004 logo. Rev. Games legend. Greek text and wavy decoration on both sides. Mounted inside cardboard, between color covers. Space for participation diploma inside back cover. EF. (\$275)
26. **Athens 2004. Paralympic Participation Medal.** Bronze, 50mm. Athens 2004 Paralympic logo. Rev. Legend. Greek text and wavy decoration on both sides. Mounted inside cardboard, between color covers. Space for participation diploma inside back cover. EF. (\$225)

#### PARTICIPATION MEDALS OF THE WINTER OLYMPIC GAMES

- c27. **Chamonix 1924 Winter. Participation Medal and Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 55mm, by R. Bénard. Victorious athlete holding skates and skis, Alps in background. Rev. French legend in 14 lines. *First participation and winner's medal of Winter Olympic games. The only time that the participation medal was the same as the winner's medal. There were only 258 participants in Chamonix.* EF, spot obv. Very rare. Minimum Bid (\$16,500)
28. **St. Moritz 1928 Winter. Boxed Participation Medal.** Bronze, 37mm, by M. Martin. Victory with laurel branch in horse-drawn sled to left, Olympic rings in exergue. Rev. French legend in six lines over laurel branch. EF, in original cardboard box. (\$1,500)

- c29. **Lake Placid 1932 Winter. Participation Medal.** Bronze, 60x48mm, by Julio Kilenyi. Winged figure of Fame blowing horn, Olympic rings above, winter landscape in background. Rev. Six winter sports depicted on shields around legend in six lines, scenes of curling and dogsledding below. VF-EF, lt. bumps around edges. Minimum Bid (\$6,000)
- c30. **Garmisch-Partenkirchen 1936 Winter. Silver Participation Medal.** Silvered bronze, 60mm, by M. Joerres. Alpine summit over Olympic rings within German legend. Rev. Olympic motto over fir branches. Abt. EF, partially toned. Rare. (\$3,500)
31. **Garmisch-Partenkirchen 1936 Winter. Participation Medal.** Bronze, 60mm, by M. Joerres. Alpine summit over Olympic rings within German legend. Rev. Olympic motto over fir branches. Abt. EF. (\$2,200)
- c32. **Cortina d'Ampezzo 1956 Winter. Small-Size Gold Participation Medal.** Goldplated silver, 40mm, by C. Affer. Female head facing, crowned by Olympic rings, flame in lower r. Rev. Snowflake over Mount Pomagagnon. Presented to high ranking officials. EF. Very rare. Minimum Bid (\$4,000)
- c33. **Cortina d'Ampezzo 1956 Winter. Small-Size Silver Participation Medal.** As preceding medal, but silver, 40mm. EF. Very rare. Minimum Bid. (\$3,000)
34. **Cortina d'Ampezzo 1956 Winter. Small-Size Participation Medal.** As preceding medal but bronze, 40mm. Very rare. Minimum Bid (\$1,500)
35. **Cortina d'Ampezzo 1956 Winter. Participation Medal.** Bronze, 45mm, by C. Affer. Female head facing, crowned by Olympic rings, flame in lower r. Rev. Snowflake superimposed on Mount Pomagagnon. Toned EF. (\$875)
36. **Innsbruck 1964 Winter. Participation Medal.** Bronze, 61mm, by Welz. Innsbruck Olympic emblem within German legend. Rev. Innsbruck city view, Austrian Alps in background. EF. (\$375)
37. **Grenoble 1968 Winter. Participation Medal.** Bronze, 68mm, by M. Coeffin. Profile of Greek athlete. Rev. City view of Grenoble. EF. (\$325)

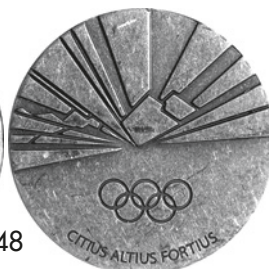
38. **Sapporo 1972 Winter. Cased Participation Medal.** Bronze, 60mm, by S. Fukuda. Sapporo Olympic emblem. Rev. Two large arrows attached to stylized athlete. EF, in acrylic case. (\$800)
39. **Sapporo 1972 Winter. Participation Medal.** As preceding medal, no case. VF-EF/VF, scs. (\$450)
40. **Innsbruck 1976 Winter. Cased Participation Medal.** Silvered bronze, 50mm, by W. Pichl. Innsbruck Olympic emblem on ice crystals within German legend. Rev. Bergisel ski jump, panorama of Innsbruck and Austrian Alps in background. Toned EF, in presentation box. Scarce in this condition. (\$475)
41. **Lake Placid 1980 Winter. Participation Medal.** Nickel-silver, 76mm, by M. Jovine. Modern relief views of nine winter sports. Rev. Lake Placid Olympic emblem surrounded by the words of the Olympic oath in four concentric circles. EF. (\$375)
42. **Sarajevo 1984 Winter. Cased Large Size Participation Medal.** Bronze, 9.5x10.3cm (3.7"x4.1") uniform, by Nebojsa Mitric. Stylized "Sarajevo 84" above logo. One of only 100 medals presented to high officials. EF, in large presentation case. Very rare. (\$3,750)
43. **Sarajevo 1984 Winter. Cased Participation Medal.** Bronze, 60x66mm uniface, by N. Mitric. Stylized "Sarajevo 84", within circle, above Sarajevo Olympic emblem. EF, in presentation case. (\$600)
44. **Albertville 1992 Winter. Participation Medal.** Chrome-plated steel, 68mm, by R. Mayot. Albertville Olympic emblem within French and English legend. Rev. Star symbol over Alps and Olympic rings within French legend. EF. (\$675)
45. **Lillehammer 1994 Winter. Boxed Participation Medal.** Copper, 66x76mm, by M. Kleppan. Pictograms of sporting events, ice crystals and Lillehammer Olympic emblem over Olympic rings. Rev. Modernistic ice crystal design with sports pictograms. EF, toning, in original wooden case. (\$400)
46. **Nagano 1998 Winter. Boxed Participation Medal.** Bronze, 60mm. Nagano logo over legend. Rev. Wooded mountainside. EF, in box with gilt logo. (\$375)

48. **Torino 2006 Winter. Boxed Silver Participation Medal.** Silvered bronze, 39mm. Logo. Rev. Olympic rings over motto. With circular cardboard, within clear round box. EF. (\$350)

#### DIPLOMAS OF THE OLYMPIC GAMES

- c49. **Paris 1900. International (Olympic) Shooting Competition Participation Diploma.** 32.5x50cm (12.8"x19.7"). Legend and 5 signatures of the Shooting Committee, winged angel carrying fallen soldier at l. *The participant competed in 13 different shooting events reaching from 10th to 144th place which earned him the overall 17th Place in the (Olympic) Shooting Competition.* Center fold, tear at top and bottom, marginal creases, lt. browning, VF. Very rare diploma. (\$4,000)

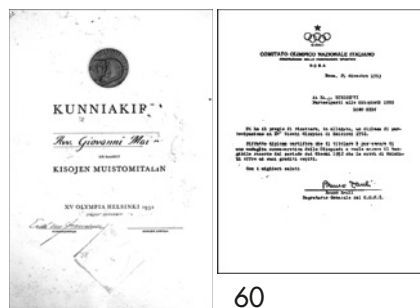

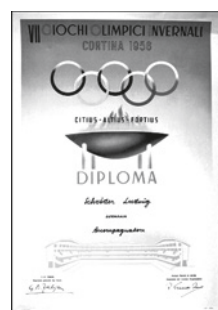

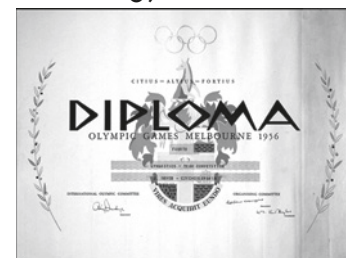

50. **St. Louis 1904. Visitor's Certificate of Attendance at the World's Fair.** Black, green and gold, 32x24cm (12.6"x9.5"). View of Cascade Gardens surrounded by gold legend. Unissued. 2 sm. tears, o.w. EF. (\$200)
- c51. **Stockholm 1912. First Place Winner's Diploma Awarded for Cycling, 320 KM (199 Miles) Road Race Around Lake Mälär.** Color lithography with gold decor, 28.6x45.5cm, designed by Olle Hjertberg, Professor at the Royal Academy of Fine Arts and designer of the official poster. Printed by Centraltryckeriet, Stockholm. Crowned female holding staff and statue of Victory, Olympic stadium in background, panel with 7-line Swedish award legend below. Surrounded by flower and laurel leaf border. *The grueling race around Lake Mälär was raced by single cyclists. The 4 best single cyclists of each country were counted as a team and Sweden won first place.* A few minor spots, o.w. EF. Matted, in frame. Beautiful Art Nouveau diploma. (\$4,500)
- c52. **(Coubertin Autograph) Paris 1924. Soccer First Place Winner's Diploma for a Member of the Uruguayan Soccer Team.** Brown and gray, 51.6x67.5cm (20.3"x26.6"), designed by Bernard Naudin. Winged goddess of Victory between allegorical figures. Signed by French Olympic Committee President Clary, and IOC President Pierre de Coubertin. *Pierre de Coubertin signed only the 1924 Chamonix and Paris diplomas.* Bold colors. With brown cardboard matting (almost detached). Browning, spots at bottom, VF-EF. (\$4,000)
53. **(Coubertin Autograph) Paris 1924. Diploma for the Attaché of the Uruguayan Olympic Team.** Brown and gray, 50x61cm (19.6"x24"), designed by Bernard Naudin. Winged goddess of Victory between allegorical figures. Signed by Clary, President of French Olympic Committee and IOC President Pierre de Coubertin. Creases, lt. browning, VF+, professionally lined on linen. (\$2,750)
54. **Lake Placid 1932 Winter. Winner's Diploma.** 37.8x25.5cm (14"x10"). Participation medal with Fame between both sides of winner's medal. Signed in ink by Organising Committee President Dewey and IOC President Baillet-Latour. Unawarded. EF. (\$1,250)

- c55. **Los Angeles 1932. Official Diploma for a Member of the California Olympiad Commission.** Orange and black, 59.1x46cm (23.3"x18.1"), designed by H. M. Kurtzworth. Stadium and legend between frieze of ancient Greek athletes, Goddess Columbia, and Athena at sides. Browning and water dampstaining on left and bottom, not affecting image. (\$750)
- c56. **Garmisch-Partenkirchen 1936 Winter. Second Place Winner's Diploma Awarded for Two-Man Bob, Switzerland.** Multicolor, 35x49.2cm (13.8"x19.4"). Garmisch winner's medal between '1936' and rings, signed in ink by Organising Committee President v. Halt and IOC President Baillet-Latour. EF. Rare. (\$5,000)
- c57. **Berlin 1936. Official Torch Relay Diploma for an Austrian Participant, 1936.** Yellow and black, 23x34.8cm (9.1"x13.7"). Cauldron with flame emitting rays at top, legend below. Signed by Organising Committee President Lewald and Austrian NOC President, and stamp of Austrian NOC. Creased, spots, VF. In wooden frame, glazed. (\$1,500)
- c58. **Italian National Olympic Committee Pigeon Shooting (Skeet) Diploma (abt. 1936).** Multicolor, 66.6x53.9cm (26.2"x21.2"), designed by M. Fucci. Legend between logos of Fascist Italian NOC and FITAV, two nude athletes at sides. Unissued. Lt. creases, EF. Beautiful diploma. (\$275)
59. **Helsinki 1952. 5th Place Winner's Diploma.** 35.4x53cm (13.9"x20.9"), signed by IOC President Edstroem and Organising Committee President. A few marginal creases, o.w. EF. (\$475)
60. **Helsinki 1952. Participation Diploma for an Italian Competitor.** 4pp., 22x4x32.7cm (8.8"x12.9"). Fine, trace of removed paper. Plus Official English translation, and letter of Italian NOC, both EF. (3 pcs.) (\$200)

62. **Cortina 1956 Winter. Participation Diploma of an East German "Accompagnatore".** Multicolor, 32.9x47.7cm (13"x18.8"). Signed by Organising Committee President, and Secretary General. Lt. creases, a few sm. marginal tears. (\$375)
63. **Stockholm Equestrian Olympic Games 1956. Merit Diploma and Miniature Merit Medal.** Diploma 21.3x29.8cm (8.4"x11.7"). Creased, abt. EF. Plus Miniature Medal. Goldplated, 15x24mm, with blue-striped yellow ribbon. Belonged to Werner Klingeberg. EF. (2 pcs.) (\$650)
64. **Melbourne 1956. Fourth Place Winner's Diploma Awarded for Team Gymnastics.** Gray on white, 58.3x44.3cm (23"x17.4"). Signed by IOC President Brundage and the President and Chairman of the Organising Committee. Sunned on r. side, creased, VF-EF. (\$650)
