



- LONDON, 4th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1908**
- c176. **Cased Donor Silver Participation Medal.** Silvered bronze, 50mm, by B. MacKenna. Winged Fame standing on globe holding palm branch and horn. Rev. Winner in quadriga dashing left. EF, spot. In dark blue leatherette case with gold legend on top, inside lined with velvet and silk (lt. scuffing). (\$2,500)
  - 177. **Boxed Participation Medal.** White metal, 50mm, by B. MacKenna. Winged Fame standing on globe holding palm branch and horn. Rev. Winner in quadriga dashing left. Abt. EF. In red presentation cardboard box (lt. scuffing) with black legend. Rare in box. (\$1,750)
  - 178. **Participation Medal of a British Wrestler.** White metal. As preceding medal, no box, edge inscribed to L. Bruce who participated in Heavy Weight Wrestling Catch-as-Catch-Can. He was beaten in the second round. Official report pp. 329/330. VF. (\$975)
  - 179. **Cased Official Plaque of the Franco-British Exposition Held in Conjunction with the Olympic Games, 1908.** Bronze, 57x69mm, by Ch. Pillet. Britannia extending hand to Gallia across the British Channel. Rev. Seated Peace holding 2 flags over exposition grounds with Olympic Games stadium. *This is the only medallion illustration of the Olympic stadium in 1908.* EF, in dark blue and gilt case, lined in silk. (\$700)
  - 180. **Olympic Games Cycling Trial Races Medal (1908).** Bronze, 31mm. Winged wheel. Rev. "OLYMPIC/GAMES/TRIAL RACES" engraved between laurel and oak branch. With blue ribbon and bar. Tiny rns., EF. (\$175)
  - 181. **Marathon Runner Dorando London 1908 Commemorative Medal, Munich 1972.** Bronze, 45mm, by Merichi. Bust of Dorando facing. Rev. Dorando being helped over the finish line. EF. (\$100)
  - c182. **Official Diploma of Merit.** 44x30cm (17.3"x11.8"), designed by Bernard Partridge. Victory seated in center, athlete and History on sides below. *The Merit diploma was presented to outstanding athletes who did not win a medal, also officials, federations, etc.* VF, browning, sm. marginal tears. Unawarded, in wooden frame, glazed. (\$3,750)
  - 183. **Pair of Official Color Postcards Featuring the Flip-Flap and the Olympic Stadium.** Multicolor, 8.8x13.8cm, printed by Valentine. View of Flip-Flap, Olympic Stadium with flags behind. EF, one with corner crease. (2 pcs.) (\$90)



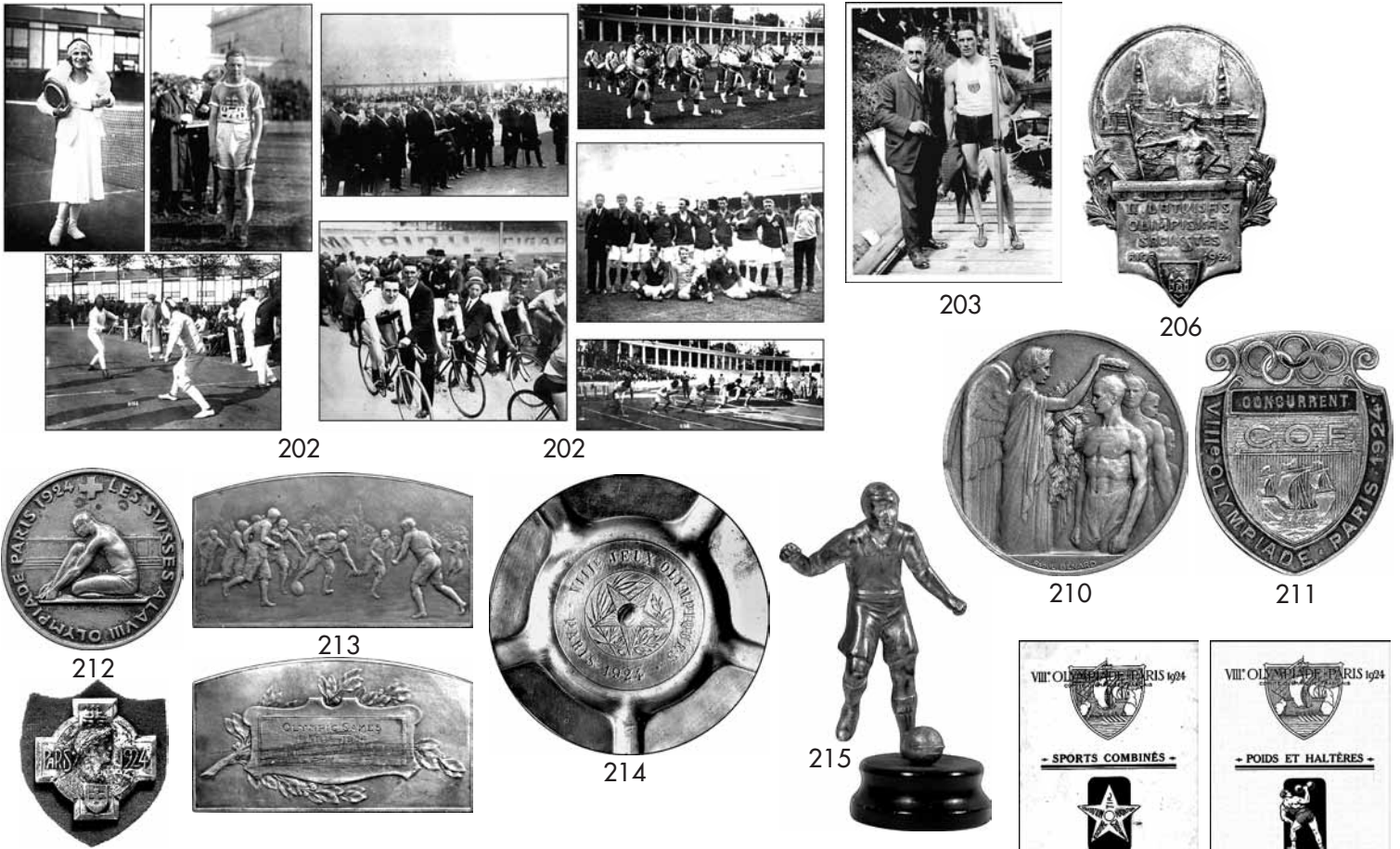

- 184. **Participation Medal.** Pewter, 51mm, by Lindberg/MacKenna. Zeus seated on Ionian column holding figure of Nike, Stockholm in back. Rev. Quadriga with triumphant winner dashing left. Abt. EF. (\$350)
  - 185. **Participant's Badge.** Silvered AE, 25x37mm. Ancient Greek athlete's head above panel with 3 Swedish crowns. Toned EF. A beautiful badge. (\$350)
  - 186. **Miniature Silver Olympic Merit Medal.** Silver, 15mm. Head l. of King Gustav V. Rev. 3-line Olympic legend over crossed branches. Crown at top, and loop. EF. (\$200)
  - c187. **Cased Gold Plaque on the Reception of the American Olympic Team at Parc Pommery, France, Seat of the IOC, July 23, 1912.** Goldplated bronze, 70x46mm, by A. Mery. Athlete at r. looking at seat of IOC, legend on plaque over laurel branch. Rev. City view. *Presented to a high ranking official of the 1912 Stockholm American team.* EF, spots, in leather case, scuffed. Rare. (\$600)



- c188. **Commemorative Olympic Skating Pin.** Gilt, dark blue enamel, 76mm, with garnet. With legend "Minne Olympiska Spelen Stockholm" ("Commemorating Stockholm Olympic Games", transl. from Swedish). Gilt skate affixed on top. EF. Rare. **(\$250)**
189. **Official Logo Pin.** Silver, hallmarked, 22x26mm. Nude flagbearers with flags of participating nations, legend below. Toned EF. **(\$175)**
190. **Silver Dish with IOC Badge.** Silvered bronze, 10.5cm (4.1"). IOC badge embossed in center. EF. Attractive. **(\$275)**
191. **(Autograph) Jim Thorpe, Gold Medal Winner in Pentathlon and Decathlon.** Signature in ink on paper, 8.7x4.3cm (3.4"x1.7"). *Jim Thorpe lost his medals accused of professionalism, but recently, the IOC reinstated his victories.* With printed photo of Thorpe. **(\$300)**
192. **Trio of Three Actual Photos of the Entry of the American Team at the Opening Ceremony on July 6, 1912.** Two photos 17.5x13cm (6.9"x5.1"), and 14.5x10cm (5.7"x3.9"), upper left corner broken off. Two photos are marked 358 and 361, possibly postcard numbers. VF-EF. (3 pcs.) **(\$150)**
193. **Pair of Actual B&W Photos. Patrick McDonald, USA,** receives his gold medal won in Shot Put, and the **Swedish Royal Stadium Box.** Both photos 16.5x12cm (6.5"x5.1"), pasted on stiff cardboard. Photos EF. (2 pcs.) **(\$150)**
194. **(Book) Rau, Gustav. 196. **Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Medley Relay Race.** Bronze, 63mm, by F. Fraisse. Female presenting wreath to two nude athletes. Rev. Sports equipment above panel with award legend to 2nd Cl. Pvt. Jean R. Saurin. Toned EF. **(\$1,000)**
- c197. **Participant's Badge of the Inter-Allied Games at the Paris Pershing Stadium, 1919.** Bronze, 53x51mm. Eagle at top of panel between laurel and oak wreath. EF. With 3 multicolor ribbons. **(\$350)**
- ANTWERP, 7th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1920**
- c198. **Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 60mm, by Dupon. Nude victorious athlete with palm branch and laurel wreath, fame blowing horn. Rev. View of Antwerp. EF. **(\$3,750)**
199. **Participation Medal.** Bronze, 60mm, by P. Theunis. Nike standing before tripod crowning victorious athletes. Rev. Flying Victory crowning charioteer in biga. Abt. EF. **(\$675)**
200. **Participation Medal.** As preceding medal but VF+, rns. **(\$600)**

202. **Original Photo Album of the Antwerp Olympic Games.** 32.3x23.2 (12.7"x9.1"). Contains 47 stiff pages with 132 photos of Antwerp decorated for the Games, opening ceremony (15 photos incl. 2 with Coubertin), cycling (11 photos), track and field (38 photos), fencing (4 photos), swimming (7), tennis (4 incl. gold medal winner Suzanne Lenglen), soccer (21 photos, many teams and games), gymnastics (17 photos). Covers scuffed, a few tears at spine, photos VF-EF to EF. *Important documentation of a generally not well documented Olympic Games.* (\$2,000)
203. **Original Photo of John Kelly Sr., Gold Medal Winner of Single Sculls and Double Sculls on August 29, 1920.** 15.3x20.5cm (6"x8.1") J. Kelly standing holding oar, presumably after his victory. *John Kelly was the father of Grace Kelly, and the grandfather of Prince Albert of Monaco.* Trace of removal from album on back. VF. (\$200)
- c204. **Large 1920 Olympic Trap Shooting Team Luggage Label.** Red-white-blue, 15.6x22cm (6.1"x8.7"). VF, frayed at bottom. Rare. (\$150)
- c205. **First Latvian Olympic Games in Riga, 1920. Silver Winner's Medal.** Silvered bronze, 30x32mm, by H. Bank. Winning athlete with laurel branches, view of Riga in background, laurel leaves at sides, legend in Latvian. Looped, EF. (\$275)
206. **Second Latvian Olympic Games in Riga, 1921. Participant's Badge.** Silvered bronze, 28x41mm, by F. Müller, Riga. View of Riga behind athlete with flag, 4-line legend below. EF. (\$200)
- c207. **Gold First Place Winner's Medal in the German Championships in Berlin, 1922.** Goldplated cast bronze, 68mm, by Schmarje. Nude herald with German standard. Rev. 3-line engraved legend to winner in boxing, welter weight, surrounded by oak wreath. *Celebrated as national German Olympic Games as Germany was not invited to Antwerp.* EF. (\$650)

#### CHAMONIX, FIRST OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1924

- c208. **Participation Medal and Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 55mm, by R. Bénard. Victorious athlete holding skates and skis, Alps in background. Rev. French legend in 14 lines. *First participation and winner's medal of Winter Olympic games. The only time that the participation medal was the same as the winner's medal. There were only 258 participants in Chamonix.* EF, spot obv. Very rare. (\$16,000)

- c209. **PARIS, 8th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1924. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 55mm, by A. Rivaud. Legend surrounded by sports equipment. Rev. Winner helping fallen athlete back on his feet. *Medal included information that it was awarded for Fencing Foil to Maurice van Damme, Belgium.* EF. (\$5,500)
210. **Participation Medal.** Bronze, 55mm, by R. Bénard. City view over French legend in three lines. Rev. Victory with laurel wreaths crowning victorious athletes. EF. (\$475)
211. **Participant's Badge.** Partially enameled bronze, 34x42mm. Red enamel, rings in color. Numbered on back, with disk. EF. (\$450)
212. **Pair of Swiss Pins.** Silvered, 24x24mm, cross-shaped. Victorious athlete between "Paris-1924". With red felt. VF-EF. And silvered bronze, 26mm. Athlete and legend. EF, sm. spots (2 pcs.) (\$250)
213. **Olympic Games 1924 Rugby Plaque.** Bronze, 70x39mm, by Coudroy. Scene of rugby. Rev. Panel over oak branch, legend in 4 lines "Olympic Games/Paris 1924", the last 2 lines erased. *The U.S. team won over the French team, much to the dismay of the French crowd. Last time Rugby was an Olympic Event.* EF. Rare. (\$300)
214. **Commemorative Rugby Ashtray.** Brass, 11cm (4.3"). Rugby on 5-arm star in center over crossed palm and laurel branches, surrounded by VIIIth Olympiad Paris 1924 legend. EF, spotty. (\$200)
215. **Moveable Soccer Player Sculpture with Soccer Ball.** Silvered, 12.5cm (4.8") tall. Soccer player can be moved to kick the ball. On black wooden base. Abt. EF. (\$175)
216. **(Brochure) Classic and Modern Pentathlon Rules and Regulations, Program, and General Rules.** 23pp., 11.5x18cm (4.5"x7.1"), in French. Ink note inside cover, browning, VF. Scarce. (\$175)
217. **(Brochure) Weightlifting Program and General Rules and Regulations.** 23pp., in French. Includes prizes. Brown covers, EF. (\$200)
- c218. **Ticket. Opening Ceremony, Reunion 43, July 5, 1924, Olympic Stadium in Colombes, Premieres.** 13x8cm (5.1"x3.1"). Lt. creases, VF-EF. Rare. (\$600)



219. **(Autographs) Original Photo of Eight American Swimmers – Five Paris Medal Winners Including Johnny Weissmueller and Gertrude Ederle.** 23.6x18.6cm (9.3"x7.3"), by Hare Photographer, Buffalo, New York. **Johnny Weissmueller**, the first "Tarzan", won five gold medals in 1924 and 1928. **Gertrude Ederle** won 2 bronze medals, and gained fame on August 6, 1926, when she was the first woman to swim the English Channel. **Robert Skelton** won gold in 200-M. Breaststroke. **Sybil Bauer** won gold (world record) and **Aileen Riggan** bronze in 100-M Backstroke. EF. **(\$450)**
220. **American Olympic Committee Try-Out 4th Place Certificate and Starting Number, May 30, 1924.** Stiff cardboard, 19.6x14cm (7.7"x5.7"). Awarded for 4th Place Running Broad Jump, signed in ink by President Thompson and Secretary Rubien. EF, with mailing envelope. Plus starting number "286", linen, 26.5x16.3cm (10.4"x6.4"), signed in ink "R.E. Wilson". Browning, crease, VF. Rare Paris 1924 documentation. (3 pcs.) **(\$800)**
221. **(Magazine) International Worker's Olympiad, Year 1, Nr. 2, August 1924.** 16pp. illus., 21.5x29.7cm (8.5"x11.7"), in German. Magazine of the First Worker's Olympiad in Frankfurt/M., 1925. Preview, music for the gymnastic exercises, the city, etc. Color covers feature official poster. VF-EF. **(\$125)**
222. **Olympic Championships in Köln, 1925. Second Place Olympic Relay Winner's Plaque.** Bronze, 60x97mm, uniface. City shield and oak branches above legend. VF-EF. **(\$200)**
- c223. **Bronze Winner's Medal of the Second German Olympic Sports Meet ("Kampfspiele") in Köln, 1926.** Cast bronze, 88mm. Two wrestlers in high relief. Rev. Cologne Cathedral over 3-line German award legend. *Germany was not invited to the 1920 and 1924 Olympic Games. The "Kampfspiele" were a national Olympiad, held the first time in Berlin in 1922.* Green- brown original patina, EF. **(\$375)**

224. **Participation Medal.** Bronze, 37mm, by M. Martin. Victory with laurel branch in horse-drawn sled to left, Olympic rings in exergue. Rev. French legend in six lines over laurel branch. EF. **(\$1,100)**
225. **Swiss Skiing Club Olympiad 1928 Pin.** Silvered, 56x10mm. Swiss cross with red enamel in center of 2 crossed skis. EF. **(\$250)**
- AMSTERDAM, 9th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1928**
- c226. **Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 55mm, by Cassioli. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Winner being carried by jubilant teammates. *This design was on summer winners medals from 1928 to 1968.* Unevenly toned EF. **(\$5,000)**
227. **Participation Medal.** Bronze, 55mm, by J.C. Wienecke. Nude male and female athlete on podium holding torch over Olympic flame. Rev. Nike over Marathon Tower, shield of Amsterdam between two hemispheres. EF. **(\$475)**
228. **Polish Team Pin.** Silvered, 22x25mm. Horseman 1. with palm branch above date and Polish legend. Toned EF. **(\$200)**
229. **Flag Pin.** Goldplated, 22x12mm. Flag with color rings and legend. EF. **(\$150)**
230. **British Final Olympic Wrestling Trials Winner's Award Plaque.** Bronze plaque, attached on wooden plaque with display easel, 9x13cm (3.5"x5.1"). Hercules fighting lion over award legend on panel. EF. **(\$225)**
- c231. **Commemorative Purple Glass Vase.** 12cm (4.7") tall, 10cm (3.9") wide. "OLYMPIADE AMSTERDAM HOLLAND" in Art Deco style around lower part. EF. **(\$275)**
- c232. **Colorful Commemorative Porcelain Cup.** Multicolor, 10.5cm (4.1") tall, made by Petrus Regout & Co., Maastricht. Ornate design with Amsterdam Olympic Games 1928 legend in Dutch. EF. **(\$200)**
