


HELSINKI, 15th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1952

- 458. Participation Medal. Bronze, 54mm, by K. Räsänen. Stylized athletes' heads superimposed over the Olympic Stadium. Rev. Male and female athletes to left holding torches over Olympic rings. EF. (\$300)
- c459. First Class Olympic Merit Miniature Medal. Goldplated and enameled silver, 18x22mm. With loop and ring. EF. Very rare. (\$250)
- 460. Olympic Merit Medal. Silver, 31mm. Olympic decoration on either side. With blue and white striped ribbon. EF. (\$250)
- c461. Spanish Olympic Merit Badge. Bronze, partially enameled in color, 45x45mm. Victory over Spanish coat of arms affixed on laurel wreath, suspended from color Olympic rings. EF. Rare. (\$475)
- 462. Swiss Team Fundraising Pin for Helsinki 1952. Silvered, 26x26mm. EF. (\$100)
- c463. Olympic Village Employee's Badge. Dark red and orange celluloid, 46mm. Radiant flame over rings and "XV". EF. (\$100)
- c464. Olympic Accommodations Employee's Badge. Lt. green and orange celluloid, 45mm. Radiant flame logo over Olympic rings and Finnish text. EF. (\$100)
- c465. Dutch NOC Member Patch. Orange felt, gold and silver thread, 7x11cm (2.8"x4.3"). Dutch lion l. between "NEDERLAND-N.O.C." VF-EF. (\$150)
- c466. Dutch Team Patch. Orange felt, gold and silver thread, 8x10cm (3.1"x3.9"). Dutch lion l. between "NEDERLAND 19-52" and color rings. EF. (\$125)
- Commemorative Knife with Leather Sheath. Knife, 20cm (7.9") long, made in Finland. Brass and black handle, with "Helsinki XV 1952" legend and rings, horses head at end. With decorated leather sheath, brass ends. Abt. EF. (\$150)

- Olympic Stadium with Olympic tower. Rev. View of Helsinki from sea. "XV OLYMPIA HELSINKI 1952" on back. Lt. wear, VF-EF. (\$150)
- 469. **Brass Commemorative Matchbox Holder.** 37x57mm (1.5"x2.2'), by Sohlberg, Helsinki. View of stadium, Finnish coat of arms and "XV OLYMPIA Helsinki 1952". EF, a few sm. spots. (\$150)
- Olympic Razor Blade. With multicolor paper, 46x25mm. EF. (\$50)
- c471. (Poster) Official Poster in Swedish Language. Offset color printing, 25.5x38.8cm (10"x15.3"), by Ilmari Sysimetsae, printed by Tilgman AB. Nurmi, famous Finish runner and Olympic champion, running to r., globe with Finland in back. The poster was designed for the 1940 Helsinki Olympic Games which were cancelled; only the date was changed. Crease, EF, lined on linen. (\$300)
- c472. (Cigarette Card Album) Helsinki 1952. Cigarette Fabriek J. Van Kerckhof, Amsterdam. 37pp., 34.1x24cm (13.4"x9.4"), in Dutch language. Complete with 95 photographic color pictures pasted in of Olympic winners in all events. Results neatly noted in ink. Pictorial color boards Itly. scuffed, contents EF. Very scarce. (\$150)
- (Brochure) Graebner, Friedrich. The Olympic Flame. 31pp., 14.7x20.6cm (5.8"x8.1"), in German. The Olympic Games in ancient Greece; the restoration of the Games by Coubertin, up to the current 1952 Games. Color covers, abt. EF. (\$75)
- 474. (Bound Magazine - Sport Illustrierte) Olympia 1952. Chronic of the Olympic Games in Oslo and Helsinki. Stuttgart, 1952, by the German Olympic Society. Six issues, 32 to 40 pages each, profusely illustrated, 26.8x37.9cm (10.6"x14.9"), in German. Interesting chronicle of the Oslo and Helsinki Olympic Games. Bound in cardboard, lt. spots, contents EF. - 475. Third Bolivian Sports Championships in Caracas, 1952. Official Gold Medal. Goldplated bronze, 9cm (3.5"). Bust l. of Simon Bolivar, after David (1832). Rev. Bolivian NOC logo with Olympic rings. EF. (\$300)
- c476. Soccer World Cup in Bern, Switzerland and 50th Anniversary of the International Football (Soccer) Federation, 1954. Official Gold Medal. Gold, 33mm, 26.9 grams. Soccer player surrounded by "Championnat du Monde - Coupe Jules Rimet en Swisse" (World Championship. Jules Rimet Cup in Switzerland" transl. from French). Rev. 50th Anniversary legend of the International Soccer Federation 1904-1954 in 7 lines. EF. Very rare. (\$2,000)
- 477. Seventh Central American and Caribbean Games in Mexico, 1954. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal. Silver, 50mm. Ancient Mayan archer. Rev. View of stadium between legend. Sm. rb. and rns., abt. EF. (\$400)



CORTINA D'AMPEZZO, 7th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1956

- 479. Official Torch. Aluminum, 47cm (18.5") long. "VII° GIOCHI OLIMPICI INVERNALI CORTINA 1956", legend, cut-out Olympic rings at top. The flame was lit at the Temple of Jupiter in Rome on January 22, 1956, and flown to Venice. The torch relay from there went to Cortina, where the fire was lit in the stadium at the opening ceremony on January 26 by Guido Caroli. Abt. EF. Very rare. (\$29,500)
- c480. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal. Bronze, 60mm, by C. Affer. Female head facing, crowned by Olympic rings, flame in lower r. Rev. Snowflake over Mount Pomagagnon. Green-brown original patina, EF. (\$3,500)
- c481. Gold Participation Medal. Goldplated silver, 45mm, by C. Affer. Female head facing, crowned by Olympic rings, flame in lower r. Rev. Snowflake over Mount Pomagagnon. Presented to IOC members. EF. Very rare. (\$3,500)
- c482. Small Size Gold Participation Medal. Goldplated silver, 40mm, by C. Affer. Female head facing, crowned by Olympic rings, flame in lower r. Rev. Snowflake over Mount Pomagagnon. Presented to very high dignitaries. EF. Very rare. (\$3,000)
- c483. Silver Participation Medal. Silver, 45mm, by C. Affer. Female head facing, crowned by Olympic rings, flame in lower r. Rev. Snowflake superimposed on Mount Pomagagnon. This medal was only presented to high dignitaries. EF. Very rare. (\$3,000)
- c484. Small Size Silver Participation Medal. Silver, 40mm, by C. Affer. Female head facing, crowned by Olympic rings, flame in lower r. Rev. Snowflake over Mount Pomagagnon. Presented to high ranking officials. EF. Very rare. (\$2,500)
- 485. Participation Medal. Bronze, 45mm, by C. Affer. Female head facing, crowned by Olympic rings, flame in lower r. Rev. Snowflake superimposed on Mount Pomagagnon. EF, starting to tone. (\$675)
- 486. Small Size Participation Medal. As preceding bronze medal but 40mm. EF. Rare. (\$1,250)
- c487. Cortina 1956 Winter. Austrian Team Pin. Multicolor enamel, 22x30mm. Raised design. EF. (\$250)
- AIPS Meeting in Cortina on January 25, 1956. Presentation Plaque. Bronze, 50x80mm, by R.v.d. Velde. Nude athlete standing, holding statue of Victory. Rev. "Souvenir de 1' AIPS A G.B. Fabjan 25-1-1956" in 6 lines. G.B. Fabjan was Secretary General of the Organizing Committee. EF. (\$275)

- c489. Colorful Car Plaque. Silvered, partially enameled, 57x56mm. View of Cortina with Dolomite mountains, color, Olympic rings in foreground. EF. (\$175)
- c490. Austrian Team Patch. Multicolor woven silk, 6.8x10.3cm (2.7"x4.1"). Austrian eagle above Olympic rings, between 1956 Olympic legend. EF. (\$150)
- c491. (Book) VII. Olympic Winter Games in Cortina d'Ampezzo 1956. German NOC report. Frankfurt a. M., 1956. 120pp., many photographic plates, 23.3x26.5cm (9.2"x10.4"), in German. Report on all events in Cortina, plus results. Linen, with color dust jacket. EF. (\$125)

STOCKHOLM, 16th EQUESTRIAN OLYMPIC GAMES, 1956

- c492. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded for the 1956 Equestrian Games. Silver, 49mm, by J. Sjösvärd/V. Falireus. Rider on horseback 1., after the frieze of the Parthenon. Rev. Torch and Olympic rings. Only three events were held during these Equestrian Games, single and team. This is one of 12 awarded silver medals. The buyer will be given the name of the winner. Rarest of all Olympic winner's medals. EF. In red leather case lined in red velvet and white silk, logo in gold on top and on inside top. Extremely rare. (\$25,000)
- c492a. Silver Second Place Badge for the Winning Horse in Dressage **Team Competition.** White double silk rosette, about 9.5cm (3.7") wide, with two long white silk ribbons. Attached in the center is the team captain's badge: Goldplated, dark yellow enamel, 28x37mm. Ribbons for winning horses are rarely available. Sm. spots on long ribbons o.w. EF. Rare. (\$4,000)
- c493. Participation Medal. Bronze, uniface, 42x50mm, by J. Sjösvärd. Ancient Greek horseman l. over Olympic rings, the official emblem of the equestrian Olympic Games. Name engraved on back. EF. (\$5,500)

MELBOURNE, 16th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1956

- 494. Participation Medal. Bronze, 63mm, by A. Meszaros. Olympic rings over Melbourne coat of arms within legend. Rev. Olympic motto within circle of athletes marching in pairs. EF. (\$375)
- 495. East German Team Medal. White Meissen porcelain, partially colored, 53mm. Color rings within Olympic motto. Rev. 6-line legend of the East German NOC. The German team included athletes from East and West Germany. EF. Scarce. (\$200)

- 499. Finnish Fund Raising Pin for the Melbourne and Stockholm Olympic Team. Goldplated bronze, 15mm. Olympic rings and large
- **Indian Hockey Team Pin.** Goldplated, 20mm. Map of India over crossed hockey sticks, encircled by "Indian Olympic Hockey Team". EF. (\$125)
- 501. Iranian Team Pin. Bronze, multicolor enamel, 23mm. Stick pin. EF.
- 502. **Japanese Team Pin.** Silvered, red and white enamel, 23x20mm. EF.
- 503. Commemorative Bone China Torch Relay Cup and Saucer. Cup, brown and green Roslyn Fine Bone China, England, 7cm (2.8") high featuring Melbourne torch within rings, surrounded by running, soccer, sailing and hurdles events joined by laurel leaves. And Saucer, 14.5cm (5.7"). Torchrunner in center surrounded by 8 Olympic sports. EF. (2 pcs.) (\$200)
- Commemorative Deck of Cards. Multicolor, 9.3x6.1cm (3.7"x2.4"). View of Olympic Swimming Pool on back of cards, EF. In pictorial box, VF-EF. (\$150)

- Commemorative Button with Ribbons. Red, blue and white celluloid, 49mm. Olympic venues and logo. With white and red ribbons. EF. (\$150)

- 522. **Official Torch.** Bronzed aluminum. 39.5cm (15.5"). Designed by Professor Maiure and his team from the National Museum of Archeology in Naples. The design is based on drawings of torches on ancient Etruscan ceramics. EF., lt. wear. (\$6,750)
- 523. Participation Medal. Cast bronze, 55mm, by E. Greco. Nude female torchbearer l. superimposed over Olympic rings. Rev. Flight of eagles soaring over stadium of Rome. EF. (\$375)
- c524. Argentine NOC Pin, 1959. Multicolor, 15mm. EF. (\$75)
- 525. Hungarian Team Pin. Multicolor enamel, 22x27mm. EF. (\$100)
- 526. Venezuela Team Pin. Gilt, multicolor enamel, 17x25mm. With disk on back. First dated NOC pin from Venezuela. EF. (\$200)

- Club Med Badge. Gilt, black, lt. blue and white enamel, 27x52mm. Logo above Roman She Wolf, date and Olympic rings. EF. (\$175)
- 528. Official Logo Pin. Silvered, 23x21mm, by Stab. Artistici Fiorentini. EF. (\$80)
- c529. Two Sets of Summer Olympic Winners Medal Replicas from Athens 1896 to Melbourne 1956 Plus 1960 and 1964 **Commemorative Medals.** One set of 14 medals cast silvered bronze, another set cast bronze, 43mm each medal, 10mm high. Made by Jaco di Firenze Company, Italy. All medals are EF, housed in wooden case with decorated inside top (28 medals). Complete set. (\$1,000)
- 530. Large Official Commemorative Silver Torchbearer Medal. Silver, "986", 60mm, 90 grams, by R. Signorini. Large She-wolf logo. Rev. Torchbearer between Rome and Athens landmarks. Proof, Unc., in case. (\$200)
- 531. Commemorative Rome 1960 Torchbearer Plaque. Goldplated bronze, 26x33mm. She-Wolf over Coliseum. Rev. Hand holding flaming torch. Integral loop. EF. (\$125)
- 532. Combined German Team Plaque. 46x62mm, Meissen porcelain. Handpainted German color flag between "Rom" and "1960". Rev. 4-line legend. EF. The East and West German teams competed separately from 1968 to 1988. In case with Olympic rings. Scarce. (\$200)
- 533. Commemorative Rome Olympic Games Medal, 1960. Silver, 50mm. Female head r., rings below. Rev. Six-armed wheel. EF. (\$125)
- Commemorative Medal. Goldplated bronze, 32mm. Olympic stadium between landmarks. Rev. Hand holding flaming torch surrounded by Olympic sport events. Integral loop and ring, EF. (\$75)
