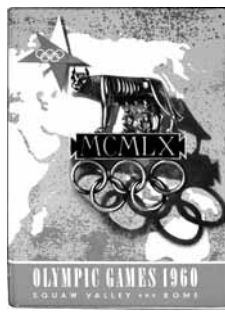

- c502. **(Autographs, Pele) Official Games Soccer Ball of the 1962 Chile World Soccer Cup Signed by the Winning Brazilian Team.** The ball was made by Adidas, and the lot includes a statement by Adidas. 21 signatures are on the ball of all Brazilian team members including substitutes, and Pele ( he did not use that name yet). Pele played for the first time outside of Brazil; he was hurt in a previous match against Czechoslovakia, and did not participate in the final game on June 17, 1962 in Santiago de Chile which ended Brazil - Czechoslovakia 3:1. This was the ball of the first kick of the match, which was replaced by a ball painted white for TV. EF. **(\$12,500)**
