

The crystal shows large Olympic rings over Alpine mountains, set in gold border engraved with logo and branch, Albertville 92 legend at bottom. No sport was engraved on the Albertville 1992



medals. With silver ribbon, Olympic color stripes in center. Housed in gray leatherette case lined in gray velvet, logo on top. With white paper sleeve, logo in gold. *The medals were entirely handmade*. A beautiful medal. (**\$27,500**)

- 722. Participation Medal. Chrome-plated steel, 68mm, by R. Mayot. Albertville Olympic emblem within French and English legend. Rev. Star symbol over Alps and Olympic rings within French legend. EF. (\$625)

ATLANTA, 26th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1996

- 737. Official Centennial Torch. Silvered aluminum and wood, 55cm (21.65"). Names of all 23 Olympic cities from 1896 to 1996 inscribed on torch. *The Hellenic Olympic Committee celebrated the 100th Anniversary of the 1896 Olympic Games in the Panathenean Stadium in Athens on April 6, 1996. Part of this celebration was the re-enactment of the 1896 Games. Olympic medalists and representatives of all cities who had hosted the Olympic Games since 1896 took part in the torch run within the stadium. Afterwards, they took the torches back to their Olympic cities for a ceremony. Unused. EF. (\$2,750)*
- 738. **Diploma for the Centennial Torch Relay in Berlin 1996.** Multicolor design, 27.5x40cm (10.8"x15.8"). Presented to the Engelhardt Brewery in Berlin together with the Centennial Torch (see lot 737) for sponsoring the Olympic Centennial Celebration in Berlin, April 1996. Signed by NOC President Troger and German Sport Association. President Richthofen. Framed, glazed. EF. (**\$150**)



- 739. Official Torch. Aluminum and Georgia pecan wood, 80cm (31.5") length, designed by Peter Mastrogiannis. 22 reeds represent the cities where Olympic Games were held since 1896. Gathered by 2 goldplated brass bands, the top band displays the Atlanta torch logo and the quilt of leaves design, the bottom band lists all Olympic cities since 1896. The wooden pecan handle represents the connection of the flame between heaven and earth. *The flame was lit in Olympia. It reached Los Angeles on April 27 and ended 84 days later in Atlanta, carried by 10,000 relay runners, horses, bicycles, trains, ships, and hydroplanes.* EF. (**\$2,500**)
- 740. **Boxed Participation Medal.** Bronze, 60mm. Official torch logo. Rev. Quilt of leaves. Unc, in pouch and box. (**\$175**)
- c741. **IOC President Samaranch Presentation Medal by the Russian Olympic Committee.** Goldplated, 50mm. Victory, seated, same design as on a winner's medal, names of Olympic cities from Moscow to Atlanta, all under Samaranchs' direction. Rev. Head l. of Samaranch. Unc., in red case. (**\$200**)
- 742. **Bid Medal for Atlanta 1996 Olympic Games.** Goldplated bronze, 63mm. Early bid logo. Rev. Hand holding torch. EF. (**\$100**)
- c743. Centennial Olympic Games Medal, 1996. Goldplated, 80mm. Chinese dragon with inset garnet stone and Chinese NOC logo above stadium. Rev. Dove of Peace with Olympic events between "1896 – 1996", English and Chinese legend. Unc., in acrylic box. Rare. (\$250)

NAGANO, 18th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1998

- 751. **Official Torch.** Aluminum, partially gilt, 55cm (21.7") long, weight 1.5kg (3.3 pounds). Designed after ancient Japanese torches called Taimatsu. It shows the Nagano emblem and sports pictograms, and a brightly colored orange cord wrapped around the lower part forms the grip. Fueled with clean burning propane, it burnt for about 20 minutes. *The torch relay in Japan took place from January 6 until February 7, when the Olympic fire was lit during the opening ceremony.* Choice EF, in original cardboard box. (**\$5,500**)
- 752. **Participation Medal.** Bronze, 60mm. Nagano logo over legend. Rev. Wooded mountainside. EF, in box with gilt logo. (**\$375**)
- 753. Large EBU UER Press Badge. Multicolor, 74x40mm, domed. EF. (\$100)
- c754. **Set of 35 Polish Team Pins.** Gold and red, color logo, 30x19mm (34 pins) and Polish NOC pin. All Unc. (35 pins). (**\$200**)
