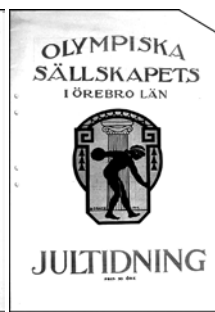

197. **Winner's Medal in the Viktor V. Podbielsky Games Held in Place of the Berlin 1916 Olympic Games in the German (Olympic) Stadium in Berlin, 1916.** Cast blackened iron, 90mm. Bust r. of Podbielsky who was instrumental in building the stadium. Rev. Victorious athlete. *The Berlin 6th Olympic Games were cancelled due to World War I.* EF. Rare. **(\$1,250)**

198. **Swedish Games in Stockholm Logo Pin, 1916.** Silvered, 16x25mm. Olympic stadium entrance. *Games were held in place of the Berlin 1916 Olympic Games.* Toned abt. EF. **(\$150)**

199. **(Flyer) Call to Donate Funds for Swedish Participation in the 1916 Berlin Olympic Games. By Crown Prince Gustaf Adolf, V.G. Balck and V.v. Heidenstam.** 23.9x36.9cm (9.4"x14.5"), in Swedish. Creased, punched, VF-EF. Plus **Magazine of the Olympic Society in Oerebro** (Dec. 1912). 16pp. illustrated, 27.2x39cm (10.7"x15.3"), in Swedish. Includes reports on Stockholm 1912 Olympic Games, also Lawn Tennis in Sweden. Orange and black cover, chipped, punched, contents EF. (2 pcs.) **(\$250)**

200. **(Official Report) The Inter-Allied Games, Paris, June 22-July 6, 1919.** Published by the Games Committee. Paris, 1919. 496pp. illustrated. 9-page fold-out panoramic photos of the stadium on opening and closing days, fold-out maps of games committee, etc. *Military "Olympic" Games of the World War I Allies, shortly after the end of WWI.* Brown linen, pictorial covers, sm. tears on spine, contents EF. **(\$375)**

**ANTWERP, 7th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1920**

c201. **Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 60mm, by Dupon. Nude victorious athlete with palm branch and laurel wreath, fame blowing horn. Rev. View of Antwerp. Toned VF-EF, spotty. **(\$4,300)**

202. **Participation Medal.** Bronze, 60mm, by P. Theunis. Nike standing before tripod crowning victorious athletes. Rev. Flying Victory crowning charioteer in biga. Abt. EF. **(\$675).**

c203. **King Albert Olympic Silver Medal.** Silver, 31mm, by Devreese. Laureated head l. Rev. Crowned and draped Belgian shield, "VIIe Olympiade-Anvers 1920". Crown at top, with white-red-white ribbon. *Presented only to attending royalty, IOC and NOC members.* Toned EF. Rare. EF. **(\$900)**

204. **Olympic Swimming Tryouts in Coblenz, Germany, May 22-23, 1920. First Place Winner's Medal in 1500 Meter Freestyle.** Goldplated, 40x45mm. Swimmer. Rev. Legend within flower branches. *Coblenz (Germany) was in the Allied Occupied Zone, left of the Rhine after the end of World War I; the occupation ended in 1930.* EF. Rare medal. **(\$350)**

c205. **American Olympic Committee Contributing Member Pin.** Goldplated, multicolor enamel, "AOC CONTRIBUTING MEMBER 1920" around shield. *First U.S. dated pin.* Screw back. EF. **(\$250)**

206. **Czech Team Pin.** Silvered, 32mm, scalloped edge. Legend above athlete and laurel branch. Looped, with ring, with ribbon in Czech colors (faded). Unevenly toned EF. **(\$200)**

**CHAMONIX, 1st OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1924**

c207. **Participation Medal and Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 55mm, by R. Bénard. Victorious athlete holding skates and skis, Alps in background. Rev. French legend in 14 lines. *First participation and winner's medal of Winter Olympic games. The only time that the participation medal was the same as the winner's medal. There were only 258 participants in Chamonix.* EF, spot obv. Very rare. **(\$16,000)**

**PARIS, 8th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1924**

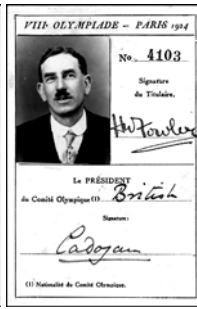
c208. **Gold First Place Winner's Medal.** Goldplated silver, 55mm, by A. Rivaud. Legend surrounded by sports equipment. Rev. Winner helping fallen athlete back on his feet. Holed at top, lt. wear on high points, abt. EF. **(\$6,000)**

209. **Participation Medal.** Bronze, 55mm, by R. Bénard. City view over French legend in three lines. Rev. Victory with laurel wreaths crowning victorious athletes. EF/abt. EF, spots. **(\$375)**

c210. **American Olympic Team 1924 Contributor Button.** Cream celluloid with blue and red design, 23mm. *For the Chamonix Winter and Paris Summer Olympic Games.* EF. **(\$250)**

211. **Swiss Fundraising Pin for the Paris 1924 Games.** Silvered, 24x24mm, cross-shaped. Unevenly toned, EF. On red shield-shaped felt. **(\$300)**

- 212. **Paavo Nurmi, Four-Time Gold Medal Winner in Paris 1924. Commemorative Medal (1925).** Bronze, 50mm, by Wickström. Head l. Rev. Nurmi running l., his accomplishment including Paris 1924 Olympic Games in 18 lines at r. EF/ abt. EF. (\$300)
- 213. **Identity Card of a British Participant.** 8x12cm (3.2"x4.7"). With photo, signed, and signature of British NOC president Earl of Cadogan. Abt. EF. (\$450)
- 214. **Eighth Olympic Congress in Prague Medal, 1925.** Bronze, 45mm. View of Charles Bridge and Hradshchin Castle. Rev. Oak branch with rings and scroll with Olympic motto. Toned EF. (\$275)
- c215. **Bronze Winner's Medal of the Second German Olympic Sports Meet ("Kampfspiele") in Köln, 1926.** Cast bronze, 88mm. Two wrestlers in high relief. Rev. Cologne Cathedral over 3-line German award legend. *Germany was not invited to the 1920 and 1924 Olympic Games. The "Kampfspiele" were a national Olympiad, held the first time in Berlin in 1922.* Green- brown original patina, EF. (\$375)

- ST. MORITZ, 2nd OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1928**
- 216. **Commemorative Silver Skating Spoon.** 11cm (4.3") long, marked "Olimpicus" on back. Skater on handle. *Made in Holland as part of a series of 1928 Olympic event spoons.* EF. (\$125)
- c217. **Set of 5 Commemorative Color Postcards.** Multicolor, 10.6x14.8cm (4.2"x5.8"). Raising of the Flags, Figure Skating, Cross Country Skiing, Bobsled and Military Ski Patrol. EF. (5 cards.) (\$250)

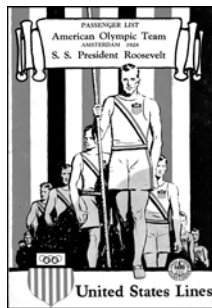
- AMSTERDAM, 9th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1928**
- 218. **Participation Medal.** Bronze, 55mm, by J.C. Wienecke. Nude male and female athlete on podium holding torch over Olympic flame. Rev. Nike over Marathon Tower, shield of Amsterdam between two hemispheres. EF. (\$450)
- 219. **Recognition Medal for Raul Jude, President of the Soccer Association of Uruguay, on the Soccer Team Winning Gold in Amsterdam.** Lead, 63mm. 5mm thick, signed Pem. Nude man with flaming torch fighting snakes, "Association Uruguay de Football" at top, "Homenaje Al Doctor Raul Jude" at l., "IX Olimpiada" in exergue. *Dr. Jude was the President of the Uruguayan Soccer Association, and also instrumental in bringing the first Soccer World Cup to Uruguay in 1930.* EF. Very rare. (\$375)

- 220. **American Olympic Fund Contributor Button for the 1928 St. Moritz and Amsterdam Games.** White celluloid, blue and red design, 26x15mm. EF. Scarce. (\$200)
- 221. **Belgian Fencing Award Plaque, ND (ca. 1928).** Bronze, 50x50mm, by Fibru, Brussels. Belgian lion within 5 rings, stylized laurel branch at sides. Rev. Fencer. EF, in cardboard box. (\$125)
- c222. **Olympic Games Westertoren Blue and White Delft Porcelain Plate.** Handpainted, 25.5cm (10"). Western Gate between Olympic flag, flags of participating nations and "19-28", surrounded by Olympic motto "CITIUS ALTIUS FORTIUS" and "IX OLYMPIADE". Scarce. EF. (\$450)
- c223. **Commemorative Yellow Leerdam Glass Vase.** 12cm (4.7") tall, made by famous Leerdam Glass company. Amsterdam shield, "OLYMPISCHE/SPELEN/ AMSTERDAM/1928" and orange decoration. EF. (\$250)
- c224. **Van Melle's Toffee Tin Box.** 15.7x15.7cm (6.2"x.2"), 25.2cm (10") tall. Javelin thrower, diving plus track and field events alternating around sides, cyclist on top. Scarce. VF. (\$200)
- c225. **Commemorative IX. Olympiade 1928 Amsterdam Silk Handkerchief.** 23x22.4cm (9.1"x8.8"), embroidered in violet around edge, and legend, Olympic rings in color. A few faint spots, VF-EF. Very scarce. (\$75)
