



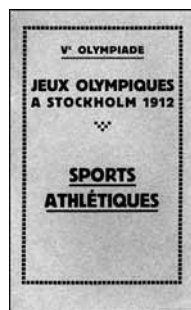

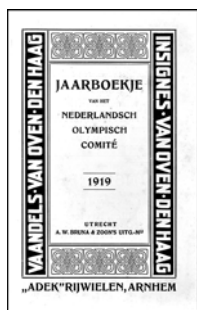

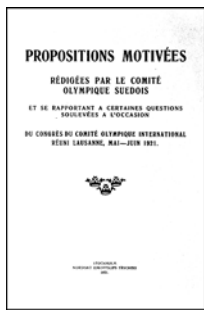

Printed by Centraltryckeriet, Stockholm. Crowned female holding staff and statue of Victory, Olympic stadium in background, panel with 7-line Swedish award legend below. Surrounded by flower and laurel leaf border. *Isabelle White, Great Britain won third place.* Unusually well preserved Art Nouveau diploma, matted and framed with matching wooden gold frame. EF. 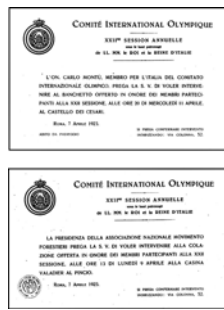

212. (Brochure) **Propositions of the Swedish Olympic Committee Regarding Questions Raised at the Olympic Congress in Lausanne, May – June 1921. Stockholm, 1921.** 19pp., 14x20.5cm (5.5”x8.1”), text in French. Incl. final program proposition for all events to be included in future Olympic games, number of contestants, voting against field hockey, polo, golf and all winter games events. EF. Interesting. (\$175)
213. **Yearbook of the Dutch Olympic Committee 1921/1922.** 142pp. illustrated, 14.4x22.9cm (5.7”x9”). List of all sports clubs, championships, winners, etc. Illustrated paper covers browning, VF, contents EF. (\$100)
- c214. **Gold First Place Winner’s Medal in the German Championships in Berlin, 1922.** Goldplated cast bronze, 68mm, by Schmarje. Nude herald with German standard. Rev. 3-line engraved legend to winner in boxing, welter weight, surrounded by oak wreath. Celebrated as national German Olympic Games as Germany was not invited to Antwerp. EF. (\$450)
215. **Third Latvian National Olympic Games in Riga, 1923. Participant’s Badge.** Bronze, 25x25mm. Victory leading athlete in quadriga r. Toned EF. (\$175)
216. **22nd IOC Session in Rome, 1923. Lunch Invitation for IOC Members** on April 9, 1923, and the lunch menu, and dinner invitation by Italian IOC member Montu, April 11. Menu 22x14cm (8.7”x5.5”). all with IOC badge within crowned Italian colors. Abt. EF. (3 pcs.) Rare. (\$250)

CHAMONIX, 1st OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1924

217. **Original Chamonix 1924 Olympic Bobsleigh Events Film.** 10mm film made by Pathé Baby, France, in (Pathé) Baby Film case, 50mm. Jean de Rovera made for the first time a film of Olympic Games events. Chamonix wasn’t declared the first Olympic Winter Games until the following year, at the time of the Chamonix Games they were considered part of the VIIIth Olympic Summer Games. EF. Rare. (\$450)
218. **Original Chamonix 1924 Olympic Skiing Events Film.** 10mm film made by Pathé Baby, France, in (Pathé) Baby Film case, 50mm. Jean de Rovera made for the first time a film of Olympic Games events. Chamonix wasn’t declared the first Olympic Winter Games until the following year, at the time of the Chamonix Games they were considered part of the VIIIth Olympic Summer Games. EF. Rare. (\$450)

220. **Ontario, Canada, Olympic Swimming Trials Second Place Winner’s Medal, 1924.** Silver, 31x35mm, by Ellis Brothers. Laureated athlete with Victory statue and laurel branch, color enameled Ontario shield at 1. Rev. “1924 Men 440 Yds Free Style 2nd/Shier Mendelson” engraved in 6 lines. With loop and ring. EF. (\$175)
- c221. **Swiss Fundraising Pin.** Silvered, 29x29mm. Laureated bust of winner between “Paris-1924”. EF, with original clasps and red felt. (\$150)
- c222. **Paris 1924 Poster Enameled IOC Presentation Box.** Multicolor enameled copper, 60mm, 30mm high, hand made in the 1980’s by Crummies & Co., England. Olympic salute poster design, Olympic motto and Paris 1924 Olympic Games legend inside top. EF. (\$200)
- c223. **Pair of Commemorative Athlete’s Sculptures.** Bronzed white metal (spelter), 24.5cm (9.6”) and 26cm (10.2”) tall. Athlete throwing gilt ball, “VIIIe OLYMPIADE” on base; and standing athlete balancing gilt ball on arm, “PARIS 1924” on base. Rare pair. Abt. EF. (2 pcs). (\$1,750)

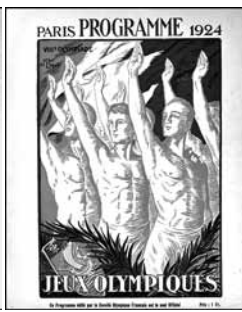

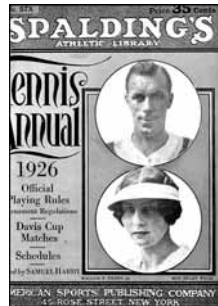
