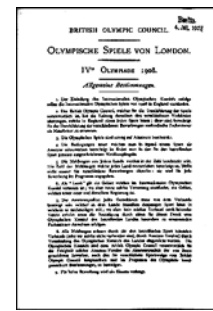




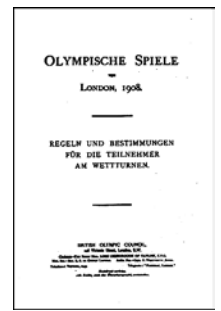

LONDON, 4th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1908

The following three lots and lot 74, the British Olympic Council Badge, belonged to Dr. W.J. Leighton, Member of the British Olympic Council and Vice President of the Irish Amateur Swimming Association. He studied in Belfast and moved from Ireland to England early in his medical career. He was also a Swimming Referee in the 1908 London Games.

- c204. **Cased British Olympic Council Gold Participation Medal.** Goldplated, 50mm, by B. MacKenna. Winged Fame standing on globe holding palm branch and horn. Rev. Winner in quadriga dashing left. Unc. Housed in blue leatherette case with gold legend on top, scuffed, stained on bottom, lined in purple velvet and cream silk. Very rare. (\$3,000)
- c205. **Doctor's Cased Bronze Participation Medal, and Lifesaving Medal.** Bronze, 50mm, by B. MacKenna. Winged Fame standing on globe holding palm branch and horn. Rev. Winner in quadriga dashing left. In black leatherette case inscribed in gold "Olympic Games. Doctor, London. 1908." Lined in green velvet and cream silk. Plus Bronze Cased Life Saving Medal of the Royal Life Saving Society, "Awarded to W.J. Leighton, M.B., Feb. 1907". Water rescuing scene. Rev. Legend. Looped, in original red case. Both EF. (2 pcs.) (\$2,500)
- c206. **British Olympic Council Member's "Diploma of Merit" Named for Doctor W. J. Leighton.** 44.5x28.5cm (17.5"x11.2"), designed by Bernard Partridge. Victory seated in center, athlete and History seated below on either side. "Awarded to W. J. Leighton Esq. MB / For Services Rendered as a Member / By the British Olympic Council. President Desborough" (signed in ink). Browning around margins of top and right side, bright colors, abt. EF. Rare diploma. In gold and wooden frame. (\$3,000)
- c207. **Cased Donor Silver Participation Medal.** Silvered bronze, 50mm, by B. MacKenna. Winged Fame standing on globe holding palm branch and horn. Rev. Winner in quadriga dashing left. EF, spot. In dark blue leatherette case with gold legend on top, inside lined in purple velvet and silk (lt. scuffing). (\$2,500)
- 208. **Participation Medal.** White metal, 50mm, by B. MacKenna. Winged Fame standing on globe holding palm branch and horn. Rev. Winner in quadriga dashing left. Presented to athletes. Abt. EF, traces of mounting on edge. (\$800)
- 209. **Official Jury Plaque of the Franco-British Exposition Held in Conjunction with the Olympic Games, 1908.** Bronze, 57x69mm, by Ch. Pillet. Britannia extending hand to Gallia across the British Channel, 6-line French legend for Secretary of Class 80 and 81 Jury engraved in upper r. Rev. Seated Peace holding 2 flags over view of exposition grounds with Olympic Games stadium. This is the only medallic illustration of the Olympic stadium in 1908. EF. (\$600)

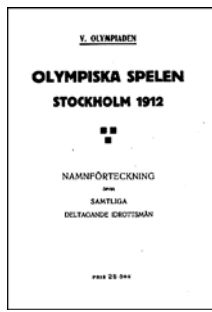

EF, in red leather presentation case, embossed in gold on top, lt. scuffing. (\$6,750)
- 215. **Miniature Olympic Merit Medal.** Silver, 15mm. Head l. of King Gustav V. Rev. 3-line Olympic legend over crossed branches. Crown at top, and loop, with ribbon in Swedish colors. EF. (\$225)
- 216. **Silver Winner's Medal of British Olympic Games Trial Races.** Hallmarked silver, 30mm, 2 circular lines of legend in English and Greek around center design. Rev. Open oak wreath. EF. (\$275)
- 217. **Commemorative Plaque of the 50th Anniversary of the Stockholm Olympic Games, 1962.** Bronze, 11x7.2cm (4.3"x2.8"). Participant's badge dividing both sides of participation medal, 2-line Swedish legend below. EF. (\$175)

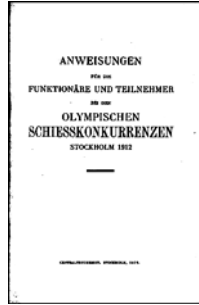

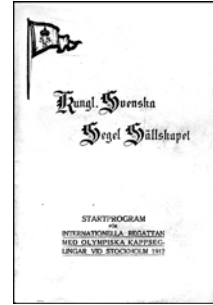

c218. **First Place Winner's Diploma Awarded for Cycling, 320 KM (199 Miles) Road Race Around Lake Mälär.** Color lithography with gold decor, 28.6x45.5cm, designed by Olle Hjertberg, Professor at the Royal Academy of Fine Arts and designer of the official poster. Printed by Centraltryckeriet, Stockholm. Crowned female holding staff and statue of Victory, Olympic stadium in background, panel with 7-line Swedish award legend below. Surrounded by flower and laurel leaf border. *The grueling race around Lake Mälär was raced by single cyclists. The 4 best single cyclists of each country were counted as a team and Sweden won first place.* A few minor spots, o.w. EF. Matted, in frame. Beautiful Art Nouveau diploma. (\$4,500)

CHAMONIX, 1st OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1924

- 252. **Original Chamonix 1924 Olympic Figure Skating Film by Jean de Rovera.** 10mm film, by Pathé Baby, France, in (Pathé) Baby Film case, 50mm. *Jean de Rovera made for the first time a film of Olympic Games events. Chamonix wasn't declared the first Olympic Winter Games until the following year, at the time of the Chamonix Games they were considered part of the VIIIth Olympic Summer Games.* EF. Rare. **(\$425)**

PARIS, 8th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1924

- c253. **The Olympic Winner's Sèvres Porcelain Vase Awarded for Soccer, Rowing, Rugby, and Diving.** Sèvres pâte-sur-pâte porcelain, 33.3cm (13.1") tall, designed by talented artist M.O. Guillonet and executed by Bracquemond at the world famous porcelain factory of Sèvres. Golden laurel branches are handpainted on French blue background, the white medallions depicting **Soccer, Rowing, Rugby and Diving**, on gray background with green border. Official report p. 804. *The vases were made in several versions to accommodate all Olympic events. They were presented only to gold medal winners.* EF. Very rare and beautiful. **(\$15,000)**
- c254. **French Republic Gold Olympic Games Award Medal.** Goldplated bronze, 59mm, by Roty/Bertrand. Laureated bust l. of French Republic. Rev. Palm, laurel and oak branches with scroll, Olympic legend at r. EF. **(\$500)**
- c255. **Paris 1924. Swedish Team Pin.** Hallmarked silver, goldplated, 23x24mm, made by Hallberg. Swedish blue-yellow flag with "Paris 1924". EF. Rare. **(\$450)**
- c256. **New York Mayor Hylan Presentation Medal to the American Olympic Team on Their Return from Paris, 1924.** Goldplated sterling silver, 30x52mm, by Dieges & Clust. Athlete holding palm branch between American and French shield, legend at sides. With loop and rings. Partially toned EF. Rare in silver. **(\$750)**
- 257. **Homage to Paris 1924 Olympic Soccer Champions Medal.** Bronze, 35mm. Olympic rings around Paris 1924 champions legend. Rev. Soccer player surrounded by Uruguay Professional Soccer Players Insurance legend. Traces of goldplating, EF. **(\$125)**
- 258. **Original 10mm Film of the Football (Soccer) Events of the 1924 Paris Games.** Pathe Baby film case, 50mm, made in France. EF. Very rare. **(\$375)**
