- 223. **Ancient Greek Poet Pindar Commemorative Medal (19th Century).** Cast iron, 35x43mm. Bearded bust of writer of the Olympic Odes who lived from 522 or 518 to 446 BC. As made, EF. (\$200)
- 224. **Restoration of the Olympic Games at the First Olympic Congress in Paris Medal, 1894.** Bronze, 50mm. Oak and laurel branches with ribbon "25 Juin 1894". Rev. "The International Congress in Paris Proclames the Reestablishment of the Olympic Games" (translated from French), laurel and oak branch at side. Very rare and historically important medal. EF. (\$2,500)

ATHENS, 1st OLYMPIC GAMES, 1896

- 225. **Participation Medal.** Bronze, 50mm, by N. Lytras. Seated Nike holding laurel wreath, phoenix rising out of flames, Acropolis in background. Rev. 5-line Greek legend in laurel wreath. EF, a few spots. (\$1,500)
- 226. **International Stamp Exposition in Geneva, 1896.** Silver Award Medal by Geneva Philatelic Society. Silver, 52mm, by Hantz. View of Geneva, stamp at lower l. Rev. Geneva coat of arms. Toned Unc., tiny rms., cased. (\$100)
- 227. **(Photo) Sepia Photo of the Panathenian Stadium.** Pasted on board, 25.6x21.4cm (10.1"x8.4"). Athens 1896 decorations on top of stadium. Capture in ink "The Stadion/Seats 50.000 People". Upper corners chipped, VF. (\$275)
- c228. **(Magazine) Masson Wins the Cycling Event in the Athens Olympic Games, 1896.** Illustrated Supplement of Le Petit Journal, April 26, 1896. 8pp., 31x44.7cm (12.2"x17.6"). Masson, France, is being congratulated at the finish line, Acropolis in background. The color print is on the last page. EF. (\$150)

PARIS, 2nd OLYMPIC GAMES, 1900

The 1900 Paris Olympic Games were held in conjunction with the World's Exposition. They played only a minor role. There were athletes who didn't know that the events they participated in were Olympic Games events. Few items relate directly to the Games. For this reason we are also offering items commemorating the World's Exposition.

- c229. **Minister of Sports Gold Award Plaque.** Goldplated bronze, 41x59mm, by F. Vernon. Victorious athlete standing on podium. Rev. 4-line French award legend over laurel branch. Unc. (\$1,250)
- c230. **Gold Award Medal of the Paris 1900 World's Fair.** Goldplated silver (vermeil), 53mm, by J.C. Chaplain. Head of French Republic r. view of Paris in background. Rev. Male with torch carried by flying female over exposition grounds, name on panel below. *Since no participation medals were issued in 1900, collectors often add this medal to their collection.* Abt. EF. Scarce. (\$700)
- 231. **Firefighting Maneuvers at the World's Fair in Paris Official Medal, 1900.** Silvered bronze, 50mm, by L. Bottée. Helmeted bust of France, rooster on helmet, cherub with torch below leaning on beehive. Rev. 4-line legend in center surrounded by fire fighting scenes. *Fire fighting was an Olympic event.* Very rare. EF, in cardboard box. (\$600)

c238. **Complete Bound Set of 26 Weekly News Issues of "A 1' Exposition" (At the Exposition), April 29 – October 21, 1900.** Issues 1 to 25 are 4pp. each, issue 26 has 208 pp. illustrated, 20.5x29.5cm (8"x11.6"), in French language. All bound with pictorial covers in different colors. Issue 26 reports extensively on expositions of all worldwide countries. Half leather and marbled boards, scuffed, interior EF. (\$375)

ST. LOUIS, 3rd OLYMPIC GAMES, 1904

The 1904 Olympic Games in St. Louis were also held in conjunction with a World's Fair. This, again, detracted a lot from the importance of the Games. Few items are available that relate directly to the Olympiad, and they usually command very high prices. For this reason we are also offering some memorabilia from the World's Fair which celebrated the Centennial of the Louisiana Purchase from Napoleon in 1803.

232. **Entry Gate to the Paris World's Fair Medal, 1900.** Silvered brass, 33mm. View of "Monumental Gate", the entry to the Fair. Rev. Palace of Electricity. Looped. EF. (\$100)
- c233. **"Liseron" (Morning Glory). Ceramic Sculpture of a Young Woman with Flowing Hair in Art Nouveau Style.** 29cm (11.4") high, 18cm (7.1") wide, by J. Iscoli(?). Young woman, in the morning glory of her life, looking up, her hair flowing, on oval base with flowers, inscribed "LISERON". With stamp on back "Exposition Universelle de Paris 1900" and round maker's mark showing helmeted woman, and number "15". *The World's Fair had an area where art works were sold, and where art works were purchased for prizes to Olympic Winners.* Lt. wear, abt. EF. Pleasing Art Nouveau sculpture. (\$1,250)
234. **(Magazine) La Vie au Grand Air. The Outdoors. The Sports at the World's Exposition.** May 6, 1900, Nr. 86. 31pp. illustrated, 27.3x34cm (10.7"), in French. Organization of all events in 12 Sections, officials, venues, some with maps, prizes. President of Olympic Games, D. Mérillon, on cover. EF. (\$125)
235. **(Magazine) La Vie au Grand Air. June 17, 1900, Nr. 92.** 19pp. illustrated, 28x34.8cm (11"x13.7"), in French. Includes the Olympic Polo event, 2 pages with photos. Spine taped, abt. EF. (\$100)
236. **(Magazine) La Vie au Grand Air. September 9, 1900, Nr. 104.** 15pp. illustrated, 28x34.8cm (11"x13.7"), in French. Archery and gymnastic events are covered in this issue. Abt. EF. (\$100)
237. **(Magazine) La Vie au Grand Air. September 23, 1900, Nr. 106.** 15pp. illustrated, 28x34.8cm (11"x13.7"), in French. Includes 3-pages illustrated articles on cycling and equestrian events. VF-EF. (\$125)

- c239. **Participation Medal.** Bronze, 40x40mm, made by Dieges & Clust, New York. Nude athlete striding r., laurel branch in hand. Rev. Legend in eleven lines, shields of St. Louis, France and U.S.A. between ivy leaves. With loop and ring. VF-EF. Rare. (\$17,500)
240. **Silver Award Medal of the 1904 St. Louis Fair.** Bronze, 66x66mm, by Weinmann. America cloaking Louisiana. Rev. Eagle with spread wings on panel with award legend. EF. (\$325)
241. **Commemorative World's Fair Porcelain Plate.** Blue and white, 17.9cm (7"), made by Victoria Art Co. Facing decorated military bust of Napoleon who sold the territory in 1803 to Jefferson, U.S. and French flags at sides. Rare. EF. (\$150)
242. **Commemorative St. Louis 1904 Porcelain Plate.** Multicolor, 16.2cm (6.4"). View of government building, St. Louis 1904 legend below. VF-EF. (\$75)
243. **(Ticket) Day 327, November 25, 1904, Intercollegiate Football Event.** Green and black, 68x29mm. EF. (\$125)
244. **(Ticket) Day 328, November 26, 1904, Intercollegiate Football Event.** Green and black, 68x42mm. EF. (\$125)
245. **Visitor's Certificate of Attendance to the World's Fair.** Black, green and gold, 32x24cm (12.6"x9.5"). View of Cascade Gardens surrounded by gold legend. Unissued. EF. (\$175)

ATHENS, INTERMEDIATE OLYMPIC GAMES, 1906

- c246. **Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 50mm, by J. Chaplain. Laureated head of Zeus facing holding winged statue of Victory with laurel branch on globe. Rev. View of Acropolis and Parthenon between Olympic legend. *Similar to 1896 winner's medal - only the date on the reverse was changed to 1906.* Toned EF. (\$6,500)

- c247. **Cased Gold American Olympic Committee Member's Badge.** Unmarked gold, 32x44, by Dieges & Clust. Greek and U.S. shield over "MEMBER" and A.A.U. logo, "Olympic Games/Held at Athens Greece/1906" legend. Blue-white-blue ribbon and "American Committee" bar, ribbon is frayed in spots. In original case, lined in velvet and silk. EF. Very rare. **(\$2,500)**
248. **Silver Participation Medal.** Silvered bronze, 50mm, by N. Lytras. Seated Nike holding laurel wreath over phoenix emerging from flames, Acropolis in background. Rev. Greek legend in wreath. VF-EF, ms. **(\$1,250)**
249. **Swedish Participation Medal.** Bronze, 50mm. Raised helmeted head of Athena half r. Rev. Nude javelin thrower, Greek temples in background. EF. Very rare. **(\$750)**
250. **Commemorative Winner's Plaque.** Silvered bronze, 49x70mm, by Vannier. Olympic winner over crowded Athens Olympic stadium, Acropolis at l. Rev. Fame flying over laurel tree, Greek temple at r. EF. **(\$500)**

LONDON, 4th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1908

- c251. **Silver Participation Medal.** Silvered bronze, 50mm, by B. MacKenna. Winged Fame standing on globe holding palm branch and horn. Rev. Winner in quadriga dashing left. Presented to high officials. EF, tiny ms. **(\$1,800)**
- c252. **Bronze Participation Medal.** Bronze, 50mm, by B. MacKenna. Winged Fame standing on globe holding palm branch and horn. Rev. Winner in quadriga dashing left. Presented to donors. EF. **(\$1,400)**
253. **Participation Medal.** White metal, 50mm, by B. MacKenna. Winged Fame standing on globe holding palm branch and horn. Rev. Winner in quadriga dashing left. Presented to athletes. Abt. EF/VF-EF. **(\$1,000)**

254. **Franco-British Exhibition Official Silver Award Medal, 1908.** Silver, 51mm, by F. Bowcher, Winged Peace between seated French Republic and Britannia. Rev. Female dropping laurel branch over exhibition buildings, plaque with award name below. *The Olympic Games were held in connection with the Franco-British Exhibition. Eimer 1903b.* EF. **(\$750)**
255. **Official Plaque of the Franco-British Exposition Held in Conjunction with the Olympic Games, 1908.** Bronze, 57x69mm, by Ch. Pillet. Britannia extending hand to Gallia across the British Channel. Rev. Seated Peace holding 2 flags over view of exposition grounds with Olympic Games stadium. *This is the only medallion illustration of the Olympic stadium in 1908.* EF. **(\$500)**
256. **Stanhope Featuring Dorando Pietri Being Helped over the Marathon Finish Line.** Brass, 40mm long. Contains a microscopic image of the famous marathon finish in London 1908, 3-line explanatory text below. *Since Dorando, Italy, got help to cross the finish line he was disqualified, and the American John Hayes was declared the winner.* EF. Very rare. **(\$350)**

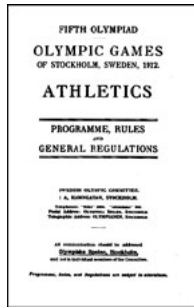

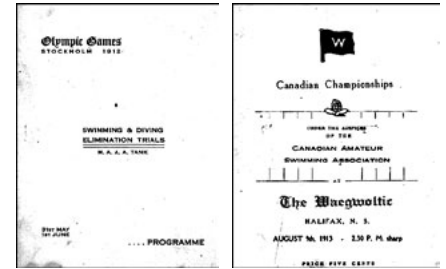

Mentions the Olympic Games and describes the stadium, and the Imperial Sports Club, headquarters for the Olympic Organizing Committee. Furthermore, Pathé Frères is mentioned making films of the Olympic Games, possibly for the first time ever! Color covers, tears, VF, contents VF-EF. **(\$200)**

260. **Participation Medal.** Pewter, 51mm, by Lindberg/MacKennial. Zeus seated on Ionian column holding figure of Nike, Stockholm in back. Rev. Quadriga with triumphant winner dashing l. Abt. EF/VF-EF. **(\$350)**
- c261. **Commemorative Olympic Art Nouveau Pin with Ice Skate, Stockholm 1912.** Gilt, dark blue enamel, 76mm, with garnet. With legend "Commemorating Stockholm Olympic Games", transl. from Swedish. Gilt skate affixed on top. EF. Rare. **(\$250)**
- c262. **U.S. Team Patch.** Blue-white-red embroidery, 7.8x9.7cm (3.1"x3.8"). Thirteen stars. EF. Rare. **(\$375)**
263. **Marathon Runner and Olympic Stadium Pewter Cup.** 9.8cm (3.9") high. View of Olympic Stadium, "Olympic Games Stockholm 1912" in Swedish on scroll below. Swedish royal arms and winning marathon runners, "Marathon Run" in Swedish. Tiny rms. at top, abt. EF. Scarce. **(\$250)**
264. **Commemorative Pewter Cup.** 9cm (3.5") high. Two oak wreaths surrounding dates of the 1912 Games and 3 Swedish crowns, connected by oak garlands and commemorative legend. VF-EF. **(\$175)**
- c265. **Official Poster in Hungarian Language.** 75x105cm (29.1"x41.3"), designed by Olle Hjörtzberg, Swedish Professor at the Royal Academy of Fine Arts, printed by A. Bortzells, Stockholm. Nude young men waving flags of participating nations, legend in Hungarian below. *At the time, the design was considered too daring by some countries, and the poster and seals with this design were not distributed in the respective countries.* Olympism p. 20/21. 266. **(Brochure) Program, General Rules and Regulations.** 37pp. illustrated, 14.6x22.1cm (5.7"x8.7"), in German. Includes also prizes for the first 3 winners in each event. Stiff red covers, EF. **(\$200)**

Incl. all sport events, demonstration sports, Boy Scouts participation and choirs, etc. Lt. creases and browning, VF-EF. Scarce. **(\$225)**
