DIPLOMAS OF THE OLYMPIC GAMES

c52. Athens 1896. Winner's Diploma - Presented to Crown Prince Constantine, President of the Organizing Committee. Copper engraving, 60x48cm (23.6"x1.9"), designed by Nikolaos Gyzis. At the top is the Parthenon with the Greek flag, phoenix rising above. Winged victory at right extending an olive branch, Hellas seated at left, relief of the ancient Olympic Games in center, 5-line Greek legend with space for award legend below. Handwritten 7-line Greek dedication in ink below to Crown Prince Constantine by Thimoleon Philimon, General Secretary of the Organizing Committee. This diploma is pictured in "Olympische Siege" (Olympic Victories, translated from German) by Lennartz, Borgers and Höfer, printed in 2000, on page 13. Lt. foxing, a few water stains and a small tear at left on white border, not extending into design. VF+, framed and glazed. First time a diploma from the first modern Olympic Games is offered at auction. Extremely rare. (\$20,000)





At the top is the Parthenon with the Greek flag, phoenix rising above. Winged victory at right extending an olive branch, Hellas seated at left, relief of the ancient Olympic Games in center, 5-line Greek award legend with space for award legend below. It is dated "B" for Second (Olympic Games in Athens). Signed by Crown Prince Constantine and General Secretary Thimoleon Philimon. *Ioannis Georgiadis won also gold in Sabre Individual in 1906 and previously gold in 1896*. Small tear in white border, o.w. VF-EF. Framed and glazed. Extremely rare. (**\$8,500**)
- c55. London 1908. Official Diploma of Merit. 44x30cm (17.3"x11.8"), designed by Bernard Partridge. Victory with wreath between Hellas and Britannia, athlete seated on r., winner's medal below, athletes on sides. Signed by Lord Desborough, President of the British Olympic Council. *The Merit diploma was presented to outstanding athletes who did not win a medal, also officials, federations, etc.* Unawarded, in wooden frame, glazed. VF, browning, sm. marginal tears. (\$3,000)
- c56. Stockholm 1912. Merit Diploma for Shooting and 200 Meter Athletic Events of Swedish Competitor R.F. Cederström. Color lithography with gold and blue decor, 36.9x53.4 (14.5"x21"), designed by Olle Hjertzberg, Professor at the Royal Academy of Fine Arts and designer of the official poster. Printed by Centraltryckeriet, Stockholm. Crowned female holding staff and statue of Victory, Stockholm Olympic stadium in background, panel with 7-line Swedish award legend below. Surrounded by flower and laurel leaf border. EF, professionally matted and framed, glazed. (\$2,750)
- 57. Antwerp 1920. Participation Diploma for Dutch Cyclist P.J. Abel Boonstra. Lt. brown, 74x59cm (29.1"x23.2"), designed by Jean Malvaux, printed by Goossens, S.A., Brussels. Beautiful Art Deco Style diploma. Professionally lined on linen. EF. (\$2,500)

Stadium and legend between frieze of ancient Greek athletes, Goddess Columbia and Athena at sides. In original presentation tube with Olympic rings. EF. (\$1,400)
- c62. Berlin 1936. Honorary Diploma for Gustavus T. Kirby, Treasurer of the American Olympic Committee. Facsimile signatures of Organizing Committee President Lewald and IOC President Baillet-Latour. Embossed Olympic stadium between Brandenburg Gate and Olympic bell, on gold background. EF. - IOC Olympic Diploma Awarded for Work Within the Press Commission, 1982. Black and white, 20.9x29.7cm (8.2"x11.7"). Signed by IOC President Samaranch. Rare diploma. EF. (\$150)
