- c97. Silver Winner's Medal. Silver, 41mm by Barre, struck at Paris Mint. Head r. of King George I. Rev. 5-line Greek award legend in open laurel wreath. VF-EF. Very rare. (\$4,000)
- 98. **Cased Participation Medal.** Copper, 41mm, by Barre. Head r. of King George I. Rev. Legend in crossed laurel branches. In original round case, scuffed, medal Unc. (\$1,500)

### FIRST IOC CONGRESS IN PARIS, AND RESTORATION OF THE OLYMPIC GAMES, 1894

99. **Restoration of the Olympic Games at the First Olympic Congress in Paris. Official Medal, 1894.** Bronze, 50mm. Oak and laurel branches with ribbon "25 Juin 1894". Rev. "The International Congress in Paris Proclames the Reestablishment of the Olympic Games" (translated from French), laurel and oak branch at side. Very rare and historically important medal. EF. (\$2,500)





- 100. Bulletin of the International Committee of the Olympic Games (IOC) 1st Year, No. 1, July 1894. 4pp., 29.8x40cm (11.7"x15.8"), in French language. First issue of the IOC Bulletin relating to the Congress at the Sorbonne in Paris where the Olympic Games were restored. List of the IOC members, President Bikelas and Secretary General Pierre de Coubertin, honorary members and delegates of the Congress. Details of the Congress by day, June 16-23, 1894, question of amateur status, decision to award the first modern Olympic Games to Athens in 1896. Lt. browning, folded twice, VF+. Very rare documentation. (\$1,850)
- Bulletin of the International Committee of the Olympic Games (IOC), 1st Year, No. 2, October 1894. 4pp., 29.8x40cm (11.7"x15.8"), in French language. Second issue of the IOC Bulletin clarifying the Games as "international", designation of the 1900 Games to France and 1904 to the United States. Complete speech by Pierre de Coubertin held on the opening of the Congress on June 16, 1894. Extract of an essay presented at the Congress by D. Bikelas for the Panhellenic Society of Gymnastics. List of athletic federations and sports clubs in England including the Wenlock Olympian Society, Rowing, Cycling, etc. Coubertin and Bikelas are in Athens to prepare the 1896 Games. Michel Bréal offering a "Marathon Cup" (which was recently sold for a record price!) if marathon was to be part of the Games, etc. Very light browning, folded twice, VF-EF. Very rare. (\$1,750)

c102. **Gold Participation Medal.** Goldplated bronze, 50mm, by N. Lytras. Seated Nike holding laurel wreath over phoenix emerging from flames, Acropolis in background. Rev. Greek legend in wreath. Abt. EF. (\$1,750)



- 103. **Participation Medal.** Bronze, 50mm, by N. Lytras. Seated Nike holding laurel wreath, phoenix rising out of flames, Acropolis in background. Rev. 5-line Greek legend in laurel wreath. EF. (\$1,750)
- 104. **Olympic Games in Athens Medal, 1896.** Bronze, 29mm, by Houtopoulos. View of 1896 Olympic stadium. Rev. Laurel wreath over "776 x 1896". With loop and ring. *The medal was to be worn and is the first collector's pin.* EF. (\$475)

- 106. Invitation of Gold Medal Winners to a Breakfast with the King of Greece on March 31, 1896 at the Palace in Athens. Stock paper, 15.4x10.2cm (6.1"x4"). Invitation for Hermann Weingärtner, Germany, Gold in Gymnastics, Horizontal Bar, Silver in Rings and Side Horse. His son writes on the reverse that his father was ridiculed as a loser on his return to Berlin for only winning silver. Only his gold medal counted! Detached in center and reglued on back, VF. Interesting documentation. (\$750)
- c107. (Magazine) Masson Wins the Cycling Event in the Athens Olympic Games, 1896. Illustrated Supplement of Le Petit Journal, April 26, 1896. 8pp., 31x44.7cm (12.2"x17.6"). Masson, France, is being congratulated at the finish line, Acropolis in background. The color print is on the last page. EF. (\$100)
- 108. **It Happened in Athens Film Poster (1962).** Multicolor 3-sheet, 103x200cm (40.6"x78.7"). Film on the first modern Olympic Games in Athens 1896 starring Bob Mathias, "Twice World Olympic Decathlon Champion", and Jane Mansfield. EF, professionally lined on linen. **(\$950)**

### PARIS, 2nd OLYMPIC GAMES, 1900

The 1900 Paris Olympic Games were held in conjunction with the World's Exposition. They played only a minor role. There were athletes who didn't know that the events they participated in were Olympic Games events. Few items relate directly to the Games. For this reason we are also offering items commemorating the World's Exposition.

c109. Gold Winner's Plaque of the XXVI<sup>th</sup> Federal Gymnastics Festival. Goldplated silver, 41x59mm, by F. Vernon. Winged goddess scattering laurel branches over Paris exposition grounds. Rev. Victorious athlete standing on podium inscribed "XXVIme Fête Fédérale De Gymnastique" in 3 lines. Small hole in top and bottom edge. EF. (\$3,750)

5. Group of 28 Original Platinotype Photos by Albert Meyer, Berlin. Photos 18.6x12.6cm (7.3"x5"), pasted on stiff board, 21.4x13.6cm (8.4"x5.4"), with embossed name in silver and shields of Saxony and Saxony-Meiningen where Meyer was the Court Photographer. Reverse shows the medals he won for his photography. Meyer was one of only seven photographers accredited in Athens 1896, and only about 100 photos taken by all seven photographers are known today. Volker Kluge published "The Pictures of the First Olympiad" in Berlin, 1996, and 28 of the photos shown in the book are included in this offering with the page numbers shown in brackets below. Helmeted bust of France, rooster on helmet, cherub with torch below leaning on beehive. - c118. Gold Award Medal of the Paris 1900 World's Fair. Goldplated silver (vermeil), 53mm, by J.C. Chaplain. Head of French Republic r., view of Paris in background. Rev. Male with torch carried by flying female over exposition grounds, name on panel below. Since no participation medals were issued in 1900, collectors often add this medal to their collection. Abt. EF. Scarce. (\$700)
- 119. **Boxed World's Fair Bronze Award Medal.** Bronze, 61mm, by Chaplain. Head of French Republic r. Rev. Male with torch carried by female. *Since no participation medals were issued in 1900, collectors often add this medal to their collection.* In presentation case, top detached, medal EF. (\$350)
- 120. **Award Medal of the World's Exposition.** Bronze, 61mm, by Chaplain. Head of French Republic r. Rev. Male with torch carried by female. *Since no participation medals were made in 1900, collectors like to add this medal to their collections.* EF. **(\$300)**
- 121. Ticket to the World's Fair Including the Olympic Games, 1900. Price 1 Franc. Blue, 72x50mm. Sm. spot in center, lower r. corner crease, VF-EF. (\$100)
- c122. Complete Bound Set of 26 Weekly News Issues of "A l' Exposition" (At the Exposition), April 29 October 21, 1900. Issues 1 to 25 are 4pp. each, issue 26 has 208 pp. illustrated, 20.5x29.5cm (8"x11.6"), in French language. All bound with pictorial covers in different colors. Issue 26 reports extensively on expositions of all worldwide countries. Half leather and marbled boards, scuffed, interior EF. (\$250)
