176. **IOC 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Medal of the Restoration of the Olympic Games, 1919.** Bronze, 50mm, by Elzinger. Victorious athlete holding statue of Victory, on horse, led by two young athletes. Rev. 11-line French legend, laurel sprig below. Toned EF, cased. (\$600)

177. **“Victory!” Gold Medal Winner’s Trophy for an Individual Event.** Cast bronze, on marble base, 37cm (14.6”), by M. Grandmoulin. Victorious athlete, arm raised, holding laurel wreath, standing on base inscribed “Victoire!” and signed by the artist with date “1920”. Mounted on round marble base and square bronze plaque below with “VII OLYMPIADE ANVERS 1920”. Only in Antwerp 1920 and Paris 1924 did the first place winner’s receive a trophy in addition to their medals. Extremely rare and attractive. (\$12,500)

178. **Participant’s Badge for Freestyle Wrestling.** Cardboard, 72x75mm. Facsimile signature of Secretary General. Photo of wrestler on reverse. EF/VF. Very rare. (\$1,000)

179. **Australian Team Badge.** Multicolor celluloid, 32mm. Athlete emerging from map of Australia, “Olympic Games Antwerp 1920/Australia”. EF. Rare. (\$750)

180. **American Olympic Committee Contributing Member Pin.** Goldplated, multicolor enamel, “AOC CONTRIBUTING MEMBER 1920” around shield. First U.S. dated pin. Screw back. EF. (\$250)

c181. **Stadium Season Ticket, Area I, Price 300 Frs.** Orange stock paper, 13x9cm (5.1”x3.5”). With stamp of Secretary General of Belgian NOC, numbered. EF/VF+. Extremely rare entry ticket to all Olympic events in stadium. (\$1,250)

182. **(Brochure) Shooting Program, General Rules and Regulations.** 28pp., 12x20.5cm (4.7”x8”), in French. EF. (\$200)

183. **(Brochure) Yachting. Program, Rules, Regulations, Prizes and Committee Members.** 29pp., 11 plates, 12.3x20.3cm (4.8”x8”), in French language. Lt. brown covers. EF. (\$200)

c184. **Official Swimming Program, August 25, 1920, Swimming Stadium.** 56pp. illus. in b&w and color, 14x21cm (5.5”x8.5”). in French and Dutch. Plain High Diving, Men, won by A. Wallman, Sweden; 100-Meter Freestyle Swimming won by Ethelda Bleibtrey, USA; 400-Meter Breaststroke won by G. Zacharias, Germany; and 1500-Meter Freestyle Swimming Finals. Sm. chips and sm. tear on cover, creases, VF+. (\$350)

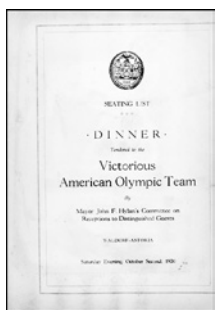

Description of compulsory exercises, illustrated, rules, and entry blank on back. Plus **Official Program**, 4 pages, 10x17.5cm (3.9”x6.9”). Officials, Entries, and Order of Events. Creased, VF+. (2 pcs.) (\$200)

186. **Large 1920 Olympic Trap Shooting Team Luggage Label.** Red-white-blue, 15.6x22cm (6.1”x8.7”). VF, frayed at bottom. Rare. (\$150)

187. **First Class Berthing Card for a Member of the U.S. Olympic Team.** 11.5x7.5cm (4.5”x3”). Browned. Plus Baggage Check on the “Sherman”, August 5, 1920. VF+. (2 pcs.) (\$100)

188. **Pair of Belgian State Railroad Identity Cards for an American Official.** Lt. green and pink, 11.3x8.4cm (4.4”x3.3”) each. Each card allowed for a ticket price reduction between the port of arrival and Antwerp, and return. Facsimile signatures of NOC Secretary and President (Baillet-Latour). Green card browning. VF+, and VF-EF. (2 pcs.) (\$225)

c189. **(Autographs) Red Star Line Antwerpen. “First Class” Dinner Menu.** Multicolor, 14x23cm (5.5”x9.1”). Upper part is a postcard, menu below with 11 signatures including U.S. Olympic Officials. Frederick W. Rubien, Secretary of the AOC, Roy E. Moore, Gymnastics Official. Creased, VF-EF. (\$150)



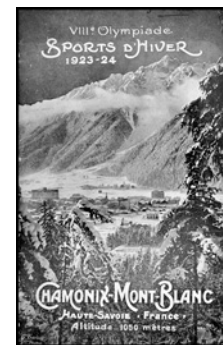

- c190. **Dinner in Honor of the Victorious Olympic Athletes by New York Mayor John F. Hylan, Waldorf Astoria Hotel, New York, October 2, 1920.** Stock paper, multicolor cover, 5 pages, 16.2x35.5cm (6.4"x14"). Victorious laureated American athlete standing next to column with American eagle, "Victory/Antwerp/1920" above, Antwerp stadium and embossed New York seal at bottom. Engraving of Mayor J.F. Hylan, the Menu, list of Speakers, Mayor's Committee on Receptions to Distinguished Guests, and list of members of the American Olympic Committee. Cover marginal water stains, lt. foxing, contents EF. (\$375)
191. **Victorious American Olympic Team Dinner Seating List. Waldorf-Astoria Hotel, October 2, 1920.** 9pp., 18x26cm (7.1"x10.2"). Creased, traces of mounting on back. VF. (\$150)
192. **(Swedish Report) Bergvall, Erik. The Olympic Games in Antwerp 1920.** Boards and half linen, goldstamped, 36x28.5cm (14.2"x11.2"). - c196. **Silver Second Place Winners Medal.** Silver, 55mm, by Raoul Bénard. Victorious athlete holding skates and skis, Alps in background. Rev. French legend in 14 lines. Traces of goldplating? Very rare winner's medal of the first Olympic Winter Games. EF. (\$35,000)
- c197. **Participation Medal and Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 55mm, by R. Bénard. Victorious athlete holding skates and skis, Alps in background. Rev. French legend in 14 lines. *First participation and winner's medal of Winter Olympic games. The only time that the participation medal was the same as the bronze winner's medal. There were only 258 participants in Chamonix.* EF. (\$18,000)
198. **(Program) VIII<sup>e</sup> Olympiade. Sports d'Hiver 1923-24, Chamonix-Mont-Blanc.** 36pp. illustrated, 13.2x21.5cm (5.2"x8.5"), in French. Includes the complete program of the first Winter Olympic Games by day and hour; venues, hotels, etc. Cover sunned around borders, VF-EF. (\$1,250)
199. **(Brochure) The Traveller in France. Issued by French Tourist Office in London, January 1924.** 8pp., 15.2x24.5cm (6"x9.6"), in English. Includes on cover and page 2 mention of the 8<sup>th</sup> Olympic Games in Chamonix, February 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 with events, plus Olympic reception on February 7 and 9. EF. (\$300)

- c200. **Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 55mm, by A. Rivaud. Legend surrounded by sports equipment. Rev. Winner helping fallen athlete back on his feet. Toned EF. (\$6,750)
201. **Participation Medal.** Bronze, 55mm, by R. Bénard. City view over French legend in three lines. Rev. Victory with laurel wreaths crowning victorious athletes. EF/VF, scr. on rev. (\$250)
202. **30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Restoration of the Olympic Games, 1924.** Bronze, 50mm. Oak and olive branches with panel and date June 23, 1924. Rev. 7-line French legend of the assembled nations during the Olympic Games celebrating the anniversary. EF, spot on rev. (\$750)
- c203. **"The Winner" Art Plaque Entered in the Paris 1924 Art Competition.** Bronze, 24x15.5cm (9.4"x6.1"), by Henry Dropsy. Nude ancient Greek Olympic champion walking to the right, head left, holding olive branch of winner and statue of Nike, goddess of victory. *Dropsy entered the plaque in the Art Competition.* Official report p. 610. EF. (\$1,750)

204. **"Nike, Goddess of Victory" Art Medal (1924).** Bronze, 10cm (3.9"), 474 grams (16 ¾ oz.), by P.M. Dammann. Raised head of Nike r., olive sprig in hair, surrounded by Paris Olympic event equipment, rugby ball, bow and arrow, etc. Rev. Nude Ancient Greek Olympic winner looking right and holding statue of Victory, Parthenon in background. Stunning art medal by famous French Art Deco artist. EF. (\$750)
205. **Pair of Fencing Medals. Belgian Bronze Medal Winner in Fencing, Maurice van Damme, Recognition Medal by Belgian Fencing Federation, 1924.** Goldplated bronze, 39x65mm, by J. Deckeybaz. Female extending laurel wreath. Rev. Legend over laurel branch. Looped, EF. Plus Souvenir Medal for A.M. van Damme for his participation in Fencing Gala in Bruges, 1924. Silvered bronze, 50mm. Fencer in laurel wreath. Rev. Lion on inscribed panel. VF+. (2 pcs.) (\$400)
206. **Paavo Nurmi Recognition Medal by Finnish-American Athletic Club (1920's).** Goldplated bronze, 33x36mm uniface, by Dieges & Clust. Multi-gold medal winner Nurmi r. between Finnish and American shield and open laurel wreath. EF. (\$125)
- c207. **The Olympic Winner's Vase.** Sèvres porcelain, 33.3cm (13.1"), tall, designed by talented artist M.O. Guillonet and executed by Bracquemond at the world famous porcelain factory of Sèvres. Golden laurel branches are handpainted on French blue background, the medallions depicting **Boxing, Shot Put, Wrestling and Javelin**, on gray background with green border. Official report p. 804. *The vases were made in several versions to accommodate all Olympic events. They were presented by the Paris City Council to gold medal winners.* EF. Very rare and beautiful. (\$15,000)

208. **Salute to the Paris Games Plate.** Bronze, 13x8cm (5.1"x3.1"). Athlete saluting over athletic event in Paris Olympic Colombes stadium, "Paris-1924" below, laurel branches on sides. EF. (\$250)
209. **Set of Six Olympic Silver Spoons.** Silver, hallmarked, 14.9cm (5.9") long. Handle shows the Olympic winner with raised right arm and palm branch, "Le Salut" below, by artist Becker. Rev. "VII<sup>ème</sup> Olympiade-Paris 1924", Olympic rings and Olympic motto in center. Ornate handle. All EF, housed in leatherette case with gold decor, lt. scuffing. A very ornate and rare set. (\$425)
210. **German Swimming Olympiad in Magdeburg, 1924. Tile for Outstanding Achievement.** Plaster, 12cm (4.7"). Magdeburg coat of arms above 6-line German legend. *Germany was not invited to the Paris 1924 Games. Some cities held their own "Olympic" Games.* VF. (\$175)
211. **Identity Card of George de Relwyskoff, Great Britain Official, Wrestling Champion in London 1908.** Multicolor, 8x12 cm (3.2"x4.7"). With photo and signature. Fine – VF. (\$175)
212. **Official Program, Athletics, July 13, 1924, Reunion 51.** 15pp., 21.8x27cm (8.6"x10.6"), in French. **Marathon** won by A. Stenroos, Finland; **Discus** won by Houser, USA; 10,000 Meter Walk won by Frigerio, Italy; 4x400-Meter Relay won by U.S. team. Includes complete list of athletics participants. VF+. (\$375)

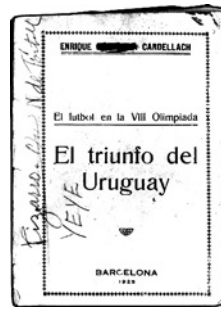

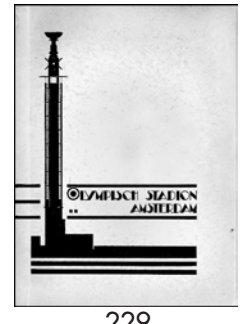

220. **Olympic Winner Art Medal.** Bronze, 60mm. Nude athlete with laurel branch walking left towards "1928". Rev. "Olympic Games Amsterdam" (translated) over rings flanked by branches. EF. **(\$200)**
- c221. **Japanese Team Pin.** Multicolor enamel, 21mm. EF. Extremely rare. **(Minimum \$3,000)**
222. **Commemorative Amsterdam Olympiad with City Shield Pin.** Bronze, 17mm, enameled in white, black and red. EF. **(\$150)**
- c223. **Commemorative Events Porcelain Plate.** Multicolor, 25cm (9.8"), made by Soci t  C ramique, Maastricht. Supported Amsterdam city shield in circle of six events: soccer, rowing, running, swimming, cycling, and tennis. EF. **(\$350)**
