**ATLANTA, 26th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1996**

437. **Official Centennial Torch.** Silvered aluminum and wood, 55cm (21.65"). Names of all 23 Olympic cities from 1896 to 1996 inscribed on torch. *The Hellenic Olympic Committee celebrated the 100th Anniversary of the 1896 Olympic Games in the Panathenean Stadium in Athens on April 6, 1996. Part of this celebration was the re-enactment of the 1896 Games. Olympic medalists and representatives of all cities who had hosted the Olympic Games since 1896 took part in the torch run within the stadium. Afterwards, they took the torches back to their Olympic cities for a ceremony.* EF. **(\$4,000)**
438. **Official Torch.** Aluminum and Georgia pecan wood, 80cm (31.5"), designed by Peter Mastrogiannis. 22 reeds represent the cities where Olympic Games were held since 1896. Gathered by 2 goldplated brass bands, the top band displays the Atlanta torch logo and the quilt of leaves design, the bottom band lists all Olympic cities since 1896. The wooden pecan handle represents the connection of the flame between heaven and earth. *The flame was lit in Olympia. It reached Los Angeles on April 27 and ended 84 days later in Atlanta, carried by 10,000 relay runners, horses, bicycles, trains, ships, and hydroplanes.* EF. **(\$2,500)**
439. **Cased Paralympic Gold First Place Winner's Medal.** Goldplated, 82mm (3.2"). Paralympic Atlanta 1996 logo and legend. Rev. Braille legend over Paralympic logo. Looped, with blue ribbon. In green cardboard presentation box with green velvet inside. EF. **(\$1,750)**
440. **Large Wooden "Atlanta 1996 Spirit of Delta" Airplane Model.** Color paint, 45.5cm (17.9") long, 47cm (18.5") wide, handmade in the Philippines by M.V.MFG. Airplane of the official airline of the 1996 Olympic Games, with logo of the Games. On detachable wooden stand with Delta Airlines logo. A few paint chips, small clip on left wing, VF-EF. Rare. **(\$400)**
441. **(Autograph) Framed Embossed Atlanta 1996 Logo.** Signed by Organizing Committee President Billy Payne. Logo 22.5x25cm (8.9"x9.8"), framed and glazed. EF. **(\$125)**

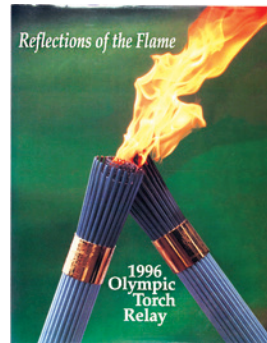

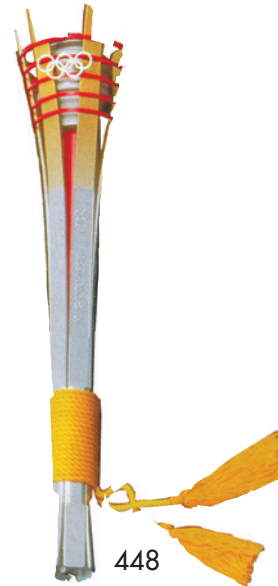

442. **The Swatch Centennial Olympic Games Collection: Olympic Legends. Group of Nine Swatch Watches Commemorating Gold Medal Winners:** Said Aquita, Athletics, Morocco; Gelindo Bordin, Marathon, Italy; Sebastian Coe, Athletics, Great Britain; Nadia Comaneci, Gymnastics, Romania; Dan Jansen, Speedskating, USA; Edwin Moses, Athletics, USA; Mark Spitz, Swimming, USA; Daley Thompson, Athletics, Great Britain; and Katarina Witt, Figure Skating, Germany. With explanatory brochure on each gold medal winner. Housed in triangular folded box, 23.7cm (9.3") each side, 36cm (14.2") high. EF. **(\$450)**
443. **Official Logo Copper Hand Enameled Box.** Green side, 60mm, 30mm high, by Crummies, England. *IOC Present for IOC members and other distinguished persons.* Boxed with brochure. EF. **(\$150)**
444. **Large Commemorative Toy Car Carrier.** 42.5cm (16.7") long. Addition of batteries will activate lights and horn. Atlanta logo and mascot on sides. In original box. EF. **(\$75)**
445. **(Photo) Muhammad Ali at the Lighting of the Olympic Cauldron Ceremony in Atlanta 1996.** Multicolor, 20.2x25.5cm (8"x10"). EF. **(\$100)**
446. **(Autographs) Nadia Comaneci and Bart Conner Signatures on Color Card.** 10.8x13.8cm (4.3 x5.4"). *Nadia won gymnastics gold in Montreal 1976 at the age of 14, the first gymnast in Olympic history to obtain a perfect 10. Bart Conner won 2 gold medals in gymnastics in Los Angeles 1984. They are now a married couple.* Framed (24x26.5cm) and glazed. EF. **(\$100)**

447. **(Book) Reflections of the Flame - 1996 Olympic Torch Relay.** 128pp. profusely illustrated in color, 23.5x31cm (9.3"x12.2"). Daily report on the relay through the United States. With dust jacket. EF. **(\$175)**

#### NAGANO, 18th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1998

448. **Official Torch.** Aluminum, partially gilt, 55cm (21.7") long. Designed after ancient Japanese torches called Taimatsu. It shows the Nagano emblem and sports pictograms, and a brightly colored orange cord wrapped around the lower part forms the grip. Fueled with clean burning propane, it burnt for about 20 minutes. *The torch relay in Japan took place from January 6 until February 7, when the Olympic fire was lit during the opening ceremony.* Choice EF, in original cardboard box. **(\$6,000)**
449. **Presentation Small Size Cased Torch.** Aluminum, partially gilt, 27.7cm (10.9"). Designed after ancient Japanese torches called Taimatsu. It shows the Nagano emblem and sports pictograms, and a brightly colored orange cord wrapped around the lower part forms the grip. Only a very small number of these torches were made for presentation to high dignitaries. Torch is housed in a wooden case lined with green velvet. Brass plate commemorating the torch run Jan. 6 - Feb. 6, 1998. EF. Very rare. **(\$2,500)**
450. **Rare Kirin Ski Jumper Noritake Bone China Beer Stein.** 16cm (6.3") high, 14cm (5.5") wide, designed by Shigeo Fukuda. The handle is formed by a gold ski jumper, color logo surrounded by silver snowflakes. In original box. EF. Rare. **(\$225)**



451. **Official Torch.** Three layers consisting of polished stainless steel, anodized aluminum and coated aluminum, 77cm (30.5”), designed by Blue Sky Design, Sydney, manufactured by G.A. & L. Harrington. The three layers represent earth, fire and water. EF. (\$4,000)
452. **Official Commemorative Torch in Original Wooden, Glazed Wall Case.** Officially sanctioned by the IOC to be sold in a limited number to the public. Center part open to show burning unit inside. Mounted with descriptive background, 53x86cm (21”x34”). EF. (\$2,500)
453. **Swiss Team Pin Set.** 16 multicolor enameled pins for different events, 29x25mm. Unc., cased. (16 pins) (\$150)
454. **Trio of Swiss Participant’s Pins from Sydney 2000, Torino 2006 and Vancouver 2010.** Multicolor enamel, 27x34mm. All EF. (3 pcs.) (\$100)
455. **Large “American Olympic Team 2000” Beer Stein.** Multicolor ceramic, 25cm (10”), made by Ceramarte for Anheuser-Busch. Basketball, Soccer, Athletics, Baseball, Cycling etc. in raised design between flags of participating nations. Numbered. EF. Attractive. EF. (\$150)

456. **Official Torch.** Silver colored metal and glass, 83.8cm (33”) long. Shaped like a fiery icicle in motion, the polished silver colored bottom bears the motto “Light the fire within”; center metal and glass top section in “frozen flame” texture with logo on metal part. Used in the torch relay, glass blackened at top (may be wiped clean). EF. (\$3,000)

457. **Radio-Television Broadcaster Bib for February 13.** Lavender, orange and white with black writing of date. EF. (\$100)
458. **(Autographs) Romanian Four-Man Bobsled Team Signed T-Shirt.** Photo of team members under Olympic rings and signatures, “Romania” on back. XL size. EF. (\$125)
459. **Official Torch of the 14th Asian Games in Busan, Korea, 2002.** Aluminum, 60cm (23.6”), made by EOS Design. The shape of the torch is designed after an earthen vessel of the Korean “Kaya” dynasty (AC 300). EF. (\$1,250)
- ATHENS, 28th OLYMPIC GAMES, 2004**
460. **Official Torch.** Silver colored metal and olive wood, 68cm (26.8”) long. The torch resembles an olive leaf, and the design wants to express “Pan Metron Ariston” (All things in moderation, translated from Greek). A simple and beautiful design. In original cardboard box, EF. (\$2,750)
461. **Cast Bronze Wreath in the Style of Ancient Olympia’s Winners Wreaths.** 26x23.5cm (10.2”x9.3”). Two crossed olive branches forming an open wreath, mounted on base. EF. (\$250)
462. **Bronze Sculpture of a Young Boy Playing Baseball.** 114cm (45”), by Jim Davidson. Player at base, ready to hit the ball. From a U.S. sports museum. EF. (\$950)
463. **Little Boy Playing Golf Wearing His Father’s Shoes on the Wrong Feet.** Bronze sculpture, 114cm (45”), signed by Jim Davidson. Little boy ready to swing the club, standing on base, 40.5cm (16”) wide. From a U.S. sports museum. EF. (\$950)



**TORINO, 20th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 2006**

464. **Official Torch.** Blue techno-polymer-coated aluminum, 77cm (30.3”) long, made by Pininfarina. *The fire was lit in Olympia on November 27, 2005, and arrived in Rome on December 8. Until February 10 the torch traveled over 11,300 km across Italy, also France, Switzerland and Slovenia. Used in the torch relay with light darkening around upper part (may be wiped off).* EF. (\$2,250)
465. **Custom Stand for the Torino 2006 Torch.** Plexiglass, 17x12.5cm (6.7”x6.9”), 38cm (15”) high. Mountains and skier over large logo and motto “Passion lives here”. EF. (\$175)
466. **Boxed Silver Participation Medal.** Silvered bronze, 39mm. Logo. Rev. Olympic rings over motto. With circular cardboard, within clear round box. EF. (\$300)
467. **Cased Bronze Participation Medal.** Bronze, 39mm. Rev. Olympic rings over motto. With circular cardboard, within clear round plastic case. EF. (\$300)
468. **Radio-Television Bib.** Green and yellow polyester, green number. Plus Torino 2006 Bib. Dark and light blue polyester. Both EF. (2 pcs.) EF. (\$150)

**BEIJING, 29th OLYMPIC GAMES, 2008**

469. **Official Torch.** Red and anodized aluminum, 72cm (18.4”) long. Curved form in the shape of a paper scroll, with lucky clouds graphic expressing harmony. *The torch relay started in Olympia, Greece, on March 24, traveled to over 100 cities on five continents and all of China, a distance of 137,000 km.* EF. (\$5,500)
470. **120th IOC Session in Beijing, 2008. Guest of the IOC Badge.** 32x32mm. With blue-white-blue ribbon. EF. (\$125)
471. **NBC Beijing 2008 Large Fazzino Pin.** Color enameled, three-dimensional, 9x9cm (3.5”x3.5”), by Charles Fazzino in a limited, numbered edition. Temple of Heaven and the Great Wall, dragon below. Housed in aluminum box, with stand and certificate. EF. (\$100)

472. **Commemorative China Red Yingxiang Porcelain Vase with Beijing Logo and Temple of Heaven.** High white jade porcelain, 29cm (11.4”) high, 13.2cm (5.2”) wide, made by Porcelain Mao Work. Temple of Heaven between clouds, Beijing 2008 logo above, both in gold, Beijing Organizing Committee legend on bottom. With heavy wood-like stand. Housed in large textile-covered case lined in yellow cloth. With certificate. EF. (\$200)
473. **Very Large Metal Model of the Bird’s Nest Olympic Stadium.** Goldplated steel, on wooden plate 52.5x30.5cm (20.7”x12”). Three-dimensional view of the National Stadium with removeable top, and surrounding area. With nameplate made of the Birds Nest’s steel. EF. (\$450)
474. **121st IOC Session in Copenhagen, 2009. Guest of the IOC Badge.** 33x33mm. With white-blue-white ribbon. EF. (\$125)
475. **Official Singapore 2009 Asian Youth Games Torch.** Light gray and red metal, 58.5cm (23”). Color logo and name of the Youth Games above group of red stars. Lt. wear in gray paint, o.w. EF. (\$1,250)

**VANCOUVER, 21st OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 2010**

476. **Official Torch.** Stainless steel, aluminum and sheet molding compound, 94.5cm (37.1”), made by Bombardier. The lines of the torch reflect the lines made by snow and ice winter sports. It shows the engraved motto “With Glowing Hearts / Des plus brilliants exploits” and the logo. *The torch relay ended after its 45000 km journey through Canada with the lighting of the Olympic flame cauldron at the opening ceremony on February 12, 2010.* EF. (\$2,250)
