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TERMS OF SALE
(Please read carefully before bidding.)

The auction will be conducted in accordance with the terms set forth below. Bidding in the sale constitutes acceptance of all terms stated herein.

(1) **BIDDING. Bids by phone, fax, e-mail and mail will be accepted until 11 p.m. Pacific Standard Time, on Saturday, November 26, 2016.** All e-mail bids will be acknowledged. E-mail bids which have not been acknowledged have not been received. Phone bids must be confirmed in writing upon request. Auctioneer reserves the right to extend bidding. Lots will be sold to the highest bidder. In the case of tie bids, the first bid received will normally be given preference. Auctioneer has sole discretion to make the determination of the winning bid.

Value estimates are for guidance only. Bids higher than estimate will be reduced to 10% above the second highest bid. **Bids under estimate will not be accepted.** Bids must be for an entire lot. Bids will be accepted by lot number only. Each lot constitutes a separate sale.

(2) **MODIFICATION.** The catalog is incorporated in and deemed a part of these Terms of Sale. Auctioneer has the absolute right to modify the terms of sale at any time. Bidding after notification of modification constitutes acceptance of modification. Auctioneer has the absolute right to conduct the auction as auctioneer may decide, including the right to decline bids for any reason and from any person, to decline challenges to bids or bidding increments and to make the final determination of all disputes by any method auctioneer deems appropriate. No bidder shall have a claim or recourse against auctioneer for loss or damage due to modification, auctioneer mistake, departure from stated terms of sale, method of dispute resolution or result thereof.

(3) **GUARANTY. By bidding in the sale, bidder accepts all terms stated herein and personally guarantees timely and complete payment and performance of all obligations stated herein.** Auctioneer is not responsible for bidding errors. Successful bidders are unconditionally bound to perform all obligations hereunder regardless of mistake. Bidding by minors and undisclosed agents is prohibited. Bidding constitutes a representation and warranty that bidder is of legal age and acting on his or her own behalf with full power and authority to make the bid placed and to legally bind bidder to all terms of sale.

(4) **PRICE. Payment in full is due upon receipt of invoice.** A 15% Buyer's Fee will be added to the successful bid price of each lot. Handling, shipping, sales tax for California residents, insurance, and all other costs associated with shipping will be added to the invoice. A \$1 handling charge per lot may be added to bulky lots (books, large plates, sculptures, etc.) California sales tax will be added to the invoice of California residents unless a valid resale number is on file with the auctioneer; however, buyer is solely responsible for and agrees to pay all sales or other applicable tax due by virtue of the sale and shall indemnify and hold auctioneer harmless therefore, including penalties or interest assessed, regardless of whether or not taxes were included on the invoice or correctly calculated by the auctioneer.

(5) **PAYMENT.** Payment must be in U.S. funds payable by check drawn on a U.S. bank or by wire transfer to auctioneer's account, by credit card (Visa, MasterCard, American Express and Discover) or Paypal. Wiring instructions should be requested from auctioneer before funds are wired. A 3.5% convenience charge (4% for overseas purchases) will be added to credit card or Paypal purchases except where prohibited by law. Bidders may be asked for satisfactory credit references or a deposit of funds prior to bidding.

(6) **DEFAULT.** If buyer fails to make payment in full within 30 days of the invoice date or to timely comply with any other term of sale, then, in addition to all other remedies available at law or in equity, auctioneer may, at auctioneer's option: (a) charge 1.5% monthly interest on unpaid amounts; (b) if payment is not received in a timely manner, auctioneer may resell the lot(s) and recover from buyer the difference between the proceeds and buyer's indebtedness in excess of the proceeds, which indebtedness shall include the successful bid price, Buyer's Fee and all other expenses incurred by auctioneer from the date of sale until resale on accounts of such lot(s), including attorney fees, transportation, handling, storage, insurance, collection and resale costs. Proceeds collected in excess of buyer's indebtedness shall belong to auctioneer; (c) pursue collection efforts and/or recover from buyer all costs incurred by auctioneer as a result of buyer's default from date of default, including attorney fees, transportation, handling, storage and insurance costs; and (d) sue for damages. Amounts charged hereunder are immediately due and payable. Buyer waives all requirements of notice, advertisement, bidding rights, rights to proceeds and all other rights with respect to the sale of a lot purchased by buyer except as prohibited by law. Auctioneer's rights and remedies stated in this section and elsewhere in this agreement are cumulative and the exercise of one shall not operate to the exclusion of another.

(7) SHIPMENT. It is buyer's responsibility to contact auctioneer to make shipping arrangements. Failure to timely make shipping arrangements or to accept delivery constitutes default. Lots will be delivered to buyer's address on file with auctioneer, unless otherwise requested, after payment in full and funds have cleared. Lots will be packaged, insured and shipped as auctioneer deems appropriate unless otherwise requested; however, auctioneer may charge additional handling, shipping and insurance fees or decline to package and/or ship any item. Buyer is responsible for packaging and/or shipping any purchased lot(s) at auctioneer's request within 30 days of the request. Risk of loss and title pass at delivery of lot to place of shipment, if shipped by auctioneer, and at time of payment in full at place of pick-up, if shipped by buyer. **Custom duties for an overseas buyer are buyer's sole responsibility.** Overseas buyers must supply fully detailed shipping instructions prior to shipment. Lots will be shipped overseas at buyer's risk only. Buyer waives all claims against auctioneer for loss or damage as a result of delayed shipment or failure to ship any item. Auctioneer's breach in the delivery of any item shall not give buyer the right to refuse or receive any other shipment.

(8) AS-IS SALE; LIMITED WARRANTY. Catalog descriptions are provided solely for convenience and are not a warranty of any kind. This is not an approval sale. Goods are offered for sale on an "AS IS" basis without warranty of any kind except as expressly provided below. Catalog errors should be brought promptly to auctioneer's attention. In the case of photo error, only the text is valid.

All items sold are guaranteed to the original buyer to be authentic (unless otherwise stated). **AUCTIONEER MAKES NO OTHER WARRANTIES OF ANY KIND, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, AND SPECIFICALLY EXCLUDES ANY WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY OR FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE. THIS WARRANTY IS GIVEN SOLELY TO THE ORIGINAL BUYER AND IS NON-TRANSFERABLE AND NO OTHER PERSON SHALL HAVE ANY RIGHTS UNDER SUCH WARRANTY.**

(9) CLAIMS. The sole basis for a claim against auctioneer is the lack of authenticity of a purchased item. Buyer is solely responsible for determining authenticity without reliance on statements or acts of auctioneer. Authenticity claims must be made in writing and submitted to auctioneer no later than 5 days after delivery of such item. Authenticity claims are not permitted outside of warranty period except as may be permitted by auctioneer. Acceptance of a claim does not constitute an admission. If auctioneer disputes a claim, the final determination of authenticity shall be made by a qualified authenticator selected by buyer and auctioneer. Costs of authentication will be borne by buyer. If a claim is accepted or an item determined to be not authentic, buyer's exclusive remedy is a refund of the successful bid price and Buyer's Fee, payable upon delivery of the item to auctioneer in accordance with the conditions of return set forth below, except as may otherwise be agreed by auctioneer and buyer in writing.

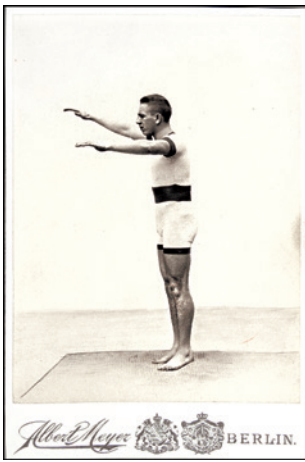


Complete Collection of Olympic Summer Torches



1. **Exceptional Collection of All Olympic Summer Games Torches from Berlin 1936 Through Rio 2016.** Berlin 1936, London 1948, Helsinki 1952 (20), Melbourne 1956, Rome 1960, Tokyo 1964, Mexico City 1968, Munich 1972, Montreal 1976, Moscow 1980, Los Angeles 1984, Seoul 1988, Barcelona 1992, The Centennial Torch 1996, Atlanta 1996, Sydney 2000, Athens 2004, Beijing 2008, London 2012 and Rio 2016. It is almost impossible to find an original 1952 Helsinki torch nowadays as most are in museums or collections, and the last Helsinki torch sold for around \$800,000. During IOC President J. Rogge's time, he gave permission to have

five Helsinki torches 1952 remade by the original manufacturer of the Helsinki torches in Finland. Permission was also granted by the then Finnish IOC member. The torch, made of hallmarked sterling silver and birchwood, exactly the same as the original 1952 torch; 60cm (23.6") high. The initials of the IOC President and the Finnish IOC member are engraved on the bottom silver part of the torch. The group of summer torches offered represents an outstanding opportunity for a collector or an institution. All EF. (20 torches) **(\$225,000)**



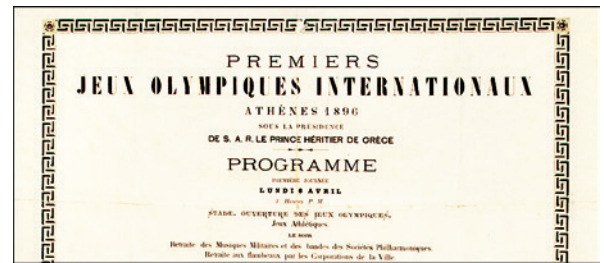
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2. **Athens 1896. Group of 16 Platinotype Photos by Albert Meyer, Berlin.** 14 photos are 21.4x13.6cm (8.4"x5.4"), and one 10.6x16.6cm (4.2"x6.5"), all pasted on stiff boards with silver embossed name and shields of Saxony and Saxony-Meiningen where Meyer was the Court Photographer. Reverse shows the medals he won for his photography. Meyer was one of only seven photographers accredited in Athens 1896, and only about 100 photos taken by all seven photographers are known today. Volker Kluge published "The Pictures of the First Olympiad" in Berlin, 1996, and 16 of the photos shown in the book are included in this lot, with the page numbers shown in brackets below. 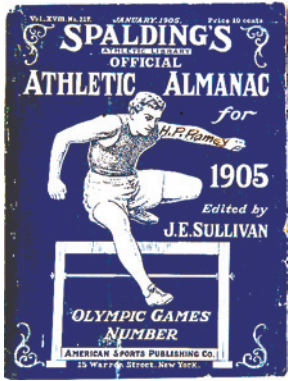

Athens 1896. Official Program of the First International Olympic Games in Athens 1896. Large size, 39.5x57.5cm (15.6x22.6"), in French. Printed by P.D. Sakellarios, Athens, by order of S.A.R. the Prince Hereditary, and Timoleon Philimon, Secretary General. From April 6, Opening Ceremony and Athletics, to April 14, Closing of the Games and Proclamation of the Winners. *The program was only printed in Greek and French.* VF, creased, a few tears, small paper loss at bottom not affecting text, tape stains. Framed and glazed (program may be taken out). Extremely rare. (\$5,750)



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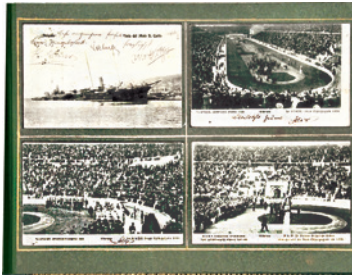
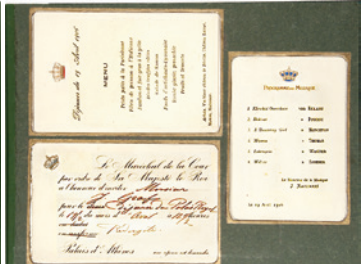
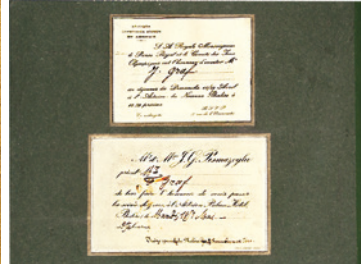
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3. **St. Louis 1904. Participation Medal.** Bronze, 40x40mm, made by Dieges & Clust, New York. Nude athlete striding r., laurel branch in hand. Rev. Legend in eleven lines, shields of St. Louis, France and U.S.A. between ivy leaves. Looped. EF. Very rare. **(\$18,000)**
4. **St. Louis 1904. (Official Report) Spalding's Official Athletic Almanac for 1905, Edited by J.E. Sullivan. Olympic Games Number Containing the Official Report of the Olympic Games of 1904.** New York, 1905. 290pp. profusely illustrated, with photos of all Olympic events, 13x17cm (5.1"x6.7"), plus 26pp. of advertisements for athletic equipment. Includes all Olympic events May to November 1904, summary of Olympic events, IOC Session in London 1904 and Rome awarded the 1908 Olympic Games. Original blue and white cover, VF, spine partially missing, long tear in back cover, contents EF. **(\$4,250)**
5. **Athens 1906. Extraordinary Album of the Olympic Games in Athens 1906.** Prepared by Austrian Swimming Coach (of Gold Medalist Otto Scheff) and Journalist Felix Graf. Custom-made black leather covers with gold stamped legend containing 30 pages of thick green boards with gold-stamped stars on side, 32x24cm (12.6"x9.5"). Large photo of about 50 dignitaries (Athens 1906

IOC Session?), 3 Athens 1906 extremely rare cardboard badges and an Austrian team 1906 badge, a personal Identity card in French and Greek, 3 stamps, 5 invitations in Phaleron, venue of the Swimming events, and to the Royal Palace, 18 postcards, 8 of them of the 1906 Games in the Stadium, a postcard with 6 signatures including gold medalist Otto Scheff, and Viennese newspaper clippings on 19 pages of the reports Felix Graf sent to Vienna to the "Neue Freie Presse" (4pp.), and to the "Allgemeine Sport-Zeitung" (15pp). These 15pp. contain a complete report on the 1906 Games by day, with detailed results of all events on all days. The 3 cardboard badges are extremely rare. They were previously thought to be from the Athens 1896 Games, as we know of named, signed and dated 1896 cardboard badges. These 3 badges are without a date, and since Felix Graf tried to preserve his 1906 mementos he included them in this album. (A round cardboard badge recently sold for 37,000 Euros). Felix Graf, besides being a coach, was a historian who kept the Athens 1906 Games alive in this beautiful album. The album is housed in a custom-made cardboard box. Album EF. Unique. **(\$35,000)**



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- 6. **London 1908. Organizing Committee Badge.** Silvered, partially blue enamel, 57mm. Elbel S-8. EF. Scarce. (\$4,250)
- 7. **Stockholm 1912. Gold First Place Winner's Medal Awarded to Nils Granfelt, a Member of the Swedish System Gymnastics Team from Sweden.** Goldplated silver, 33mm, by Erik Lindberg and Bertram MacKenna, struck by Sporrng & Co. Herald proclaiming Olympic Games, bust of Ling on pedestal at r. Rev. Victorious athlete being crowned by two seated females. Housed in brown leather presentation case, goldstamped logo and inscription on top, lined in blue velvet and white silk. Plus a **Granberg's postcard** showing the Swedish Gymnastics Team in the stadium (#133). Nils Granfelt (1887-1959), a gymnast, became a banker, then, for 7 years, a teacher at the Military Institution in Lexington, Virginia, USA. *We seldom know the name of the winner of medals before 1960, and it always enhances a medal for collectors.* EF. (2 pcs.) (\$8,750)
- 8. **Stockholm 1912. IOC Badge.** Goldplated silver, 39x45mm, made by Sporrng, Stockholm. Bust of ancient Greek athlete facing within oak wreath, over plaque with three Swedish crowns inscribed with Olympic Games Stockholm 1912 legend. Elbel S-2. EF. A beautiful and very rare badge. (\$9,750)
- 9. **Stockholm 1912. German Interpreter Badge.** Goldplated, black-white-red enamel, 25x30mm. The German Imperial flag with "Olympic Games 1912" legend in Swedish. Elbel S-14. EF. Rare. (\$2,500)

- 10. **Antwerp 1920. "Victory" Sculpture Awarded to Gold Medal Winners in Single Events.** Cast bronze, 37cm (14.6") high, on marble base, by M. Grandmoulin. Victorious athlete, arm raised, holding laurel wreath, standing on base inscribed "Victoire!" and signed by the artist with date "1920". Mounted on round marble base, square bronze plaque below with "VII OLYMPIADE ANVERS 1920". *Only in Antwerp 1920 and Paris 1924 did first place winners receive a trophy in addition to their medals.* Extremely rare and attractive. (\$12,500)
- 11. **Antwerp 1920. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded to Hubert Lafortune, Member of the Belgian Gymnastics Team.** Silver, 60mm, by Joshua Dupont. Nude victorious athlete with palm branch and laurel wreath, fame blowing horn. Rev. View of Antwerp, name of winner engraved in field. *It is not often that we can attribute a medal before 1960 to a winner as they were not inscribed with a name or a sport.* Polished, EF. (\$7,500)
- 12. **Antwerp 1920. Official Report in French Language.** 178pp. plus forward, bound in red leatherette and boards, 21x27cm (8.3"x10.6"). *The report, only written in French, was type written by Verdyk in the 1920's, and this original report is in the IOC Library. Supposedly, only a few type-written reports were made. There was no money left after the Games to print a report. The current report shows punchholes, and is probably one of the few reports authorized by the Belgian Olympic Committee in 1958.* Cover VF-EF, contents EF. Extremely rare, and a key report in the official report series. (\$12,500)



13. **Paris 1924. The Olympic Gold Medal Winner Presentation Vase for Soccer, Rowing, Rugby and Diving.** Sèvres porcelain, 33.3cm (13.1”), designed by talented artist M.O. Guillonet and executed by Bracquemond at the world-famous porcelain factory of Sèvres. Golden laurel branches are handpainted on French blue background, the medallions depicting **Soccer, Rowing, Rugby and Diving** on gray background with green border. Official report p. 804. *The vases were made in several versions to accommodate all Olympic events.* EF. Very rare and beautiful. **(\$17,500)**
- 13a. **Paris 1924. Bronze Sculpture of “The Victorious Athlete” (“L’Athlète Vainqueur”) Wearing an Olympic Winner’s Olive Wreath, 1924.** Bronze, total height 68cm (26.8”), on black marble pedestal, by Belgian sculptor Pierre de Soete (1886 - 1948) an artist of the Academy in Brussels. Signed and dated 1924 in the back. Bust of winner facing half left, proudly wearing the olive wreath. *Made in 1924 for the Olympic Games.* EF. Impressive sculpture. **(\$5,000)**
14. **Paris 1924. International Sports Federation Official’s Badge.** Bronze, white enamel, 34x42mm. With red ribbon inscribed in gold (partially faint) “FEDERATION INTERNATIONALE”. Elbel S-3. EF. Rare. **(\$3,500)**
15. **Lake Placid 1932 Winter. Boxed Participation Medal.** Bronze, 48x60mm, by Julio Kilenyi. Winged figure of Fame blowing horn, Olympic rings above, winter landscape in background. Rev. Six winter sports depicted on shields around legend in six lines, scenes of curling and dogsledding below. EF. In very rare cardboard presentation box. **(\$11,000)**

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23. **Oslo 1952 Winter. Official Torch.** Silver colored alloy of brass and steel, 22cm (8.7") high, 32x15.5cm (12.6"x6.1") wide, designed by Geir Grung and Adolf Thoresen. On the oval top are the Olympic rings and "1952", also "Morgedahl" pointing with an arrow to "Oslo". Name of Ragnar Navelsaker and Date, February 13, 1952, engraved on bowl when he carried the torch. *Cauldrons were burning already in Garmisch-Partenkirchen 1936 and St. Moritz 1948 but Oslo staged the first torch relay of the Olympic Winter Games. A fire was lit on February 13 in the birthplace of 19th century legend Søndre Norheim (1825-1897), considered the father of skiing in Norway, in Morgedahl, Telemark. 94 skiers carried the flame for 225km through Kongsberg, Drammen, the Huseby Hill at Oraker where skiing competitions had been held since 1879, to Oslo where it arrived on February 15 for the Opening Ceremony in Bislett Stadium. The last torchbearer was Eigil Nansen, grandson of the Norwegian Polar explorer Fridtjof Nansen.* EF, lt. discoloration around top opening from the flame, o.w. EF. Rare and important torch of about 100 of the First Winter Olympic Torch Relay. (\$65,000)

24. **Helsinki 1952. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 50mm, by G. Cassioli. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant teammates. Toned EF. (\$7,500)
25. **Cortina 1956 Winter. Official Torch with Original Burning Unit.** Aluminum, 47cm (18.5") long. "VII° GIOCHI OLIMPICI INVERNALI CORTINA 1956" legend cut-out Olympic rings at top. With original waxed burning unit. *The flame was lit at the Temple of Jupiter in Rome on January 22, 1956, and flown to Venice. The torch relay from there went to Cortina, where the fire was lit in the stadium at the opening ceremony on January 26 by Guido Caroli.* Abt. EF. Very rarely seen with burning unit. (\$23,000)
26. **Melbourne 1956. Bronze Third Place Winners Medal.** Bronze, 50mm, by G. Cassioli. Victory seated about Colosseum Stadium. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant teammates. Toned. EF. (\$7,000)

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27. **Rome 1960. Gold First Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Canoeing, Combined East and West German Team.** Goldplated silver within bronze olive wreath, 68mm, by G. Cassioli. Victory seated above colosseum in Rome. Rev. Victorious athlete carried by jubilant teammates, "CANOA" (Canoeing, translated) on wreath panel below. With chain of 20 bronze olive leaves and olives. Paul Lange was the West German recipient of the gold medal in the Kayak Singles Relay 4x500 Meters. Upon his triumphant return to his hometown Oberhausen, he received a cased honorary city gold medal (2 photos included), plus the cased silver laurel leaf, 11cm (4.3"), of the German President Heinrich Lübke, a framed diploma of the West German NOC signed by v. Halt, a framed Third Place Diploma of the World Canoeing Championship 1958 in Prague, plus the IOC Rome 1960 participant's pin in wallet. All EF.
