

Bids by Email, Phone, Mail and Fax accepted

(Please read carefully before bidding.)

The auction will be conducted in accordance with the terms set forth below. Bidding in the sale constitutes acceptance of all terms stated herein.

(1) Bidding. The auction will be online on our auction platform auctions.ioneil.com. The auction will start to close at 8 pm Pacific Time on Saturday November 16, 2024. See insert or www.ioneil.com/auction\_info.pdf for details on how lots will close. Lots still open after 8 pm may re-sort by time remaining online – use "Sort By" to refresh. We also accept bids by email, phone, mail and fax (by fax: please follow up by phone or email to confirm that bids were received). All bids by email will be acknowledged. E-mail bids which have not been acknowledged have not been received. Phone bids must be confirmed in writing upon request. The estimates listed in the catalog are starting prices. Bids will be increased per the increment table on our auction platform. If you enter a maximum bid (your highest), the bidding will be incremented as needed to win the lot, up to your maximum bid. Bids must be for an entire lot. Auctioneer reserves the right to extend bidding.

Bids under estimate will not be accepted. Bids must be for an entire lot. Bids will be accepted by lot number only. Each lot constitutes a separate sale.

All customers wanting to place bids in the auction must register first. New customers unknown to us and wanting to participate in the online auction must register at the website at least 1 day before the auction.

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- (4) PRICE. **Payment in full is due upon receipt of invoice.** A 20% Buyer's Fee will be added to the successful bid price of each lot. # Highlights of the Auction



- 1. Athens 1896. Bronze Second Place Winner's Medal Housed in its Original Case. Bronze, 50mm, 60 grams, by Jules Clement Chaplain. "Bronze" on edge, struck by the Paris Mint. Laureated head facing of Zeus holding winged statue of Nike, Goddess of Victory, in his right hand, "OLYMPIA" written on the left. Rev. View of the Acropolis with the Parthenon on top, between Greek legend "International Olympic Games in Athens, 1896". Housed in its round leather case lined in velvet. First place winners received a silver medal, and second place winners a bronze medal. No gold medals were awarded in the first Olympic Games. A very rare, beautiful and historically important medal. Toned EF. (\$40,000)
- 2. St. Louis 1904. Athletics Gold Participation Medal Presented During the Athletic Olympic Week, August 29 to September 3. Octagonal, goldplated copper, 40mm, made by Dieges & Clust, New York. Nude athlete to the right holding laurel branch, sun rising in background. Rev. Legend in eleven lines: Universal Exposition/Commemorating The/Olympic Games/1904/Physical Culture/Department/ Frederick/ J.M. Skiff/Director of/Exhibits". American and French emblem on lower right on ivy branches. With ring and loop, abt. EF. Extremely rare, and first time we offer a gold medal. (\$18,000)
- 3. Athens 1906. Gold First Place Winner's Medal Housed in its Presentation Box. Goldplated silver, 50mm, by Jules Clement Chaplain. Laureated head of Zeus facing holding winged statue of Victory with laurel branch standing on globe, "OLYMPIA" written on the left. Rev. View of Acropolis with Parthenon between Olympic legend: "International Olympic Games in Athens, 1906" in Greek. Same design as the 1896 winners medal, only the date changed. While in 1896 only a silver and bronze medal were awarded for the first two places, in 1906 the Committee awarded gold, silver and bronze medals. Housed in red cardboard case, VF. Medal EF. (\$9,000)
- 3a. Athens 1906. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal. Silver, 50mm, by Jules Clement Chaplain, struck at the Paris Mint. Laureated head of Zeus facing holding winged statue of Victory with laurel branch standing on globe. Same design as the 1896 winners medal, only the date changed. While in 1896 only a silver and bronze medal were awarded for the first two places, in 1906 the Committee awarded gold, silver and bronze medals. Lightly toned EF. (\$6,500)



- 4. Athens 1906. Bronze Winner's Medal Housed in its Red Round Presentation Case. Bronze, 50mm, by Jules Clement Chaplain, struck at the Paris Mint. Laureated head of Zeus facing, holding winged statue of Victory with laurel branch standing on the globe. Rev. View of Acropolis and Parthenon between Olympic legend: "International Olympic Games in Athens, 1906" (translated). Case VF+. Medal toned Unc. (\$5,500)
- 5. **Stockholm 1912. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal.** Silver, 33mm, by Erik Lindberg and Bertram MacKennal, struck by Sporrong & Co. Herald proclaiming Olympic Games, bust of Ling, father of Swedish Gymnastics, on pedestal at r. Rev. Victorious athlete being crowned by two seated females. Lt. rubbing on high points, EF. (\$5,500)
- 6. Chamonix 1924 Winter. Third Place Bronze Winner's Medal and Participation Medal. Bronze, 55mm, by Raoul Benard. Victorious athlete holding skates and skis, Alps in background. Rev. French legend in 14 lines. An extremely rare winner's medal from the First Olympic Winter Games. The participation medal had the same design. Toned EF. (\$10,000)
- Paris 1924. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal. Silver, 55mm, by André Rivaud. Winner helping fallen athlete back on his feet. Rev. Legend surrounded by sports equipment for summer and winter Games plus a harp for the Arts Competition. Toned EF. (\$6,500)
- Los Angeles 1932. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal. Silver, 55mm, by Giuseppe Cassioli. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant team members. Toned EF. (\$6,500)



- 9. Stockholm 1956. 16th Olympic Equestrian Games Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal. Housed in its green leather case with logo on top. Bronze, 50mm, by John Sjösvärd/V. Falireus. Ancient Greek horseman left in high relief over "1956 Stockholm" in exergue. Rev. Flaming torch in Olympic rings, Olympic motto below. EF. Only a small number of medals were awarded. Plus IOC Bronze Winner's Pin. Numbered, 13x15mm, housed in its black
- Melbourne 1956. Silver Winner's Medal. Silver, 51mm, by Giuseppe Cassioli, struck by K.G. Luke Ltd. Melbourne. Victory seated above Colosseum Stadium holding laurel wreath and palm branch. Rev. Victorious athlete carried by jubilant teammates. EF. (\$6,500)


11. **Tokyo 1964. Athletics Silver Winner's Medal.** Silver, 63mm, designed by Toshikaka Koshiba after Giuseppe Cassioli (1928). Seated Victory holding palm branch and laurel wreath, Rome's Colosseum stadium at right, award text at top right. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant teammates. *The medal was struck by the Japanese Mint as a trial medal, 2mm thick, before deciding on the final strike.* Small rim bumps on reverse, o.w. toned EF. **(\$2,000)** 

12. Mexico City 1968. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded to the 4x100 meters Relay Team from Cuba. Silver plaque with Athletics pictogram at top suspended from blue-green ribbon. "The Cubans mailed their silver medals to activist Stokely Carmichael as a symbol of support for U.S. Blacks". Wallechins by and Loudy. The Mint used ribbons in various colors. Toned EF. (\$6,500)

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14. Sixth Olympics for the Disabled Held in Arnhem, Netherlands in 1980. Set of Gold, Silver and Bronze Winners Medals. Gilt, silvered and bronze, 55mm. Large "80" in center surrounded by legend. Rev. "Friendship-Unity-Sportsmanship" legend. EF. (3 pcs.) (\$3,500)



- 14a. VII World Wheelchair Paralympic Games, United Kingdom 1984. Set of Gold, Silver and Bronze Winners Medals, Gilt, silvered and bronze, 55mm. Logo of the Games encircled by "Friendship Unity Sportsmanship". Rev. Continents encircled by "VII World Wheelchair Games Paralympics UK 1984". The 1984 Paralympics were held in Nassau County, New York and in Stoke Mandeville, United Kingdom. With red-white-blue striped ribbon. Gilt color partially faint, silver and bronze EF. (3 pcs.) (\$3,500)
- Calgary 1988 Winter. Demonstration Events Gold Winner's Medal. Goldplated copper, 62mm. Calgary logo. Rev. Depiction of demonstration sports. Possibly a trial medal. EF. (\$2,000)

Albertville 1992 Winter. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal **Housed in its Case.** Silver and Lalique crystal, 92mm, 9mm thick. The crystal shows large Olympic rings over Alpine mountains, set in a silver border which is engraved with logo and olive branch, "Albertville 92" legend at bottom. No sport was engraved on the Albertville 1992 medals although an IOC direction asked for it. The medals were entirely handmade by Lalique in 35 different processes. With silver ribbon, Olympic color stripes in center. Housed in gray leatherette case lined in gray velvet, logo on top. Case light corner wear. Medal Unc. (\$18,000)

- grams, by Xavier Gorbero. Victory seated, on superimposed 56mm medal. Rev. Barcelona logo of jumping athlete over Olympic rings. No opening at top for a ribbon - trial strike of the Madrid Mint. Reverse shows problem with strike at the Mint, otherwise EF.
- Atlanta 1996. Paralympic Games Gold First Place Winner's Medal. Goldplated, 82mm (3.2"). Paralympic Atlanta 1996 logo and legend. Rev. Braille legend over Paralympic logo. Looped, with blue ribbon. In green cardboard presentation box lined with green velvet. EF. (\$2,600)
- 18. Sydney 2000. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Women's Lightweight Judo, 57kg. Silver, 68mm (2.7"). Female seated above Rome Stadium holding laurel wreath and palm branch. Rev. Cauldron and Sydney torch, Olympic rings above. With blue inscribed ribbon. EF. (\$9,000)

19. Sydney 2000. Bronze Winners Medal Awarded for Women's Handball to the Team from Norway. Bronze, 70mm, 166 grams, by Wojciech Pietranik and Brian Thompson, made by the Australian Mint. Seated Victory holding laurel wreath and palm branch, Colosseum Stadium at right, inscribed "XXVII Olympiad Sydney 2000". Rev. Olympic rings above Sydney Opera House, flaming torch at right. Engraved on edge at top and bottom "Handball, Women". With blue ribbon embroidered in silver "Sydney 2000". The women's handball competition took place at The Dome: Denmark won gold, and Hungary silver, Norwegian Kjiersti Grini scored 61 goals on 96 shots! EF. (\$8,000)

21. Athens 2004. Silver Second Place Paralympic Winner's Medal. Silver, 60mm. View of Acropolis in Athens. Rev. Paralympic logo above Braille legend. With multicolor ribbon. Many Paralympic winner's medals in 2004 were not inscribed with the winner. EF. (\$3,000)

22. Beijing 2008. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Baseball to the Team from Cuba. Silver, 70mm, with circle of inlaid green jade on reverse, by the Medal Design Group of the China Central Academy of Fine Arts, Elena Votsi. Winged figure of Victory holding palm branch and cloak, above Athens Panathinaikos Olympic Stadium, Acropolis in background, "XXIX Olympiad Beijing 2008". Rev. Beijing 2008 logo in center surrounded by ring of jade, "Baseball" on outer circle. The team from Cuba won second place with Korea winning first. Baseball was voted out of the 2012 Olympic Games in 2005, the first sport since 1936 when Polo was voted out. Polo returned with the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games. With red and orange ribbon. Housed in its original red lacquered case with gold "Beijing 2008" logo on top, and then in another outer case. Cases and medal EF. (\$9,000)

22a. Beijing 2008. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Men's Football to the Team from Nigeria. Silver, 70mm, with circle of inlaid green jade on reverse, by the Medal Design Group of the China Central Academy of Fine Arts, Elena Votsi. Winged goddess of Victory above Panathenian Stadium in Athens. Rev. Logo in center surrounded by jade, event engraved on edge. The Nigerian team won second place in soccer in Beijing. Ornate loop, with red and orange ribbon with "Beijing 2008" and Olympic rings. Housed in red lacquer box and large silk case. EF. (\$9,000)

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23. Vancouver 2010 Winter. Bronze Winner's Medal. Bronze,100mm, designed by Omer Abel and Corinne Hunt, and made at the Royal Canadian Mint. Undulating shape of the medal: Aboriginal design inspired by pods of orcas, and slightly raised Olympic rings on the obverse. The reverse has the inscription "XXI Olympic Winter Games" in English and French, and the emblem of the Games. The unusual shape of the medal had to be struck 9 times, and it required 30 steps to the finish. Each medal is unique as it was taken from a large artwork by Corrine Hunt of Indian heritage. (Komoyue and Tlingit). Suspended from a blue ribbon inscribed with "Vancouver 2010", the motto "With Glowing Hearts – Des Plus Brillants Exploits", and the Inukshuk logo with Olympic rings. A most stunning and unusual medal. EF. (\$20,000)

24. London 2012. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Men's Artistic Gymnastics in Vault. Silver, 85mm, 429 grams (over 14 oz), by Elena Votsi and Kostas Kazakos (obverse) and David Watkins (rev.). Winged Nike, Panathinaikos Stadium in Athens behind. Rev. Large London 2012 logo above abstract linear background. Engraved along the bottom edge "Artistic Gymnastics, Men's Vault'. "London 2012" and Olympic rings on attached purple ribbon. Denis Ablyazin also won a Team bronze medal in London on Floor, besides his silver medal on vault. In 2016 Rio he again won silver in vault, and bronze in rings, besides silver in team. At the 2020/21 Tokyo Games he won team gold, again silver in vault. Housed in its black winner's case which is in Fine condition on the outside, as most cases are. Rarely seen Winner's Medal has very light wear on highpoints, abt. EF. Your chance to obtain a silver medal from this famous athlete. (\$20,000)

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25. Tokyo 2020/2021. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded to Ukrainian Cyclist Olena Starikova. Silver, 85mm (3.4"), 8mm thick, weight 550 grams, designed by Junichi Kawanishi. Winged Nike, Goddess of Victory, over the Panathinaiko Stadium in Athens, Acropolis in background on left. Rev. The Tokyo 2020 emblem set against a polished stone background, surrounded by curved linen. Event engraved on edge "Cycling, Women's Sprint". Olena Starikova represented Ukraine in track cycling at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics, competing in the women's sprint and keirin events held at the Izu Velodrome, August 6-8th, 2021. Demonstrating impressive speed and determination, Starikova advanced to the later rounds in both competitions, earning this silver medal for her second-place finish in the women's sprint finals. One of Europe's most decorated women cyclists Starikova placed on the podium in ten different events. With multicolored ribbon. Housed in its wooden presentation case with magnetic lid. EF. (\$30,000)

### SECOND NATIONAL GREEK OLYMPIC GAMES, 1870

- 26. Athens 1870. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal. Silver, 37mm, by Albert Desiré Barre. Head right of King George. Rev. Greek legend in open wreath (translated): "Olympia/ in Athens/1870/Class B'space", above "Consecrator of Games Evangelis Zappas". Since 1859 Greece tried to revive the ancient Olympic Games when the first national Greek Olympic Games were held in Athens. Abt. EF. (\$2,000)
- 27. (Book) Lalous, Victor and Monceaux, Paul. Restauration d'Olympie. L'Histoire-Les Monuments. Le Culte et Les Fetes. Restoration of Olympia. The History The Monuments, the Cults and the Festivities (translated from French). Paris, Maison Quantin, 1889. No. 74 of 500. Large folio, 34x47cm (13.4x18.5"), 228pp., many illustrations., plus 10 full, double or quadruple fold-out pages of copper engravings. Beautiful and highly important work on the restoration, history, buildings cults, and festivals of ancient Olympia. Pierre de Coubertin wrote numerous articles on Olympia which was being restored at the time. Green linen gilt, lt. stains, VF, foxing inside. (\$1,000)

- 29. Première Année No. 2, October 1894. Bulletin du Comité International Des Jeux Olympiques. First Year, Nr. 2, October 1894. Second Bulletin of the International Committee of the Olympic Games. 4 pages, 29.8x40.4cm (11.7"x15.9"), in French. List of Committee Members, goals of the Committee are Olympic Games in Athens 1896, Paris 1900 and the United States in 1904. Opening speech by Baron de Courcel, president of the 1894 Congress; visit of Coubertin in Athens; Michel Bréal offering the "Marathon Cup" for a renewed marathon run in 1896. Two light folds, VF-EF. (\$2,600)


### ATHENS, 1st OLYMPIC GAMES, 1896

445. **Official Torch.** Cherry blossom pink colored aluminum, 71cm (28") long, designed by Tokujin Yoshioka Inc. The design on the top is in the form of a 5-petal cherry blossom that each holds a flame that comes together as one flame in the center. It has been made from a single sheet of aluminum, 30% of it made from recycled aluminum from temporary prefabricated housing construction after the 2011 earthquake, as a symbol of peace. The torch relay had originally been planned to last over 121 days but worldwide Covid-19 ended these plans. A beautiful torch, rarely seen, whose color might change over time from cherry blossom pink to gold. Housed in its pink container. EF. (\$8,500)

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446. Tokyo 2020/21. Participant's Pin Presented by the IOC. Goldplated, 14x19mm. Housed in its original box. Unc. (\$100)

#### **BEIJING, 24th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 2022**

- 447. **Beijing 2022 Winter. Official Torch.** Red and silver colored, (fire and ice), 82cm (32.3"), designed by a Lenovo Team. The torch is named "Flying", and the spiral design makes it look like a ribbon fluttering in the wind. The red and silver colors stand for fire and ice, and the red line represents the Great Wall and the skiing courses. The torch is fueled by emission-free hydrogen. Because of the Corona virus the relay was held only for 3 days with about 1,200 torch runners, in and around Beijing and in Zhangjiakou, Hebei Province. A beautiful torch. Unused, housed in its original container, Unc. (\$8,500)
- 448. **Beijing 2022 Winter. Official Paralympic Torch.** Silver and gold colored, 82cm (32.3"), designed by a Lenovo team. The torch is named "Flying" too, symbolizing "glory and dreams". *Due to the Corona virus, only about 600 Paralympic torches were made for the 600 Paralympic torch runners in Beijing.* EF. **(\$8,500)**
- 449. Longair Airplane for the 19th Asian Games in Hangzhou 2022. Multicolor, 37x36cm (14.6"x14.2"). Airplane is displayed on it's stand, housed in a large illustrated box, yellow fabric inside. EF. (\$80)

# PARIS, 33RD OLYMPIC GAMES, 2024

- 450. Paris 2024. The Official Torch. It is made of steel, 70cm (27.6") tall, and weighs around 1.5kg (1,500 grams/3.3 pounds), one of 2,000 torches manufactured by Arcelor Mittal in France. The torch was designed by Mathieu Lehanneur who drew inspiration from the 3 themes of the Paris Games: Equality, Water and Peacefulness. The torch relay started in Olympia on April 16, and ended on July 26, after the opening ceremony of the Paris Games on the Seine, with the lighting of the cauldron, a balloon, in the Tuileries. - 453. **Paris 2024. Tajikistan Olympic Team Medal.** Silvered, 55mm. Tajikistan logo surrounded by "The 2024 Olympic Team of Tajikistan". Paris 2024 logo with laurel branches surrounded by "The Games of XXXIII Olympiad in Paris, France, 26 July 11 August 2024". Unc, in red and gold case. **(\$260)**



- 455. Paris 2024. Official Olympic Mascot. "The Paralympic Phryge". Red, blue and white plush, 25cm (9.8"). He has one prosthetic leg, and presents revolution through the power of sport. They are also a reminder of the 1789 French Revolution. With small brochure. EF. (\$80)




